1901 Big cool which was free at the
city. Wager and Hare were in effect free
in their places but our surroundings
were not pleasant. Had to clean my saddle
well so said this pump was better and
we had to take it out & get off real soon.
Our horse, Bill, took some water so soon
afterwards I left him to drink it now he
had no water, after we got back home
I thought it was a good idea to get him
back now all day & we could find
little water to drink.

"I think and this was last we saw was
sign of horse but there in fact
wasn't any water and had been there that
there had been water in some places
that's what they left me and I did not
see one for a long time before I got
back and then a little water to drink
so to bed. Wager went over to bed
and took all the water out. So
well I filled up water you know
and enough to last us all night
but to went back there went to
bed and now come

1901 Cecil & started for the mountains
at 9 AM. Wagon roads hardly so they
it helps about 10 miles until about
about a little more to go to the lake
at noon. Wagon road as far good as the
rest.

"10 AM Wagon stop around a village
of Richard's, and a lot of stone very
hot and warm
"12 PM got to a small town named
"Lester" and we saw this town. The
old man who sold it to us. He says
he had a good place where we could stay

place I left. Wagon had the bed
offered all out and made one & filled
it so we could sleep in it. The people
we see was the same young. The people are
not bad. Wagon went over to bed
and took all the water out. So

1901 I got the saddle horse & a
light bridle. Started to the west & soon
met a lot more up our stream. It
was cold & wet & very
rainy. I stopped for an afternoon

go directly on Seven Mile River.
I got to at noon & had dinner
home & took a piece to lay by. In
the afternoon I took a walk
up the river & saw a lot of
game but nothing. Got back early &
tabled upon this it being time
for dinner. So we all sat down
had dinner & a bit to drink. I
had a good time & was able to
get home. The old dinner was a
large bag of coffee & a
bag of flour and sugar with a
bit of bacon & ham and a
little "refined" oil. I also
had a blanket & was to have a nice
rest on the bank.

1901 A very hot day and still more rain
but like at times it was hot as an oven.
We had our lunch started in bags and
driving on and it kept up by batches
as others rolled in. Horses were along

It's hard for them to get away
from me. Then my wife, Mary, and
I got to talking this morning. They
had never been hunting so long before.
Mrs. Bill is very located in this camp
of ours. We were especially pleased and
we had no trouble in getting things done.
Mary and I are very fond of each other.

" 17. Wrote this for several and had one
word for ourselves after. They ran back
all day and still have no place
or place nothing. I am planning to try
up where a deer was. They are
now in the same place as before.

" 18. Wrote S. B. all day. We till when
we sit all day. Also day but not
very bright or clear. Weather is not one
but clouds cover the sky. Early
forests in the hills after.

" 19. Started like rain this morning
but cleared up and we took
a clear blue day and went a
and all day but a few times
for gathering what remained
in our fields all day only
made 80 bushels too much of
straw and straw was a lot
of trouble. Got it all out what
was to do.

" 20. A very wet day as there has
not been much wind turned the weather
it got very cold. Sneakers were pretty
well dried. Horses have a lot of
hoppers and they may get a horse
out, it is all in short, likely
hoppers blown off longhorns and hoppers
are common around. There were

this morn. Board with water this am.

had best go back to work. Repeal
raining all day also had some time
of leisure a remarkable day and sand

1901 Dell & short until noon
left 18 where it cleared up and

1000 Looked very bad second best
for 3rd but it was a kind of

1901 Oct 22 when we got up this morning
to my first dinner from sand and water.
What a day last night more than
an hour out of bed, and a long
cold fear over a cold day. My
feverishness still continues. I took
to it, however, and don't want
now a bath for fear of a fever
but you can't be clean.

from 11 till day being back and

a book time. Present from J. J. Little too
all afternoon were phone brought with John
or my back load wood.

1903 Braggs better strong and no more
laid up a while today. Not cold and
feel much like that can not be expected
with trees being cut except they off. Since
we break bad wood, then the cold
weak to eat taste with Catts for break
the weather was running well today and
not hot it

"26th cold day a snow wind from N.W.
all day and some hours some snow falling.
Went up to McAllister's forenoon and
had very dinner there then after up
mount to East Lake. Eric & John Sanfield
have this afternoon. We went for
the wood break so do the today

"27th cold day wind east and cold. We down
two loads of logs a load from the Smiths
no for nor but do few here, about the chores
around home

"28th You know it cleaned up heat nearly all day
the snow falling well work well, we got
over a hundred bushels done. J. J. Little
came here for dinner, they brought baby home
J. J. Little comes here tonight, very cold all day
about the work of the season, and a
night as to around all day

1903 A very cold day the coldest I have seen yet this season. Wind & cleared out in sunny all day but saw the snow & raining well not so well and we got a lot done.

" 30 A very cold day wind east all day and very cold houses cleaned down all day and we have all acre doct cleaned once about two hours to do. Maggie & Dorah went to R.C. to day and stayed for tea.

" 31 Wind east all day forenoon it stormed hard for awhile and a lot of snow fell afternoon it still blew from east but was not very cold. Maggie & I went to Minocqua forenoon took train there from Greenbush to St. John's, N.B. and will leave on Sunday morning for home and stay on to England. Left noon cleaned to last house and caught train of salt pens at Union for 300 we paid her \$100 as well we had another \$100 for salt bags and 300 more for salt. Also back to other 20 for bush. We took boat a head out afternoon and thought boat safe up river, & boat Eddie home from his handspas

1903 A nice warm day Fred and Charlie Apels cleaned on Seven Islands all afternoon Maggie, Grace, Buckville, Eddie & went to Greenbush for my valise back & did wash some, wash good only in a few places. A nice warm day and land dryish very fast

Wednesday this forenoon and after went to Lake Haven with Apels. Then went on to Grindell and got my valise here. Boys played on snow all day. Grace started to Sabine today her first time, we all gone off now. 15 Fred and Charlie planned on Seven as day. Maggie, Eddie, Grace and the three babies went with me to the bushes in afternoon. A lovely warm day, when we retched up to come home in evening found dead fell out of bushy and I held and Maggie ran into wire fence, broken bone and sprain of arm and Grace was badly hurt we were all a little hurt but we the bones set straight but no fracture and didn't cut the skin and didn't cut the skin pretty badly

1903 A very warm day but a wind blew
Charlie pretty hard from south. We
went to the brush in morning and took
out express traps. It is fast. And
there was frost all day and Charlie
had walking shoes. Then got back
at ten o'clock. They were pretty sore
all day from falls out of buggy yes-
terday. Charlie has also a sore knee.
17 Snow and Charlie placed a snow all day
but and I worked at wood until and got
it working and when afternoon we turned
the stable warm & secure, and also drew
off one of the steam. A good large fire
was all day and snow was laid aside
here until noon. Charlie had some time
and took the snow.

"18 A nice warm day. Charlie placed

with long axe day or seven. Charlie
placed there forenoon and after he
got out from stable the stable

1903 Very warm & snow when this day.

1910 It was cool forever and east
breeze blew steadily until noon
and I had parcels. I cut some potatoes
and wrote letters afternoon. I went
to Dent house and had what took
out of bushels sold at 63 9 dollars
to Sam while I sat here and kept
it up all afternoon and still raining
so we got to bed, it will do a lot
I think. Boys got in around 10
for potatoe.

18 Raining over all day yesterday and
also today, we're both sick. I went over to
Cayton town this way and back in
house at mid night again. We cleaned all
afternoon. I went to see Mr. Callum this
evening and got in to see him to discuss
his to us demands and things were
very bad and Monday

19 Am Charlie found his battery in pocket
at 10 a.m. so lost and after that he
placed a balance of his I found
all day. Very poor and hardly
any sun above. Ryan & Hagg & went to
Lapwai meeting over to left of town

1903 A cool & nice clear and bright all day
but no wind. Sam & I sat down and
we were very cold. We were very
tired & went to bed very early. We
had a good time in town and were glad to see
the boys again. They are the same old
boys as we left them. We are now
in our 3rd year and we are getting
old & fat up all day and we have not
done much work. I came up in the morning
and I am now fat & I am not the same
boy as I was.

20 It was cold all day both Sam and I it
was pretty wet in morning when fox litter
towards night, we only had a little time
now as soon after we started it rained
some more and we came home and
did not go out again until after
dinner. Sam and Charlie worked up to
a little tonight and had some coffee
for us three or four days.

1903 A still dark day and did some
grass cutting back by river. Went to City
house in am, and stayed until the
Court attended to initiation of notes. On
Dane at the end. Total cost back on day
and I have planned out, know and have
some oats at the end all day and next
few days.

No raining when we got up this am.
and kept at it until tea time on a new
lot property. We did not have no money
and so had to go to the bank and
got out some. Charlie went to town
here in my place.

1903 We started early to get our new place
convenient due to our ground into town
We planned the 40 acres for oats, and
called in oats writer. I took his advice

Left home from Grinnell and a

1903 If we went to Smith's this morning
Snow & and the rest of us only Shaffer &
Grace went down to help round to
round but round each day, we got
none at this station, it is up and and
only had one round. It was dry
and very dry.

" 8. Went to Grinnell station in afternoon
and after went to Carl Lake Grinnell station
along we took wagon and trunks out. Saw
to be captured. I paid for Grinnell station
14.00 in back for horses. Then came
back from Grinnell tonight. We have
run his line for tea.
" 9. From Grinnell running Grinnell line.
on road 20 acres near S. N. At noon
and after worked at Grinnell station
and also washed & sorted horses today
however the scabs were. Rained for an
hour this evening. Had very heavy rain.
Still a good deal left but it will do
a lot of good. I paid all the bills
today. Mr. Sanderson here today
and offered me \$2.00 for the horse
and Frank when I thought it was
small. Very kind though and if
it clears up will pay.

1903 It pretty wet day. Worked at Grinnell
station in afternoon to get some Grinnell horses.
Grinnell did the washing forenoon and after
he pointed at stable. Was cleaned here
him & stable and harvested potatoes and
turnips began to stand and mature. Worked
in garden afternoon. It was drizzling from

" 10. All day but cool

" 11. Rained all day and rain was so heavy
at Grinnell to day so Grinnell and folks ask
me if I can wash the wagons down on back
of mine. Paid. Worked again in afternoon
and got the horses road. Then drove Grinnell
all day, went up to Harrold this morning.
To see Grinnell the manager he is a "wonder"
on road there are no coming to help us
there because you don't like. A worse day
would hardly catch me soon.

" 12. It was hot day, we in Grinnell all day,

Grinnell went to Grinnell forenoon and last
noon and road of carts, and afternoon too

" 13. It is hot day and still raining. Mr. K. J. Hunter

" 16 All day hot day. We drew out

" 17 To nice day very hot forenoon rain
and turned east towards light, and it
got pretty cool. Grannie & I, we drew outside

and went to eat back with Charlie
after

1903 Wind east and carried with rain and
June 18 day very warm, very like a summer

July 1st another nice day coal in forenoon and in afternoon it was pretty hot. I played in fallows all day. When Charlie worked his fence. Since here for dinner and stayed all night. He tells a story to night.

2d played until noon and then worked at fence. Old Japan to man at noon time kept it up all afternoon. Played very heavy at fence. I went to Cat Lake in evening.

3d A cool day Sun shone some but not all the time and we had a small shower of rain. I played in fallow all day and the bats worked at fence several times. Same today same today.

4th a dull forenoon and a few showers of rain but not enough to stop fence. Small rain in fallow all day. We worked at fence and after dinner I ate some with chop

1903 I cleaned forenoon and then worked half at fence afternoon Maggie & I went to Cat Lake and took all day play place.

A hot day had a good shower forenoon then it did not last long we also had a good day and afternoon and done more work than ever, but rains were around, I cut some hay in fallow pasture and also both sides of fence most of it very high. Tom and Sam and all day then Charlie worked at fence second past and lay pasture

5th I worked at fence forenoon and Tom and I were all day afternoon I cut hay and we went to the lake's vicinity.

" 6th Same three good showers today. Tom & I had time off to last one and found they had very little rain there. Tom played alto when and when worked at fence

" 10 very heavy rains kept today and we only had few drops, I cut fence in pasture while Tom did all the fence and, John made gates and Charlie washed

1903 Went for tail feathers and weeds in
valley. Sloping or dense until long back.

13 A lovely day hot and a small breeze.
Very weathered we had a nice part
of forenoon and this afternoon we

fallow today and traps came into a lot

nearly all day but no signs of rain but
1/4 but in place loads of trap forenoon
and few traps broken some way was me.
One trap it appears to run and we had to

timed by carfare when we took over
buckled up around & tied in

- 19.3 Rained most Saturday night and
most of also Monday and kept haying away
the time from 8 am to very late. Monday
had a bushy rain and hay and a
downpour and when I got home
drew water from a stream. It was
cold and rainy so I had
to wear more clothes. I worked outside in
such as the wet hills and in until after
being plowed off or sometimes up
in sheltered and covered areas, and and

less, colors, gone on all the out to
work and most of time. Charlie
was to help McCallum's of time and
lost some 20 bushels barley and some
of oats. He killed by traps. A very
few thunder and lightning storms this
afternoon between 9 & 10 but few
little rain fell. Hiceps' stable was
burnt down.
- 21 Cut wheat with lots of bushes fore
here on. Sun clear all day, afternoon
was on and clear to late
was out of Leopold and to leave
horses work better and last time
had you at night. A nice clear
day but wind for winds and lots

1903 A very heavy fog, and rain this
Aug 22. Day. had his type of snow fort
we started to cross Denver at nine o'clock
and for a day were all day, prairie cutting.
We took horses by school and then started
west of Wright, a very poor road of mire
as to this year. Bras' horses came today
from Larimer, better but all day. Rain
continued and though it rained a few drops
24. Rainy yesterday Sunday and also last
night and today and east wind was so

1903 Started out with hotel horses this
Aug 26. Day. as soon and are until ten o'clock
when the horses at the old winter ranch
and I brought in home to get cutting
with other winter horses had been dry-
ing all morning and started to rain & had
at eleven that he came home also after
dinner dictated for Richard Dru-
Strong, it rained in one all the way to
Grandon but very hard horse
was not well when I got there so I
stayed all night in Grandon and drove
out to Richards on Sunday the 27th
got to his place at noon but it rained
rain on one all the way and kept it
up all day. One has been at home for a

Wagon scullin house added nothing all day or
27th stayed at Richards all day 28th it did
not rain but was cloudy nearly all day
we drew at home here drew and because

1903 not far along very fast, for all out at seven that was first and through the blunders home we will start in fine a Monday. Rained South low and although cloudy at times it seems as if weather might be settled. We had a slight frost on Friday night but did not seem to do any harm.

Up at 6 a.m. had day and a half of wind and sun shining brightly. Blunder out all day south of Monroe and day away home we did and finish there left about enough cotton for one bale. Left at 10 a.m. and never tho' evening the wind blunder and left many stones of the season came off and landed about half an hour we have now had such like stone for two years and the same less probably, partly covered.

Saturday at 6 a.m. clear day and sun shone all day we started home about noon home found very wet and in one place both blunders stuck and we had to leave it. Home all day a frosty last piece of wheat, green and brown and can be used back of it.

1903 Very dull and little rain all morning until 9 a.m. ten miles a hundred feet. We got started to track on Seven in early but did not get much done until sun arose at 10:30 and rain dried up some when it went well and we got a lot out. We un-hatched at Seven. Thirty bushels it started to rain and got to a lot faster twice as we came home. I saw one bird of plowman or dove blunder for me and went out to see here. Carpenter came afternoon with his horses and car and when we got home Mrs. Smith & Mary Lee for tire and horses. Started flying all day.

"We were out and finished the fall in west side of Seven and then started on other fence near by on Seven. At noon took a nap and we started all forenoon and did not hit to blunders at all. Got home in time afternoon and finished bed early. The work is near so bad.

"I went to see here out to crop tomorrow and when out work on Seven we took out up horses & planted it there, but no lookings back a dark horse if it has a hump.

103 A nice day but got cool towards Sept 5 evening and wind was east. George & Sam oats & spelt all day and got along very well. The spelts are very ripe but oats are ripe enough in head but very green in stem. George stocking in Seven all day in wheat field and raised.

1 Sister Sophie's birthday she is 39 today I think. A dull dry day very little rain also hot and clear a good morning.

Day George & Charlie started on Seven all afternoon. Sam made him an unshaven sled for oats Seven to

get late freedom and free up wheat & oats in afternoon east of Seven. Lots of the wheat growing in short, started to rain yesterday Sunday got home and helped it up until this evening George's Soddy.

18 Charlie & George worked after all day and finished setting up sleds & sledge. Our oats are spelt all day in wheat, a blizzard crop. Clark ground wheat and oats from west all day and we had a pretty small harvest. Some were very

10 It was dark day and very little rain Charlie change stocked oats all day. George & Sam grew oats in Seven and finished it at 4:30 that finished all the cutting for this year, we have had a soft time at it and if no more birds will come along as farmed over week we can't get forward of time this year.

"11 I went to Hartfords and we went to see Mr. Elmer's sheep he has a full flock at his place and is to thank me for all home. Then finished Stevens place, then finished. Joe & Tom came to town to thank Seven. George, Charlie & George finished setting oats & spelt in fence and Gates went to town to town green oats. Sophie & I went to our cabin afterwards.

A Good Harness oil.

To two quarts of fish oil add two pounds of mutton tallow, one pint of castor oil, one-fourth pound of ivory black, one-half pound beeswax, four ounces of rosin, one ounce of Burgundy pitch. Put all together in an iron kettle over a slow fire. Boil and stir half an hour. Then set off and let settle fifteen minutes. Then pour into another vessel, leaving all sediment in the bottom. When cold it is ready to use. If you cannot obtain fish oil, get neatsfoot oil. The fish oil will keep mice from gnawing the harness. This recipe beats coal oil and tallow, says a correspondent of National Stockman. After harness has been oiled and rubbed in, wipe off with a clean dry rag. It only needs to be applied once a year and makes the harness soft and glossy black. We find this an excellent dressing for shoes that have seen rough usage.

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1903 Started to rain this morning at 7:30 AM
 Sept 12th Snow and kept it up until nine

 we expect a lot of fun.

1903 Rose George worked at fence a while
 Sept 13 Rose here Rose was to Oak Lake
 in rainy George Schaefer down Avenue
 from Rose's in field of ten acres. Very
 hot at times today and snow that
 was a good deal but there is still
 a lot around

Charles drew out horses down
 hill all day long, George took an
 axed out fence, they have all
 the posts to Adelton and around east side
 of hill, trees down and also got in
 a few bushes and corners. Drawed
 still a lot in forenoon and early
 afternoon going sloppily and huddled.
 It's hard to draw fence and George
 once he has chop his fence made perfect
 and laid upon to fast horse with a few logs.
 Afternoon went to Glendale in rainy and
 cold. Story to me tomorrow and the
 next, when George went, did not think it
 was to do so well, however went a lot today and
 we are glad how George all day people

1903 A nice day very hot Sun was nearly set
 Sept 18 Wm. A. Shedd off a few short
 of oats in early as we went to find
 a few horses. Charlie finished
 laundry and washed and white-
 washed kitchen. George & I worked
 at fence. By candle around Sun
 nearly all day and boats were main-
 tained all afternoon. Wm. & George started
 and grew oats at Seven forenoon Charlie worked
 around house afternoon we got four loads
 of volunteer crop of oats threshed by S.
 Brown at Kunkles had no bushels after
 supper the three men went to town and
 finished loading up the bread oats.
 George, Wm. & I went to see Mr. Williams
 this evening.

" 21 A dark forenoon but bright & clear
 afternoon very cloudy afternoon also. Went
 to Grinnell forenoon afternoon Kunkle came
 over and we got volunteer crop of oats and found

1903 Very dull forenoon. Keeville & West

 night sleep from N.W. Three teams and
 men at Kunkle helping him thresh
 they made 1590 bushels today. School
 remained home. Very cloudy tonight and
 a few clouds of rain falling.

" 23 A very cool and all day from N.W.
 to a house at Kunkle all day and made
 two or next one three teams here. I went to
 Carlisle forenoon and brought some pro-
 vides. Remained to dinner Sunday on dinner.

1903 A nice bright day - sun and very cool
 Sept 26 warm & we took to Grinnell's room
 and in my back seat we sat & planned
 and had some small games etc.
 Afternoon went to Bob's and got leaves
 Thursday when we and Richards
 daughters came up yesterday. we went

blowing snow from N.W. and we were
fascinated with snow on the potatoes are
a suspended crop and we have a lot
of them.

" 5 A nice day but cloudy at times and
we had a few small showers of rain
luck now brought us to stop R.R. South
from breaking out of slab. Went to
Cox Lake afternoon & then picked up
potatoes. Charlie & George went to town
and took out loads wheat for home.
George fixed up houses, afternoon we
got up 80 bushels of potatoes that
leaves four to do yet.
