1903 A lovely clear hot forenoon
Oct 6th sometimes so hot as fairly
afternoon it got cloudy and earlier
Carpenter did not think any today
we got out all the potatoes forenoon
also gave fence and got a couple of
new gates made. afternoon I took
out horse wheel for Reuben and the
three boys stacked some grass out for
Severn, lots of whitening brought and
bought live grain, we got a small
shower this afternoon

7th Bunch rain last night and then very
hard every thing came out water again
this morning. Dull & dark all day and
did not dry any only what it would do.

Open track his brother out to Port Vale
and he went home today. I went to
Port Vale afternoon in day 14. Settled
with George tonight and no beer
in any. Boys setting up stores afternoon

8th A dull forenoon but a beautiful
clear afternoon Sun when hot
and it is dried up tone. I took

George out to Port Vale he is leaving
today. Boys set up steam works
forenoon, afternoon Ben went to help
in Washburn track. Charles's bar up steam

1903 A dull day but yesterday B^r & Oct 9 came home from Mrs McCallum at noon they were gone Thursday on 11 and finally home and did not need help, he showed our land in pasture afternoon. Charles cleared up around home. Maggie & I went to Mrs McCallum for a few hours in afternoon.

"10 A lovely hot day about a hot as July. We started out on the Colburns trip all forenoon and after Charles & I went to Mrs McCallum and three had out of wheat. Maggie, Kate & I went to Lake Kate. Robert drove a lot today and must be getting in better shape

"12 A lovely day Charles & B^r at McCallum's Thursday all day. I got started to plow with gang in fore evaluation crop was it free fine.

"13 I plowed with team then went to Mrs McCallum to help with oats, but they were not done with this when I saw some grain and plowed afternoon, they expect to finish all wheat about at McCallum's tonight. Got a few deer plowed today

1903 A nice forenoon but afternoon it Oct 14 got cloudy and rained a several showers but not enough to stop us Thursday. In the evening we were down at Mrs McCallum's helping to thresh the oat grain. I led her out and looking made about three thousand bushels of maple has only two stacks of wheat to thresh yet

"15 This is Thanksgiving day I went out to Lake Kate first thing in morn. all stores closed but I went up to Lake Kate. I also saw 6 7/80 to De local Separator Co. Mrs Charles went to Mrs McCallum for calumna in morn. then got in load sheaves and after that went to Caperton to thresh, led from Reuben is driving a team for us. Mrs McCallum got into our field a little after dark and only did a little there.

"16 Rained a small shower this morn and we did not get started before eight o'clock and only threshed the 20 acres of wheat near Caperton until after a heavy rain and we had to stop. Got some wheat out & I plowed afternoon

1903 A lovely day and a little
 Oct 17 Cool though all the stillle
 wheat and then moved on to
 near School and then back again
 all of that made 1333 1/2 in all
 but in that account is 119 of
 Speltz 2000
 "19 A very windy day could hardly
 think but we left at it but only
 made 1000 bushels of wheat finished
 at the piece near School and then
 moved to Brown finished all the
 good wheat when the School and
 then moved on to west side. Got
 eight loads out to Cart Yard
 "20 A little rain this morn. but not enough
 to stop up the hay, we finished follow-
 ing the amount and got some of Speltz
 plowing done on land a fine day.
 Oct 20 Fine land out to Cart Yard today
 "21 Spent the middle row today and
 finished what a snow than it got
 so windy we had to stop. Spent the whole
 day's place for Speltz, went to Cart Yard
 then to 627²⁰⁵ on wheat that was out
 and paid up some debts around
 here.

1903 Spent out in yard with grain
 Oct 22 and then moved out to field
 and finished out a stalks on
 Speltz made 2500 in all today
 got out our coburns for winter
 Speltz went home tonight
 "23 Finished Speltz at ten o'clock and
 the coburns crop of oats at 12 the
 machine went away to Stuyvesant and
 had dinner there. Grain turned out well
 wheat was 24 bushels per acre
 oats Speltz and Speltz 55. A lovely
 day. Spent with J. Miller and hope
 than with the turnips afternoon and
 had a load home. General took
 a load wheat to Cart Yard
 "24 A lovely day B. M. helped J. Miller
 all day at turnips. Charlie and chose
 around horse program report to the
 west to help B. E. Thack. Place is I
 went to Lincoln's farm and report
 I took load wheat to Cart Yard.
 General took out load today for B. M.
 Smith
 "26 Charlie's B. M. helped B. E. Thack with
 from after that no but had a pig's made
 a few pig traps. I then help B. M. take
 Johnson and went in hay to Lincoln's

- 1903 Charlie & Mrs took our two loads each
 Oct 27th forenoon and then went down to
 Mine McCallum and had his boots
 sewed there to take out tomorrow. I
 showed until noon this was the 2nd Oct.
 About a week later he did not come
 in but we gave Stear medicine and he
 is better tonight. I went to Carey's
 tonight to help get some out of
 sleep but we could not find
 him. A lovely day
- " 28 A nice day so far so far, both towns
 went to help Melley through his rats but
 one of them came back and put out
 his loads to Earl Lake, Charlie came home
 from Melley at noon and he took
 out load afternoon. I took out load
 forenoon and played afternoon.
 Melley began to thank at Dr. William
 at noon
- " 29 Mrs Charlie went from loads
 from seven o'clock then went to
 Carpenter for two loads to take out
 tomorrow. I showed all day. A nice
 clear day.
- " 30 A lovely day again. I showed all day
 Dr. Charles took our two loads for
 Carpenter's two for machine

- 1903 A cool day but pleasant I showed until
 Oct 31st noon then McCallum & I took our two loads
 to Earl Lake & Mrs got pig pen fixed up
 and 26 pigs closed in to fattening they had
 taken out two loads in time for Carpenter
 forenoon
- Jan 2 A lovely day. Charlie & Mrs took out
 two loads about forenoon and Charlie took
 one after forenoon up to Earl Lake
 set in lower and also helped Dr. Story
 put up wind mill, he came at two
 this afternoon and is not here yet
 say it tonight but is to be laid
 tomorrow. Stally all away to Social
 in Ryerson Church tonight and left
 me to make babies.
- " 3 I showed Charlie took out two loads
 forenoon, Dr. Charles took out two
 afternoon. Dr. Story came at evening
 with his brother & they saw out at
 mine well finished it at night. I
 had to go to Earl Lake forenoon and
 then to Brunsford afternoon.
 Showed a little article forenoon
 a lovely warm day

1903 Dr & Charlie down down Stearns
 kept from seven all day. Got some
 few loads and Dr & Charlie also got
 a load. Went to Muncie fore-
 noon and then after 4 o'clock.
 Did not do all day and call will
 freeze very hard tonight.
 "5" ~~Smiles~~ ~~at~~ ~~the~~ ~~time~~ ~~with~~ ~~last~~ ~~of~~ ~~the~~
 Charlie & Ben down into from seven all
 day and got down all home only one load
 very cold all day. I plowed all day
 and finished when voluteas cold
 snow, that makes us 35 some of fall
 plowing for crop next year.
 "6" Charlie took load Stearns out to
 Methodist minister the morning and
 Dr & Ben went down and hung in home
 the last load of Stearns. Did the
 a furnace for two till four
 and we got a lot of work. Dr &
 went to Dr. and brought home
 1075 pounds of sheep, of Stearns Dr &
 all piled up by Dr & Ben all the
 day. Dr & Ben, we also cleaned
 what was in shed and brought
 set on two loads of wheat. Charlie & Ben
 went to home Dr & Ben's forenoon after
 when then to Washington for an call

1903 A lovely day not cold and no
 sun. I first this day. Dr & Charlie
 took out three loads this day. Had
 to wait a good while at Rice on
 edge of snow there and did not get
 home until one o'clock. Still had
 loads when afternoon and put them
 in shed at home for Sunday day.
 Got in two Dr & Ben's into cellar
 in afternoon. Dr & Ben & I
 went to Oak Lake in afternoon.
 "9" A very ugly day. Went away and
 Ben & Charlie all day also snow
 a little but a little near eight
 only a very little fall. Ben & Charlie
 went to home Dr & Ben's this day.
 for even Dr & Ben went to Oak Lake
 with what Dr & Ben's nearly
 the whole load. Afternoon Charlie
 & Ben down in two loads. Protection
 there is still nearly two loads
 outside, we have more in other
 row than we ever had. A nice
 clear day but sun went down
 had and it looks like snow. Had
 a Cecil went to Dr. Smith's today.
 Dr & Ben went to the factory but
 Smith has for dinner in house. Dr & Ben

1903 A cold day snowing when we got up
Nov-10 and kept it in until about ten o'clock
a couple of inches of soft snow fell
but it is nearly all away tonight.
Behaved around all day, Dr. Schakle
took out two loads when forenoon
and after they hauled at some with
a few so-called samples.

"11 A cold day saw the high all day
but found the strong from night all
day and was very cold. Charlie & Wm
took out two loads forenoon and
then took a horse after. I saw two
hairs nearly all day. Went to get horse
in afternoon with buggy. We got on
two loads in heat for tomorrow. Steady
very hard tonight.

"11 A very cold day but pleasant, Dr.
Schakle took two loads when to
get horse forenoon and heat in
heat of potatoes in afternoon, more too
soon as there is to freezing hard to-
night. We have about 300 barrels
of potatoes in all a great crop.
W. A cold windy day Dr. Schakle
took out two loads when forenoon
and hauled at horse after. I saw
cucumber while at home and went to

1903 A very cold day and fearful windy
Nov-13 when cucumber all day, Dr. Schakle
took out two loads forenoon, and in
afternoon we fixed up old stable some
changed all many pigs into it and got
a little into leads to have two loads in
for morning. Great & breeze not very
well today nor tonight.

"14 Dr. Schakle went out with what
forenoon, afternoon they finished last
big haul and got all the afternoon
on. Lead & I went to Cart Yard afternoon
and then I went to Mrs. McCallum's and
paid her for into Saturday. A cold day
and weather is let in rain in evening.
Hard day, the snow tonight.

"19 Schakle took out 60 barrels of a horse
yesterday Sunday and then did show & after
noon call also today, I took horse up to
John Douglas's yesterday, we left here at ten
and came at the Smith's and then reached
Juno at 4:30 A cold blustering day wind
NW and blowing a little today. I left
here for home at 9:30 today and reached
here at 12 a very quiet drive. Blue pretty
hard all the way and drifted some but
it was in very short. Afternoon we
cleaned some notes for Dr. Schakle's potatoes

1903 A pleasant day some wind from west
 Jan 18 and wind died now a little. Started
 for Car Lake with Lee where but got
 stuck on hills saw tracks as James
 had no shoes, became home and sent
 Charlie in sleigh to Car Lake he got
 shoes shot then came back and took
 out load got home at 6:30 tonight.
 A few frost all day but saw snow
 clear and bright and it was pleasant

" 19 A nice spring day a very slight breeze
 from S. to the city. The height is 9:5 AM.
 Saw some very little all day. Charles
 took out 101 load at least for some
 that finished all the wheat in above
 spots. In afternoon we cleaned out little
 pip, and then took family built up to
 my pleasure shed and cleaned some out
 there, brought out some of Mrs. Williams
 for a while this evening.

" 19 Charlie & I cleared around forenoon
 and after tea Grace & I went to Municipal
 Charlie got in some wood with
 Hitchen, a nice day.

" 20 Charles forenoon, Charlie took
 out 61 double he led to Car Lake
 that took all in east forenoon. Rain
 began & cleared down in afternoon. The

1903 A nice day and out cold. Charlie
 Jan 19 & I drove up chairs in hay. Then
 cleaned some out in my pleasure shed
 afternoon & took out 12 double for
 by two to Car of Car Lake and that
 home a barrel of sugar and some
 short for pigs. Some Charles cleaned
 out 101 and cleaned out afternoon.
 Mrs. Price Smith to see for dinner.
 I took out chairs & straw and got
 them feet done.

" 23 A clear cold day, but no wind
 Charles & I cleaned out forenoon and
 after tea went to Car Lake and got
 wheat machine feet done and the horse
 cleaned in forenoon. Mrs. Co for
 \$1600 on horse & forenoon. A cold party
 with.

" 24 A cold wet wind all day, we cleaned out
 forenoon and cleared around afternoon. John
 and Mrs. Little here for tea.

" 25 Cleaned out forenoon and then cleaned
 out all the pigs afternoon and had tea
 there. No wind all day and it was very
 warm and pleasant. In forenoon the
 and winter to buy my pigs at 14¢
 the price is all gone to nothing, and I
 want make anything out of the pigs

- 1903 A good sunset view for awhile today
 Nov 26 and sunrise was a few hours the first
 for some days. Charlie & I cleaned a basket
 out, Maggie went to her mother's to
 the hotel & I with her horses.
- " 27 A nice warm day and snow melted
 some. I had one load today and
 was not able to do much. We got a load
 of oats down from implement shed.
- " 28 A nice day very little wind blowing
 and we only got a very little chop and
 found and Charlie got down 30 bags
 out forenoon, and afternoon children
 went to J. V. Little to practice for
 piano tree. I went to Oak here after-
 noon to auction of heavy young stuff
 it was a cash sale but things
 sold high. I had not my car
 covered and snow melted some
- " 30 A nice day sharp but not too cold
 Maggie & I went to Oak here afternoon
 and found up between the two places
 coming to Oak here for see 9, 80-100
 and too at the hotel shop's minister,
 Charlie took home J. S. Kettle's sheep
 a fixed up wagon for taking but
 they unknown

- 1903 A lovely day not cold but cloudy
 Dec 1 and dull. Took out 26 bags to
 today sold at 4 1/4 cents per pound 4495
 pounds in all. I must have the pipe
 as I feel pretty tough today.
- " 2 A lovely warm day with few clouds
 upon it began to snow and I started pretty
 hard with me went to feed. Very windy
 when we got up and snowed in all
 day raised some in afternoon and
 then snow began. Found Charlie
 had run over to practice and clear the
 winter's hills for them, Charlie also
 had run up to Dr. Co to buy. Found
 and I went to Herman's auction at
 12 o'clock, sold out out again with
 3 I bought two horses and a cow
- " 3 Stormed and then had all day today.
 A lot of snow fell and our ground is
 drifted heavily off. Charlie went to
 his children and home leaf that down
 had melted down some all day.
- " 4 Afternoon Charlie & I went to Herman's for
 the cattle we bought could not buy one
 but got two horses into stable and started
 with them, repaid on road and did not
 get home until after night, had a hard
 day. My tongue very sore can hardly talk any

1903 Sat in house all day trying smaller
Dees - so called finally took and feeling un-
able any more. General went for wood to
Dart Lake afternoon then he and Charlie
afternoon went to the Museum for a
hair and got for the repair that
without any trouble.

* 7 Donald School meeting in school
house. I Thomas's time up and P.
Henrick put in for three years in his
place, very few at meeting, afternoon I
went to Dart Lake in buggy and paid
the last \$100.00 on see. by that finished
him. Charlie came out in sleigh and
brought home load of coal.

" 8 A stormy day lots of snow fell and wind
blow very hard at times, near the creek
all day but wind was from north west
and it did not run very well however
we got a good lot done. Charlie & General
shoveled around all day

* 9 A nice day now snowed a little while
but wind not strong enough to do much.
General & hubbille went to Dart Lake afternoon
and that's done long coal. Charlie & General
forenoon and worked afternoon

1903 A cold day but clear and no wind, I went
Dec 10 to Lars in E. forenoon and had dinner
there after Maggie's I went to Dart Lake,
General's horse saw it's stable here for dinner.

" 11 A cold day and at times blow hard
enough to run the lumber snow drifts
a lot, Charlie & General cleared at rest
at replacement had a lot a load down
to forenoon. Maggie's I went to house
note for more afternoon. Very
cold tonight so we go to bed

" 12 A very cold day so when you this
morning, I went to Dart Lake afternoon and
attended directors meeting of Gr. Society
also paid the taxes for 1903 \$13.45
General & hubbille went up to practice,
for some time. A very heavy cold wind
from N.W.

" 14 A cold day Sun clear and a slight
breeze from N.W. windmill ran a
short while. R.E. came for me at
noon and we went to Ortop's set
a lot of people there and they set
wells, General & Charlie cleared out,
went for saw to R.E. is busy.
I work 144 yesterday

1903 A nice day not cold and a slight
 Deers wind all day from east. Charlie's
 Journal took some up to Dr. Co. & left her
 there then they cleared out. I went to
 Dr. Hark's afternoon took out dog's tray
 to have seen one Fox in.

* 16 A huge storm and all day but
 not enough to ~~in~~ and nice
 Journal & Cecil went to Dr. Hark's
 afternoon & then home Sleight's day.
 * 17 A nice day and south all the time
 and strong enough some times to run
 over for. Journal & Stella's got down but
 of rats from implements that. Grace
 & I went to Dr. Hark's afternoon for
 mail

* 18 Children went up to Revere's Church
 afternoon to practice for Christmas
 tree. I went to Camps forenoon and
 bought a black cat from him, after-
 noon I went to Dr. Quady's evening

A nice warm day
 * 19 Maybe I went to Dr. Hark's forenoon
 in better a nice day not cold
 and no wind blowing. Charlie
 & Journal went for ice to River Ferry
 to Dr. Hark for ice and brought
 home a good load

1903 A cold day, clear and sun show
 Dec 21 bright but it was pretty frosty.

Journal was 14 today, he, Rebecca & Cecil
 I myself went to Dr. Hark's, we put
 five dollars for each of the dogs
 and Grace in front, also went to
 Receptation's Church to removal of
 Mrs. Dr. Re. Shekerson see Mrs. in other
 lane, also paid Camp for black
 cat

* 22 A lovely warm day clear & bright
 and no wind with near angle in snow
 it got up a small breeze but no-
 thing worth while. Grace & I went to
 Hark's afternoon. Rags cleared out
 & kind all day

* 23 A nice clear day sun show all
 day, we got all the out at night-
 went had cleared but not all down,
 also ran windmill with seven or
 eight and got a few hundred
 sheep feed. Cecil & Rebecca went
 to Dr. Hark's afternoon for mail,
 last & trying to snow bright. Paid
 south west all day but more
 north west bright

1913 A cold day and then some nearly
 being all day and we saw ourselves that
 it ran dry. We got all the rest
 down from implement shed today
 I went to Carl's home afternoon
 and all the family but the boys
 and myself went to Christmas
 tree in Rehoboth Church tonight.

"25" Christmas Day very cold all
 day and a heavy breeze from north
 we all went up to John's cottage
 for dinner and then to R.R. for
 tea.

"26" A warm day and very little wind fore-
 noon but at 4:30 wind got up and
 blew a regular hurricane all afternoon
 snow drifted at times could hardly
 see, but still it was not cold. I
 went to Mrs. Kauter's forenoon, and
 at 4:30 I went to Carl's home for
 mail reads full, the Snow has
 today and left tonight.

"28" A nice day only at times very windy
 snow drifted a bit and sun shone
 some. We got farming mail around 5
 o'clock and cleaned a load. Horse shant
 took sick at noon I went for tea
 at five and home about 8:30

1913 Dec 29
 A cold day and a heavy wind from south tonight
 pretty hard to keep horse warm. Cleared out
 what remains and took it out to Carl
 's home after had 48 bushels sold at
 60¢. Soakie, J. & Dave Smith here
 afternoon. Harold gone up with him to
 stay a few days.

"30" A nice clear day and not cold.
 Charlie and cleaned a load of what for
 noon and after that in our to Carl
 's home. Snowing a little tonight and wind
 south east.

"31" A colder day than yesterday but still
 not that Charlie and cleaned up a load
 of what forenoon and afternoon. Snow
 is not to Carl's home. Some wind blowing
 but not enough to run wind mill
 works pretty full.

1914
 Jan 1 Carl and I went to Brainerd forenoon and
 got home at noon. Maggie, Grace and I went
 up to the Smiths and stayed for tea tonight
 Harold home with us he has been up
 at 4. J. & Dave day and not cold

"2" A very cold day 35 below zero this morning.
 Cleared load what forenoon and 10
 took it to Carl's home after

1904 Very foggy steadily all day but
 clear & towards evening it cleared up and
 wind got west, it had been south
 all day. Hayge, Linn, Linn &
 I all went to S. J. for dinner
 and R.R. & for tea had a
 pleasant day, and bought a
 horse from S. J. Corral &
 Beechville went to Carlisle
 School for the first time today

"5" A nice mild day and not cold
 cleared up a load of wheat and sold
 it this afternoon in Carlisle at 66¢
 per bushel. I don't expect to sell any
 more just now so I intend to haul some
 to Brimfield. Hardly a breath of
 wind all day.

"6" A nice day with a slight wind from
 south west and we got some smoking
 done. Cleared up load of wheat for
 Carlisle and took it out to Brimfield after
 noon, S. J. Smith & James Goodwin
 here today and left the horse &
 bought from them. I am showing
 the wheat in Carlisle elevated in
 Brimfield until Spring

1907 Clear strong from west all day
 saw 7 bent deer above strong and it
 was warm and nice with a light
 north west wind got north west
 snow drifted a bit and we ran
 Brimfield all day. I took out
 load of wheat to Brimfield
 afternoon

"8" A nice day not cold and a slight
 breeze from south. Charles & I hauled
 up a load of wheat and put it back
 in January. afternoon I took over load
 of sheep to Carlisle and found them a ton
 since fall, haystacks & wheat was there
 good hard clear, when I came
 home, Hayge, Linn, Grace & I all went
 to buy Buckskin for horse

"9" I took load of wheat out to Brimfield
 morning and after Hayge, Beechville & I went
 to Brimfield. Cold in day, and wind
 straight east, but got warmer about
 two o'clock and wind worked around
 south and tonight it is west, very dark
 tonight and dark like snow

1904 A nice day not very cold and
 few 11 no wind. Charlie & I cleaned a
 load of work from forenoon and after
 I went to Oak Lake without a load
 and got the horse teeth filed, also
 gave a bag of flour to J. W. Callman
 and such as home

"12 Storn's horse colt strake out
 to Oak Lake forenoon and had
 horse teeth examined by Vet.
 afternoon I took load as far as
 Hinemald and tonight Mayrie's
 I went up to Prairie to Dagen
 meeting, A hay day not cold
 and saw Snow on top all day

"13 Charlie & I cleaned load which in
 forenoon, ~~was~~ Smith's hay came at
 11.30 had dinner with me I took the
 Smith on to see J. W. Callman's
 work, but cold all day but with
 east afternoon was pleasant

"14 Storn's cow load to Hinemald forenoon
 sold 14 bushels and stored 40, with
 east in hay, and had a small Snow
 storm but nothing to signify. Went to Oak
 Lake afternoon after shoe service for
 forenoon will played a horse race
 raised a leg to repaired in Blacksmith shop

1904 Wind blew pretty hard all day
 from N. W. and snow drifted a lot
 Charlie & I cleaned up load forenoon
 and I took it out to Oak Hinemald
 afternoon. Mayrie, Snow, heubille & Charlie
 all went to see at home at 400 Smith
 tonight, not blowing very hard but
 pretty frosty. Snow & heubille went to
 Oak Lake school this morn. but
 came home again as teacher was sick
 and no school

"16 A very cold day. I went to Oak Lake
 forenoon in cutter and found it about the
 same I have been out in this year, a
 heavy sharp wind from west. After
 noon I went to Hinemald with load
 of horse and wind was east with very
 strong. Wind blowing strong from east
 tonight so we go to bed.

"18 Wednesday Sunday was a very stormy
 day wind east all day and snow drifts
 very badly we did not go to church, this
 forenoon is no better and then had from
 east until noon, it stopped then out
 west west down until there was hardly
 any and toward S. W. got very wrong &
 dark so if it would snow more we had a
 slight fall towards night but very little

1907 A cold day wind N.W. and snow
Jan 19 drifted at foot dead, I went out to
Grinnells afternoon with SD lumber
wheel and had a job to get there
no words were so had and full of
snow. Snow & Belville at school in
Dart Lake today. Our school opened
yesterday. Place & Eric going there.
Very pretty tonight

" 20 A very cold day this morn. about as
cold as any we had this year. Cleared
up ~~the~~ a load of wheat forenoon
and took it out to Grinnells, a bus
selling at 71¹/₂ per bushel there.
Tonight wind south and warmer.

" 21 A nice day not cold a slight breeze,
from south all day, I cleared up last
wheat forenoon and took it out to Grin-
nells after. Sold 24¹/₂ bushels of store
30 bushels it is now selling at 71¹/₂

" 22 Charlie & I cleared up last wheat fore-
noon and after lunch to MacRae to
for mail, a pretty cold day and
wind will now nearly all day.

" 23 I started with load to Grinnells in
morning on road wind for 2 hrs and it
blow hard all day, fearful cold, worst

 had to stop at eleven on account of
 rain. Afternoon I went to Cart Lane
 and shot some grouse &c.

George doing some hunting every
 day he is doing a pretty good
 job but it is very slow. Stock
 also well like. Good tonight but
 there is some mist and clouds

"25 A nice warm day but with some
 rain all day. Deer all day with
 four horses out of house.

George horse in pasture but car
 South & also started some
 I went to Cart Lane tonight for
 some repairs for deer.

"26 A lovely warm day, and Sam was
 out deer about all day. George
 finished all the hunting we intend
 doing now. He also put into harness
 a rather unglorious into an American saddle
 seat & some one should notice him
 & then started after the two
 haggies & I he & George went up to
 J. S. Kettle this afternoon

1904 A nice hot day, George & I
 Day 27 with both haggies all day in
 fallow and got a very pretty well
 fully that from was laying down
 some & we had best. Three more
 there is only a small piece left to
 cut now. Boys started all day.
 I he & George, Macmillan & I went to
 Cart Lane afternoon. Had to go
 W. R. tonight.

"29 A dull dark day and rain &
 little all forenoon. I he & George
 went to Cart Lane forenoon and
 after did not do almost only three
 a boy was right. Boys cleaned
 spots. I went set up some traps &
 we closed accounts forenoonly

"30 A nice day George & I went all
 day, forenoon we finished piece on
 east end of fine and then set a
 some north of school. Hunt and
 all day and laid out

"31 Dull & dark all day and we did
 not cut any. George was helped
 I hilled afternoon, after boys finish
 up chaffet case. Haggies & I went
 up to Mrs Smith. Home next day

1907 A dull day and sun did not show
Sept 1st at all, got very close & hot at
times and just as we gain at night
it begins to drizzle, rain very pretty nothing
fell near the water. George & I went on
Saw all day, very little of the water
really ripe but we must get it down
as it is so late. No sign of fungus yet
and must wait all the time.

" 2 A lovely warm day, the fruit
real bright this day we have had
since harvest started, I had to
go to West Lake first thing in day,
for repairs for bushes and after
noon George & I went all the way
that was nearly a hour and
then started to cut barley in
pieces, my hands went the long
and I will have to go out again
tomorrow morning. Had 8 or 9 and
a lovely clear night
" 3 I went to East Lake for grass for
reparis for bushes George began to cut
barley at 9.30 we started out all after-
noon at barley and cut a bag but
of it. Saw some water about four
feet deep when it got cloudy. Again and
Saw some clouds under a big cloud

1907 A clear nice afternoon Sun show
Sept 2nd bright and it was pleasant, very
hot at times. Raind pretty heavy
yesterday and found very much
W. Williams came this morn. and
put in pump in new well. At
evening of the day, George & I had
a lunch and then went to East
Lake, W.C. & wife came also. George
& I went back home for part and left
for home after being there 5 or 6 weeks.
Just started up barley all day,
George & I went worked at fence in
yard for some time George started
to cut barley and I will still make
it fence and digged watering
trough. Got some from the
table at four and our balance
of evening I started again with
A. H. Spencer for the table today
and tomorrow the table home
" 6 George & I finished cutting barley at home
and then began at a piece of what
we had left in fallow and did
not finish it at night, it is a
very heavy part piece. George brought
home the water tonight and will use
it soon tomorrow

1904 I finished cutting some last
Sept 7 pieces of wood on fallow as
soon then I want to make side of
Soree and cut the water's right
George cut them all day. Along the
slope day and boy had on horse
today to Supter Maggie's birthday

" 8th my last day hardly any work
this morning George & I got started to cut
at home and kept at it all day
we finished cutting the two acres
on west side of house and got started
at another place that Maggie want
to cut yesterday with George
" 9th finished cutting a level at home
which is not there on fire was
so hard, rough pretty light there. A very
strong wind today, had the stone
clean. Maggie came to see how standing
this evening

" 10th very cold day wind NW. all day
I had heavy coat and clove on all
day and other items cool, finished
cutting which means so much shortly
after dinner and this day at 5:30
were piece near hills, Nelson came
up and he had no and we got 20
acres of it cut that's my side from tonight

1904 Raining when we got up this day, and
Supter kept sprinkling all day, in afternoon
it fell a good lot. I went out to cut
the afternoon & then and the old wagon
to S. H. Keenan. Boys cleaned pan and
chopped amongst generally, but Sam & I
were he been here in afternoon

and for tea
" 13th Raining when we got up, and
a good hot fall. At noon it cleared
up and only strong from NW. after-
noon and everything dried up, boys
started what afternoon, George cleared
the two acres and side of house.
I went to binoculars for some and
paid my bill O. W. M. does

" 14th A nice day warm and nice
lungs. George & I saw where
and finished it at noon, and
afternoon I went to cut here &
for horses & had in front & George
cut out. There he Keenan, A. S. S. S. S.
J. J. Smith & wife & John S. S. S. S. S.
have for tea. I had first this day.
" 15th A heavy rain this day. Had nothing from
after I went to cut here & left place & got for
boys wanted at piece & had last horse
save stone. Paid part afternoon

1907 Large & Deer cats all day very
Sept 16 drench in hay, and rained some
that not enough to make us stop.

But not nearly all out, George had
his winter home and since Jimmie
it tomorrow they will. I want to see it
again this evening. I want to see it.
I. Hoag about Thursday, he is to start
off Monday and I am to call there
tomorrow.

" 17 A cold but no rain all day, but
no rain fell although we had a good
showing last night. I finished cutting

" 21 Hoag had at Mr. Hoag's all day
he then came back, his what having
our well. He finished day we have
had for a week.

" 22 Deer's plowing all day and out
and like rain a little mist the
fall. Hoag finished at his when
at 10:30 and went down, he started
to head out for a while at
11:30 and made a good afternoon
set me and out. Some & Hoag
had our two horses in front

" 23 Some had one deer out here tomorrow
will at 11. I had had afternoon to Jimmie
will at home. Jimmie finished all what
ready at 3 o'clock & moved over to Hoag's
A dull day no rain. fell dark storm
set up large stacks of straw

1904 A dull drab day and a few small
Squirr showers of rain fell but not enough
to stop the day. Three teams were at
Newington all day the day, I think
two loads of coal of our own today and
sold at 87 p per hundred.

" The three teams at Newington with four
reel and they they went to Mr. Sprague
and helped him. I took out two loads
to Port Vale for very soft today & I
sent the baggage for once for me
A very hot day cloudy & blunder like
rain at times but some came very
hot tonight

" 27 Rainy when we got up this day
and we had good a shower but
it stopped at times and started
for a while

" 27 Three men steamed away the day
for Mr. Sprague today on Dr. Stewart
place. Went out to see four loads
what to Car Vale with our own
team & Dr. Stewart's Steady it with
Dr. Stewart's.

" 28 Rainy when we got up but not much
fell. Men went to Sprague at 7 o'clock & down to
Car Vale with four, came nearly all the way
to me but stuck up some & came back at home

1904 A lovely day we made up the
Sept 29 goods to Port Vale today and saw
at home loads for tomorrow morning
that takes up all the rest we
have there yet. Machine came to Mr. R.
Smith's this day, at nine and so
the day. It's about in town's day
usually at times. Maggie's horse
went to Millner's today

" 30 A nice day we took 154 bushels
what to Car Vale this day, and that
is all we had there but I have
1029 that was in elevator. Last
day and two loads for Mr. R. today
George & Gerald drive one each.
The family had the day a hundred
acres and some & over on the
bright we will begin to think on
some tomorrow. Ray's three carts
and the rest of the day.

Sept 31 Machine started to break on some the
day. We only got a small foreman, as
machine did not work well, and at
11.30 the three farmers there and they
did nothing when water fire water &
away. Several took one load to machine
and at 8.30, I went to Car Vale afternoon
& sold two loads to Mr. Stewart at 87 1/2

1904 A very dull dark day but not like

 purchase all day and did not think
 any. We drove out six loads where
 to Oak Lake and also got up 14
 bags of potatoes. I sell some on
 of walk to Dan. Roberts as
 85 1/2 cents that is all the whole
 I have in Oak Lake

15 Very cold forenoon wind N.W. got
 a little bloom after noon and saw
 snow some. finished trucking on.
 Drove at 11:30 and went to field
 near school, grain here it is six
 and moved two ears of corn
 into yellow. Found that one ten
 loads to tomorrow today

1904 A fine day. finished trucking
 Oct 6 all the whole at four o'clock, and
 then began at trucking had on eight
 teams. trucking steam and brought
 them to yard got one fine machine
 of halley done, and had a little
 one fine horse named of about.

"I think had trucking halley at two o'clock
 and then started at oak but only got
 about four loads that as it had some
 sprinkling rain for some time and
 he the got so wet and also steam that
 it was impossible for us to do
 except that, so soon as four teams
 had dinner they all went home.
 The calves were one day ago. We
 have five thousand two hundred
 of wheat in all and over 1000
 of barley, the whole averaged about
 six hundred per acre. Our own
 field up place for hay and we
 have 12 of the best wheat in
 the State. We own one team for
 plowing hay last night. Rained
 some half afternoon but not
 very much fell

1904 Dull & dark all day and thus
 Oct 8 very little. I went to Bar Lake for

 He has been working here nearly
 two months and is going home.
 Expans 22 rows of potatoes today.
 George plowed from 3 o'clock in
 afternoon on share with George & John
 Wheat crop to see George & John

 in Brainerd

17 A fine day but cold started to think
 oats in hay but faster than ever
 We they had to go to Bar Lake
 for repairs, got going again afterwards
 and splashed down wheat, & that
 it was four o'clock before day that
 was made we washed water near
 base and grain had the oats and
 rye seed. I left about ten loads
 of oats that we will feed in shops
 and think the 1500 bushels, 1200
 of barley and 5000 wheat

18 Dull & gloomy this day, but clear up near
 noon and had a splendid evening. Started at
 8 o'clock and made in hay & then in evening
 again.

1904 The team and the man at
 Oct 19 Carpenter today will pour
 about what they finished and
 machine went to J. Sawyer & man. I
 got to think a few days more with
 George's machine, George plowed
 on seven & Lewis should arrive home
 I want to Brainerd at noon and
 took the three o'clock train for

 the lights

13 A nice warm day left Brainerd
 for home at 1 o'clock and found
 that we at Brainerd George plowing
 on seven made hay all day, went

 and into cellar. Days all went
 to hear the light speak in
 Bar Lake tonight. Good rest and
 very little snow.

14 George plowed water now then the
 plowed of a few days we went out

- " 19 I was helping Dr. C. to spoked with

 Coal afternoon hehille & I took
 out two bags & brought home some
 Charles & Jags for her house.
 George & Lewis finished setting in

 " 31 I took out two loads where to

 & brought home wagon. W.C. Smith, W.C.

1907 A very hot day so warm so July
 kept at I took George down to his in Callman
 this way, he is done here now and I
 paid him \$300 this way, he is going to
 work at his hotel now all winter at
 \$20 per hr, he came back with me and
 took load out to Oak Lake afternoon.
 I planned on seeing afternoon, Morris worked
 at laundry Sunday this evening came

"1 A nice warm day, I took load out

 until noon and then went to Dr. W.

1909 Lewis went to look late forenoon and
 on 12 but. Some snow. I helped
 saw at the house forenoon and had
 to go to look late afternoon but enough
 money in hand then to meet my note
 which matures on 19th. Lewis helped
 carry load hay all day. It was
 mild day clear temperature a good
 change from last 5th

14 A lovely snow day as warm as July
 Lewis did not come today so I did what
 I could at the house, also put some
 saw in window. Lewis cleaned our dogs
 & went to men for a change of water.
 Tomorrow morning as they deliver me
 that is Dr. R. Smith's & myself have to
 leave here at the 10 o'clock, Lewis will
 take us out to Brimons & we have to
 go to Brandon to wait for Dr. R.
 Smith in his case with Henry
 17 There snow in Brandon since the
 morning of 15th waiting on Lewis's case
 to take up but it did not, so we
 leave today that it would not
 come on before Saturday afternoon
 or perhaps Sunday so Dr. R. Smith
 Dr. R. Smith & myself came upon
 from today and walked our home

1904 we expect to go back again on
Nov 17 Saturday at daylight. Weather has
been beautiful since we left and
today is like summer. Saw two
all the shooting on my home and
one side nearly all stopped to also
for the corner all on.

"18 A lovely warm day saw 2 Labridges
at the house all day and finished
it when they came for. From
boards of whole to put in the house
for them. Got word tonight we
have to go back to Brandon to

"19 Left home at three o'clock this morn.

Went up in gear for the day
Harris from three dollars and
paid it.

"23 A nice day again but enough wind
to run cowherd. Harris sick in bed
all day. I did all the chore forenoon
and after lunch to Cox there
& brought home a barrel of
apples and a new range for
Anderson is taking over back
at 7.20.00. Paid back tonight and
back to the house.

1907 My week of snow this
morning. The first of the season
it is but my cattle and snow
is soft and not our feet. Some
see it again today and can do
nothing to do but see them
and I will see. I did show my
self. Went to the little sale
afternoon. Rouben went with me
in my home I bought the gun
all stems from him for 30.00.
Rouben came up forenoon and
helped me set up a new
range. I sat yesterday all
day and looks like more
snow.
"28" Lewis sick all day but he went
to Car Horse forenoon & but, how some
shower, afternoon he could do ~~nothing~~
nothing. Beyond around all day

day he is 13 today. Still no work
all day, but no more snow yet.
Rouben came up tonight & told us

1907 We cold now day wind east
to 25 & back to all day. I did clean up
forenoon also got quarters of beef
from Rouben, afternoon. Lewis
feels almost to Car Horse to 1.
Lewis Sale got some new stock.
"28" Snow had east wind all day
yesterday and today with wind
to him it got more to north and
today it is N.W. Had some heavy
falls of snow today at times and
it was disagreeable to me it all
though. My horse went to Car Horse
afternoon in heavy, but enough snow
for for sleighing. Lewis got one
load of shale home.
"29" A cold day wind from N.W. all
day but not enough to melt
well. I went to Lewis's forenoon
and after shower around home.
Saw the three sheep from Rouben to
night for 5.00. Lewis went to Car
Horse forenoon to get horses
shod but I could not get it done.
Got a few snow sacks in today.
Dinner around here tonight as
it is very pretty.

1904. Afternoon below zero this being a
 Nov 30 have come from NW hill not
 enough to run engines. Rept show
 water all day. Went to Port Lake

 went to camp to help Robinson
 credit Shepard books, Lewis books
 four books sent from west of
 three and put into the house today.

 foreman hole it was frozen so hard
 we did not touch it after, but
 Macbille what a cleaned eye saw
 seed after. Very cold all day and
 kept freezing.

" 14 A cold day and we did nothing on
 land, foreman we cleaned eye saw
 seed and have about 1400 pounds of
 good clean seed, afternoon Harry was
 to J. J. McElroy and brought home
 a hundred bushels of barley. I
 went to Guinness foreman for
 horse collar but they were not
 ready. Sowing a little as we go to
 bed.

" 15 Betty sold all and a strong wind
 from N.W. I went to Car Kate for
 corn in baggy rook four bags
 potatoes at 60's per bushel, some
 took them out in afternoon. I went
 to Guinness afternoon & got horse col-
 lar, came home by bus & Callum
 had tea there. Now cleaned up
 all our seed barley foreman & after
 cleaned out Callum to show out manure

1905 - Wind cold all day but some hot.
 April 19 Henry & I took out three steers
 to Clear foreman & then plowed
 the steers weighed 3500. Afternoon
 Henry drilled on seven. Then plowed
 at home & I ran Parker.

"18 I went to Carl here foreman to
 attend Mr. Runk's funeral but it
 was not until one o'clock, Carl
 ran Parker east of home foreman
 and I ran it after. Henry finished
 school seeding on seven at ten
 o'clock and put in balance of
 day seeding east of home. Then
 I returned with two horses all
 day on seven. Windy afternoon
 and dust very high. Work
 done & log to her foreman & this
 evening.

"19 Snow show clear & bright all day
 but wind was cold. I packed
 foreman and after went to Carl
 here to meet Englishman wife
 from England that they did not
 come. Henry drilled all day &
 I ran foreman on seven.

1905 - Henry & I plowed until noon
 April 20 then he packed until five,
 when he plowed again until night
 I plowed all day & ran foreman
 on seven. Englishman wife
 came today, they had a log in
 Carl's hole when just here. Sun
 bright all day but wind cold

"21 the hottest day we have had yet
 but still there was a cool breeze. Plowed
 on east quarter of five all day, & Henry
 drilled & packed. I ran foreman on
 seven all day only a while he was
 for some water to river. On seven
 I ran her killing worked in foreman
 I ran her killing worked in foreman
 "22 a hot day again. I plowed until
 noon and then out to Carl's hole, Carl
 came with me. Carl plowed in my
 place afternoon & finished the wheat
 land east of home. Henry packed
 plowed & drilled in same place and
 there is about eight acres to run yet.
 I ran foreman on seven all day.
 Henry went packing foreman tonight
 then.

1905 A nice warm day. Went to Arc
 April 24th took forenoon boat (Sunday school
 after) I planned for wheat west of
 home near Seaside. Henry packed &
 we had a cart-quantity of four and
 I paid for it, he also planned some
 near Seaside. You finished hammering
 on several and dig the two pieces
 each side of here at home.

Mr. Kelley writes in paper
 "25th Henry hammered all day with
 four horses on cart-quantity of four
 tons & I planned near Seaside"

"26th Long but no hoe out twice to
 day & had it raised a few days
 but not enough to stop so,
 you & I planned near Seaside
 all day Henry finished for
 raising cart-quantity & did a
 little near Seaside"

"27th Very windy all day from west very
 cool and disagreeable, rain fell of
 about and nearly unmanageable to
 work. I took out the 2nd & 3rd boxes
 this way. They did not suit. Afternoon
 I went up to Mr. J. Johnston's & see
 about getting a pile but did not get
 any.

1905 A very cold and windy day. Wind
 April 28th west and then a hurricane from
 noon, we had a few drops of rain
 about noon and it got a lot warmer
 I went to Cart Lane forenoon and
 brought home a lot of fruit trees
 and afternoon delivered them around
 country, so many as possible but
 there is a few got to deliver.
 Henry drilled in wheat near Seaside
 all day and you planned & hammered.
 I drilled & wife here for outside to
 night

"19th A cold day not pleasant at all
 I took Henry out to Eugene the
 way. he has been here a month
 I believe also came delivered 433
 bushels of wheat at 74th I believe
 also checked out some. Afternoon I went
 to Cart Lane & paid Mr. Grantman
 note. Went to Cart Lane tonight and
 brought home an Englishman &
 wife to work for me.
 May 1st Went to Cart Lane forenoon
 & checked out all the wheat I had there
 at 75th afternoon went to Cart Lane & Cart
 Lane & saw Mr. Johnston. Saw some wheat
 by Lake through fields some wheat

- 1905 - Very clear & hot at times today
 May 2 but towards evening it got very
 cool & windy from N.E. I planned
 at fallow or soon all day, but
 did also while Port showed the
 piece of bucking & began to hammer
 down last piece of rubber. Roger
 went to Linnwood in afternoon
- " 3 Very cold all day I planned on soon
 at fallow with fine oil cut in
 evening and then came home to this
 day. I planned then water soon
 if they went up to see Harry Stear-
 son, Port hammered on land next
 of house & soon school all
 day. Wind N.E. & feels like snow
 " 4 Snow was up today about getting a
 place for some & afterwards he & Port
 worked the stone, cleaned cellar
 & school around. Port finished the
 morning over school in day. A
 few feet wind all day from N.
 this fall of duck and we had quite
 a little of water, but only about
 an inch fell. Ground very dry
 and we could have done with
 a part of snow

- 1905 - Cool before dinner but got nice
 May 5 after lunch Sun shore clear all
 day. Hammer on snow with the two
 boys and walking plan all fore-
 noon, and afternoon stepped on
 boys and put Port packing near
 school. These have very close
 with side here and will have
 to top morning here
- " 6 A nice warm day. Sun Clark done day
 plan on snow all day & Port ran part
 on fine near school. I have frozen
 and after that had horse out to
 car yard to the rest and had to leave
 when there, Arrived a Stone house today
 he is to come in a week or two days. I pay
 him 20 for fruit worth 1.30 per bushel
 after that will write it up
- " 8 I planned on snow all day it got very
 cold towards evening and wind got east.
 Sun Clark left this day, and went to work
 for Walter Stearns. Port finished packing
 when had and began at noon to hammer
 on snow in her & our plough.
- " 9 I planned until snow and then went to
 take with team for some points cheaper. Port
 hammered until noon on snow and then planned
 after. Snow & hammer went off day and tomorrow very hot

1905 Snowed & rained all day and we May 10 did not do anything. A lot of soft snow fell and we are getting the drifts too so badly now.

" 11 I went to Car Lake forenoon and very muddy, Bob went to N.R. for biscuits and then finished plowing fallow or snow the first time. Afternoon Bob & I plowed near Car Carpenter for Bailey. R. Lawrence came today & got some hay into he also bought 420 lbs. He gave seed and will pay me \$14.40 for it later on. I spent & that I spent here for tea.

" 12 Bob plowed all day for hay. I plowed forenoon and afternoon. I took out some hay to Car Lake so that to I spent at 4 1/2¢ they weighed 220 each. Carl replaced all day only in afternoon we had a few small showers of rain. Maggie away at J. J. Smith's today.

" 13 Bob & Lawrence all day in snow at the fallow and just let it. I plowed for barley until noon and then Carl plowed after. Maggie & Lawrence went to Car Lake afternoon. A nice day.

1905 A few small showers of rain today May 15 but nothing much. Bob & I plowed for barley until noon then he harnessed after and I plowed until eight. Very slow & hot at times but good at those now that our share much and lots of humus & black shales in north at noon.

" 16 Maggie & I went to Brandon today done down a horse again. Got home at dark had a man there from here sent for 5 1/2¢ when the at 75¢ per bushel. Call & clear all day in Brandon & on way down & up again, but on way back there we found they had a big snow at three barrels we got none of that. Bob plowed with Gay all day & Bob has round & killed we have fifteen more of barley in now.

" 17 A nice day now & clear all day. The new man Car & Bob plowed forenoon for hay, afternoon Bob & Lawrence and dinner. I went to horse forenoon and after I plowed also Mrs. J. S. Little here afternoon. I Lewis & brother came tonight to paint.

1905 - A very hot day and a light breeze
May 18th from east, this is the hottest day
of the season. Dora & I plowed for
hardly all day. Don't tiller in the
field and then do plowed also. I
know & but the tree planting all day

" 19 Dora & I plowed Dora at night
all day and finished it tonight. I began
to sow the late ones afternoon but
did not get along very well. Don't
know what potatoes is evening

" 20 Dora & I plowed most of day and we
had a few drops of rain. We sowed
potatoes forenoon and we got them
all planted afternoon Dora & I
were to a Directors meeting of Agri. Soc.
at 7. Don't sowed rye grass all day
and had to go over ground twice.
Dora & I finished painting & putting
paper on the Boarder & sitting down
to night

" 21 A windy day when Dora & I
sowed east all day. I plowed for
east all day. Don't sowed rye grass
sowed forenoon & planted barley front
after. Dora & I sowed potatoes
sowed forenoon & plowed in field after.
planted in potatoes on 20th

1905 Rainy when we got up this morning and
May 23 a hot fall through the day. Dora
sowing it ground very heavy. Maggie went
to Don's late forenoon and got me good
showers. Dora & I plowed forenoon but
know showers and afternoon rained
up but only made one mound. Maggie
went to school afternoon they had a
small celebration there on a of
Thank Day. We got potatoes picked
over in cellar.

" 24 Dora & I raining come as we got up
had very little fall and we went out
to plow at nine o'clock, wind blew
at times we nearly impossible to sit
on plow, we had some hail forenoon
I was out well in afternoon but did
not do anything. Dora & I had plow
ed. Dora & I had all day but was
pleasant afternoon. We sowed
with some oats to be chop feed.

" 25 A clear nice day but not very
warm. Dora & I plowed all day, I was
not well. Dora & I plowed with some and
then he sowed oats after. Dora & I sowed
rye seed all day. W. R. Smith
came & got three bags rye seed

1908 A cold day and we had a couple
 May 26 of small showers of rain & hail.
 I planned for rats all day & finished it
 Don't remember forenoon and finished
 tomorrow all the rat had one in the
 afternoon. People hammered badly some
 across all day and got it about half
 done. Mrs. Haney, Helen & Arthur too
 for tea. Donald & I went to see Big
 allium tonight. Very cold tonight and
 will freeze

" 27 Still when we got up this day. I
 went to Binwald forenoon then at
 two o'clock here to Callow's saw some
 work & I went out to Car Lane tree
 line. One about buying for farm, she
 states the price and she is to let her
 know in two weeks if she will accept,
 she had tea here on way home.
 Don't finish last evening all the rats to
 day and except finished tomorrow
 hardly present others. A nice day
 and not cold

" 29 A very hot day the latter we have
 hot. I planned some pieces over time
 for tonight. Don't remember the exact
 call day to Car Lane when

1908 A hot day at noon it got cloudy
 May 30 and we had a few drops of rain
 west & south of here they went & here
 had a good day rain. I planned follow
 east of Littleton there is two acres I am
 turning it very shallow for first time.

" 3 We all went to Ustou this morn. & got our pictures taken a family group. One horse to Mrs Smith's for dinner. About as hot today as any we will get this year, but towards night it got cool & we got as we go to bed there is lots of thunder & lightning & it is raining but not very hard. One cow bled over to Car for two spots her to home again, he finished the plowing east of house and got the price nearly all done twice. One field bled.

" 5 Ragan to rain yesterday. Sunday as the wind and rain almost steadily with tonight, some times it let up a little but was not far together. I went to Car here this afternoon and thought how the wire stretches for day were from Mrs Anderson.

1905 A quiet day out to day. This morn-

Day 2 - Stuffed in hay nearly all day, we had a small shower near noon and missed two loads. When going out every chance I had. Had little hay for awhile forenoon. We finished day's work of hay with 35 loads in it.

" 3 - Little rain came last night they came with hay & I to Brandon. Here today we drive down in hay. Got there at nine o'clock and left for home at 7:30 we got home at 12 we straight, had a pleasant day but very hot. Snow at home melted at hay & shed timbers.

" 4 - A very heavy rain this evening. Before we got up and everything very wet. First down our measure all day on to western where we cut hay, then and were heavy timbers & also was dipping from around trees. Found went to Carl's late afternoon got plan print changed & brought home some wood, took wife rain again tonight. I packed harness afternoon. D. S. Smith here afternoon. A fearful hot clear day nearly impossible to work.

1905 - A very hot day again I went to Carl's late forenoon in buggy & had in timbers & knitted a hay in Sleigh on Lewis afternoon. Don't think I could cut measure all day. Don't want to cut a hay. Think like having timbers go down & that W. H. Youngs man, Henry Lewis went to D. S., for more & made up all the hay and this man Slaughter in refuge.

" 7 - A hot day but a nice breeze Lewis & Don't handle our measure all day, Don't want to get hot west of there & got some of them up, kept to - now he will do now. I went to Mrs. Lewis's side mostly Carl's late and brought two steers in car for \$1.00.

" 8 - A very hot day. Don't worked in corn Don't's Lewis day and measure after-noon I went to Mrs. Lewis's side that time & that was from there. Found in afternoon dressed fallen east of house.

" 9 - A very hot day. Found finished driving fallen east of house at sun set that time home to his hills, Don't's Lewis down-out measure. Don't day up part west of there. I went to Carl's late afternoon for lumber.

19th - Part a Lewis handle out

Aug 10 - became all day. One some
Some parts opposite them for four-
dollar for handle.

" 11 - Had went to London & helped
him some riding for some four
weeks. Part a Lewis handle handle
all day. I was out part for handling

1901 - A nice forenoon but after it

" 19 A nice evening day. One & Louis has

 woods forenoon & got two
 pairs there for J. Miller & myself
 for birds, Mr. Miller saw after them
 tonight. Some returned on seven
 forenoon. They are well at
 present hunting on the day
 " 21 A nice day cool & pleasant. Some
 & spent with the two ladies on
 seven all day in the fall plowing
 a family and crop but we got
 a long walk. J. Miller & Louis to see
 of Honey's bear house went in evening

1901 - A nice forenoon but afternoon it got
 Aug 22 - very windy and the rain. One and
 at forenoon a seven and afternoon
 One & Louis out there & finished the
 price we had cut around, brought
 home birds and made two ponds
 around the spring now for
 east of house it is a good crop
 and will average 20 stalks.
 J. Miller & I went up to J. R. Miller
 afternoon to see how his huts on
 birds were working they were
 well but he cannot turn in sleep
 at coming any more than deer,
 " 23 Out on the 80 am. I had most of
 home all day old birds in the
 fore forenoon and arrived my an-
 nounce of the summer with the
 One was right to get the first
 to length a nice day & birds
 some of the birds here today.
 " 24 Not pretty windy today but
 we did not stop plowing birds
 I went to Deer Park in afternoon
 for old birds but it kept blowing
 all day. I have no other tonight
 to get a one on tomorrow.

1905 - A very hot day. Found a hole in
 Day 25 - new ladder furnished & went to
 Port Hope and got a new screen
 for Mr. Winkler for the truck
 on it and got it working at 2:30
 it works well, we finished cutting
 on the eighth and east of line
 and got road around the pier
 near St. John's, found here the
 middle in his chains tonight. Very
 hot and feels like rain. Winkler
 all day

"26 A few feel hot day I don't remember
 of anything more so they at all
 and a severe day Sun. Out with screen
 for Winkler all day west of line
 also got under on the old one and
 cut with it for a while, screen
 night. Rain! Some last night and
 we did not get started day early
 this day.

"28 Three very heavy thunder storms
 passed me this day. Lightning very close
 and wind and hail for a while
 blew down a lot of my potatoes, lightning
 struck J. Duggan's house in Port Hope
 began next west of home of tomorrow
 for the first again. Rain! a little

1905 - Very windy all day snow trace setting
 Day 29 up & down that has been blown
 down but could not see in after-
 noon had to stop starting for
 awhile and did not start home in
 stable on account of wind. Found
 here what Mr. Winkler had to go
 to Port Hope for another. Winkler
 cutting west of home at once and
 then went to down west of their after-
 noon. Screen pretty heavy and we
 had back some on way, but
 fall plowing starting up & straight
 had a splendid crop

"30 A nice day but very hot and
 wind got out in afternoon. Screen

"31 The started to rain this day. but only
 got a short very down fall when we
 had to make it as it began to rain, and
 kept it up all day, passed at town now

1908 A dull dawn day and we had
 a slight shower of rain. Carl
 now says plan all day is wasted
 but planned in the morning plan with
 room. Louis's day at rest alone
 until noon and then the three men
 set up stork afternoon. went to

 party to meet & brought from home
