1907 A nice day Sun shone clear
Mar 9 warm but wind was raw
and cool. Snow melted a little
and roads are getting cut up. I
took one load of wheat for
Mr. Rommer forenoon and
after we cleaned out all stable
got in two loads straw and one
of hay today. Maggie & I went
to town after noon.

" 11 Snowed & stormed a lot today
at times could not see a hundred
yards but it was not cold. Maggie
baby & I went up to Grandpa's
today. I went on to J Bailey from
there and seen his stock. Four
loads came to be chopped today.

H.W. Young man here and his
Bert finished hauling home
four stacks of hay

1907 Cold and some snow the
month down was nice & warm after-
noon. I went to Lark Hall on
town and brought home a
panning mill to separate oats
from a load. Afternoon I
cleaned, there is some coal
here to burn & I had a fire
with a road knight and
is waiting on it to be lit again
all night.

" 13 Not very cold but dull & snowed
some. Crushed all day the biggest
day I have done yet. Bert did
chores all day. Snowing a little
tonight but not cold. Joe
Hartgomery here for tea

" 14 A nice day not very cold, I crushed
it nearly all day. Bert here and fixed horses
hatch. Bert brought his team here to
day. W Head here for tea

1907 I crushed until eleven
A.M. then helped do chores until
noon when Bert & I went to
Baileys sale where he bought
a pair of sleighs & a set of
harness. Cattle still cheap
and horses sold dear. I
brought a Durham bull
from A.R. Tolton today. Wind
east all day & colder than it
has been.

16 Very stormy all forenoon blew
a hurricane and snow drifts
badly, but it stopped at noon
and was a pleasant afternoon.
I went to Oak Lake at noon and
heard Mr. Holbrook speak on
Cloud growing. Waited until
train came in at night ex-
pecting a man but he did
not come.

(4)

1907 A very stormy day could not
see a quarter of a mile at times
and kept it up all day. Did chores
and son can see him. Red Cray
for Bert & did his work for
him - wife & one of the children were
to school.

19 A nice day cold but pleasant.
Bert & I did chores all forenoon.
He & Celia went up to Mr. Sloans
and he helped them take out
three loads of wheat to Oak Lake.
I plowed very little today.

" 20 Very windy from S.W. and
also warm, snow went a lot
and fallows are getting bare.
Leroy & Melville stayed at home
today brought three loads water
from far hills and cleaned out
big steers. I crushed all day. Bert &
Celia took out two loads of grain.

1906 Dull all day and rained quite hard a bit in afternoon, Bert took out 36 bags of his chop forenoon and after he got his dull down to Oak Lake from his Banks. H.R. took him out a load afternoon I went out empty afternoon and hired a Frenchman for 15 days Roads very bad.

" 22 A nice warm day and snow went a lot roads were not bad in early as it was frozen some back they got very soft towards night. I took out load chop for Bert forenoon and brought home ~~the~~ chop barrel Salt afternoon R.H. Smith came for his chop and bought me a man that is staying for a few days. Hired a Frenchman yesterday for 15 days at \$5.00 and he is to stay all summer at \$7.00 per m

1907 A very warm day and snow & a bit more. Bert & I went that used to work for H. Lister now helping me and we cleaned out a boat we did not get much done as rain is wet and will not clean. Bert all the while cleaned out today and after a short time went out to Westdale at Oak Lake & brought home our stone boat. Made nearly impermeable by Jim. It is here today.

" 15 All cold day wind N.E. & very cold did not have any today. Man went up to H.C. for 50 bushels seed oats. Spent afternoon for H. Gumpf when cleaned seed wheat got along well. I walked up to H.C.s forenoon to see R. Kennedy, wife & family they arrived yesterday from Out.

1907 Blowing hard from east all
around day and began snowing at
ten o'clock. Kept it up all day
after, not very cold but stormy.
Wind and a lot of snow fell.
Men did chores and cleaned
wheat. I crushed load for
H. Sloan, some for H. Goupp
and some for ourselves.

" 27 Drovved ten inches yesterday and
last night and wind north cold
today. I tried to crush forenoon but
dynamo dirty so I took it over to
H. Stevens after and got it cleaned.
Men did chores & cleaned wheat.
Warmer tonight but thawed very
little today.

" 28 Went to Grinnell forenoon and bought
a new harness, after crushed, men
cleaned wheat. School shut for Easter
holidays.

1907 Very cold all day. Emil
Gravag got two loads wood from Doc
Marshall's place. I cleaned all
day. Men did chores & cleaned
wheat.

" 30 Very frosty this morn. Must have
been away below zero. I took
Mrs. Smithers out to Oak Lake
and she went to Trapella on
local train to their farm there.
I only wish we could get a
girl or woman as good again as
she was. Crushed afternoon.
Frosty all day and melted some.
Sister Anna was 53 yesterday
and James Armstrong in Huntley
was 65.

Apr. 1 Brother W.C. 45 today. A warm day
and snow melted a lot. I ran crusher
all day. Men cleaned wheat. Killed steer
today expect he has tuberculosis.

(9)

1907 Cold all day and snow
Apr 2nd much very little. Finished
cleaning wheat once. Melville went
to Glens Falls forenoon and Oakdale
after. I cleaned all day, engine
not working well and needs some
overhauling. R.R. Smith here
with load and I could not
finish it for him.

30° in forenoon with wind at
20 m.p.h. It began to snow about
10:30 a.m. and continued until about
8 p.m. The drifts at the east
gate had been more than 10 ft.
I had enough time today
and I wired him until 15th hour at
\$30 per month, & went to eat dinner
now. Three hours & engine cleaned which
the second time nearly all day. New
fanning mill didn't work well
so took it back.

(10)

1907 A cold day and snow much very
light, it snowed about six inches
between yesterday and to-night. I went
to Glens Falls forenoon for J. McDonald
to come. He expected he did not come
until near night and I had a fire
burning, did some cleaning in evening.
R.R. Lindley here for awhile to
day.

30° Cold and wind about 10 m.p.h.
in forenoon and a big storm of snow
& wind at 10 a.m. and not stopped since.
But nothing so bad to go to bed late
as an asbestos paper and still got
through without being frozen today.
The 1st stage of the new coal bin was
carried up to R.R. Smith's & best helped
done. He is here now. Lots of snow
yet and no sign of spring.

1907 A dull day back warm sun
Up to 6 went a lot and easy they sloppy
I can't have off at noon back
been here 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ days. Got all stable
cleaned out today and I did
our mil. on 18. Vt. very, St. John's
house was.

" 8 A cool day and did not thaw
much. I sat in house all day
with pain in back, it came on me
yesterday like a flash and I have
been very sore since, I did intend
going to Gp. today but could not.
Errol had to do all chores. I will
try to go tomorrow if

" 9 I went to Art Ladd in town with
Sleigh & he had come back with
Lorree he is hired for 15th hr. at 30⁰⁰
per hr. J. Speers & I went to Gp. to try get
bank from Gov. for Mr. Ladd, got down at
7.50

1907 Mr. Speers & I seen Deputy Minister of
Agric Apr. at ten & got his promise of
\$100 towards building a hall, we
spent day looking at things around
City & came to Brandon on local
tonight reaching there at eleven.
Mr. Speers is to come up tomorrow.
Cold strong wind from east all fore-
noon & it subsided & stormed very
hard after, looks more like Dec.
than April

" 11th Came home from Brandon
on local this early. and got one of
Lavelle's teams to bring me home
wind blowing a hurricane from
west all day & snow falling,
very cold miserable day.
Briskman here armed while I was
away I will make my mind him

1907 A cold day wind with all
April day and snow thawed very
little! I ran crusher nearly all
day and found it as cold as
hands at any time in winter.

Walter Leard our man sick all
day. Errol & Dickman got
hay & few loads straw.

"13 A nice day with a slight breeze
from S.W. Got all stables cleaned
out forenoon & after boys went for
hay & straw & I went to Glens Falls
P. Arsenault sold some horses this
today. I took out sleigh Some
had buggies out. Water running
pretty free in down hill. Cecil
took Walter Leard out to Oak
Lake forenoon, he has touch
of appendicitis, cleaned us in
bad shape for sleep

1907 A cold day with all
April 18

it leaked air and
I went to pack it over again &
before one of the sleds & had to go
to Lake Lake again in evening
Errol & Dickman got
out all day. Wind north all day
and cold enough tonight for
I thought. Came home down from
mister's hill today through heat.
have not travelled that way since
road was made a long time now.
Not a cool day wind north all day
but not strong. Errol & Dickman
did chores all day, also washed up
did work outside. It got to be
dark outside so I went in &
closed up

1907 A dull day sun did not shine
Apr. 17 and it was pretty cold all
day & rain S.E. tried to run
out but had to back the fire up
twice but could not get it to go
so went to Bismarck & bought
a new one & some coal.

Wet & cold but still went to
work on the house & got
the roof up & the rest of the
house done & got the
chimney up & got the
chimney pipe up &

*18 Wind N.E. all day, and pretty
cold but soon found some
time to work in day, and

North all day did as cold as sun.
Snowed early all day did not have
to do chores in evening as our blackman
was sick with earache & head ache
Errol went to Oakdale afternoon for
way car & Melville Gold went
skiing today for 30°, etc.,
2 wife free for awhile tonight.
R.R. kindly got coal bag today

1907 Sun shone all day but it
was so cold all the time, Errol
did not have hay from after
noon to evening man with a horse
and a team of two mules which
we did not find, he did not
have a sled so we had to
haul his two men up on sleds
and we had to pull him

• 26 Cold enough for winter all
day today, Scanned furnace and
after cut up some pork and then
went to Grinnell had an over
coat and still was very cold
also snowed some and wind strong
from east all day

• 27 A cold day and snowed some. I
hired blackman at Carpenter today
for today at 30° per cu. Boys got hay. Cecil
went to Grinnell after dynamo but it was

1907 Henry Lefevre came today
Aptly for seedling at 30⁰⁰ per bu.
we also had a girl start also

to Griswold forenoon for
dynamos and came back nearly

banking & got load straw, Gerald
& Willie went up to W. Colton and
brought home bull, J. S. Little
came tonight and took home
three cows he bought

"A cold nice day the horses being
day we have done too. I
will clean the mill today. I am
lightening down my horses
the mules are all right.

1907 A very cold day and as
may 1st Cold and windy as a day
in here we also had a fall of snow.
I went to Griswold forenoon took
out 30 bushels of wheat and
afternoon I went to Oak Lake
and paid up a \$6 bill there. Indian
here tonight and got 22 bushels
of wheat. Mr. R. & Carey plowing
but no one else on land that
I see and has one downing altho
only 2 downed a little yesterday
I went to town to get some
clothes

A cold day and wind N.W.
I ran my horses after noon and
forenoon took separator apart
and cleaned it. Then painted
clipping horses and then put
formaline on wheat.

(21)

1907 A lovely warm day and about May 3, the first real spring day we have had, nearly every one in our land plowing. But we have hardly do start yet. We finished our work at 12 o'clock.

we got all wood loaded. I had to go to town to buy some flour.
14 It cold enough day and we had a couple of snow storms regular blizzards. Irishman made dinner from store bought meat. Henry & Henry & I say we got all ashes away from house and got all our snow drifts off yesterday. Mr. & Mrs. Smith 50 years married today and we were all there.
14 2 in all for dinner at six o'clock.

(22)

1907 A very cold day and ground frozen as May 6 had rain March some people at one end of the road say little damage I drew two loads timber for Mandan from our trees. Eddie helped me today. Black cow got into turnip field and it seems impossible to get her out. Irishman left this morning. Eddie took him to Uncle John's.
15 Cold all day and we had a couple of big snow storms. I made two trips to Coal Lake for lumber. Henry brought in lots from C. forenoon. Killed pony it got stiffled Black cow had by border when we got her out of turnip field so we had to kill her. Eddie took her up to Grand Colder for a walk. Having a little fun.

1907 A nice day but still not very
May 8 warm. Carroll took car out to
Clear forenoon and after he finished
plowing all our wheat land with
a walking plow. Henry & I fixed up
drill forenoon and the pot started
after noon drilling wheat or fallow
at Seven, that is the first seedling
we have done this year and
is the latest we've done in this
country.

* 9 Fingers very bare this morn. and
although some people sowed
after noon we did not go out
land at all. Carroll & Henry cleared
around forenoon and after they got
load by home then Henry went for
load of sand & Carroll did chores.
I went to Grinnell to get more
& had some trouble if you like

(241)

1907 A nice day but still not very
May 10 warm so they didn't do much
drill up & so did a bit to plant
beans & corn. I sat & read
newspaper, Henry then rade
out to clear land & he worked
on Seven. Carroll & I hored around
forenoon and after he sowed
at Seven with of course Carl
& then cleared to 1 mile
bank station very busy &
very things all around and 100
Little i to antennas, drawing and
soon as we had back into sugar
of the morning this evening with
one "man" getting out the car
very little work doing at 10 o'clock
Carroll came & said what happened
with his new mouth of house
or dock & worked all day, nearly all
fallen trees were down. Hattie & I went
to Bear Lake afternoon

(25)

1907 A very cold day. And men drew
May 13 home load of hay and covered
around generally & upstairs Henry
went to seven & finished filling
in saloon. He made a start in
gold mining in S.W. Gold Coal.
Borrowed a flat sled & after
borrowed & skinned following day so
got back & so wanted fresh hay.
Drew another load of hay down
and took my sled down to the

*14 A nice day and dry some.
This day I was up time cold
hay and men got in hand &
got pretty warm before night.
A few hours came out today and
made a start at Versailles
we got it all cemented under
floor, there are three of them
above.

1907 May 14 A very cold day
Drew another load of hay & men had
done. Henry & men were working at
Versailles & I cleaned off hay
Henry cleaned & did a little work
up to house roof and then at
Versailles cleaned off top with
brushes.

1907 May 15 A very cold day
Drew out of hay
Pulled out & down south after.
Men & me took a walk away
on day sled & we drew
flat of hay and went filled
out with some of finished
for field houses. That makes
10 acres of land in case after
some we get back to pack that
soil & this can be done & make
at Versailles.

1907 A cold day and very windy
May 17 Sun shone bright all day
but wind blew a hurricane.
Searched to Oak Lake forenoon &
Chore around after. Heavy drizzled
all day on Sod south of house.
Kernel harvested that field at
once today

"18 A cold day with wind strong
from N.W. & we had a few
glimpses of snow. I went to Oak
Lake forenoon and then on to
Kirksville afternoon and bought
some Scotchman from him.
There we got some elegant
siffler and found a man
& his wife had come from
Aspinwall & were staying
at Kirksville for a week but
we did not want them on
the home trip. Kernel borrowed
the car & I drove it Henry hunted

1907 Scotchman I bought to home
May 20, on Saturday night dislodged
fallen west of house today,
Henry finished seeding old par-
ture south of house. Henry
took auto to Springfield & his
wife to Oak Lake in evening.
Then in afternoon he took auto
down Elm tree and was home
before dark so I made a
little walk down the road.

Sept. 11th Mrs. Fred died in
her bed at home at 11 P.M. and
was buried at 10 A.M. on the 12th.

24 I went to Seven in day and finished
burning stubble afternoon. I worked
Mellville & Decotoman got in hay
and drew manure to garden & planted
a little rice sea. I also planted
green beans. Casper packed wood
all day. Henry raked
the sea in Seven.

25 It was very cold and the wind
got north and it is very cold.
Tonight playing cards. I came back home
now.

(29)

1907 A. nice day but cold
May 21 Henry & I ~~went~~ ^{had} to
work in ~~the~~ ^{the} field and
I had to go to town
to get a pony.

Carroll closed
on Laramie. I went to town and
tried to get a pony but could
not. I went to C. B. Littlewedge
town and got a pony from him
for me.

" " Very hot at times today
Rode horses raked stubble

1907 Cold all day. I burnt straw in

31 A cold windy day and
rained a little. Henry planned

1907 Very cold all day and rained
most of the time. In evening

Edmonton until Saturday. Tom & I

1907 Got home at
noon. Afternoon Tom packed
oat ground. Scotchman & I cleaned
seed oats & also cleaned some.
Had a small shower of rain fore-

13 Had a few showers of rain today
but very much fell back it will do

1907 Henry finished plowing for June 14 yesterday, oats west of house at noon and after he plowed east of house for more oats. Scotchman did a piece of plowing with scatting plow forenoon and then put in fence posts for lawn after. Errol drew back posts from fence while others plowed for oats.

" 5 A very hot & fine day, the only real spring day we have had this year and they are few. Henry drew straw off ground east of house. Errol plowed there forenoon & after he got home Ray took post in post & helped Errol with hay. I went to town this afternoon to get lumber & hardware. Then for oats looking for lumber for bed.

1907 A very windy day, blue sky June 6 - home from 3:00. Errol harrowed oats around west of house all day. Cecil plowed east of house for oats afternoon. Scotchman went to Mr. Phillips' for road they farmed & after he put in fence posts, I ran errands all afternoon, Maggie went to Ladies Aid today at Mrs. J. H. Grier's home, Mr. Anderson & family here during the day.

" 7 Cecil plowed for oats east of house forenoon & packed west of house after. Errol finished harrowing west of house forenoon & plowed after. Scotchman worked at fence all day. I worked reluctantly all afternoon. Mrs. Anderson here last night & left afternoon to day. A small wind from east all day.

1907 A cool day with 5.8.
June 8 and we had a few showers
of rain but not enough to
stop work. Melvinie, Bob & I
worked at fence making time
to pasture all day and fin-
ished it. Gerald plowed east
of house for oats and Paul
planted oats around west
of house & fence.

" 10 A hot forenoon and cool late, I
brought out nine pigs to Cat Lake
sold at 17¢ per pound. Gerald
finished plowing for oats early
and also finished plowing all
the oat ground tonight. Bob &
I worked at fence after noon, we
had a good shower of rain
afternoon more fell & in any
time yet and things look more
promising.

(38)

1907 A very hot day with a
June 11th slight breeze from N.E.
& also due north all time. Paul
seeded oats all day east of house
Bob & I worked at fence
until two o'clock when we
finished it, he eat raspberries
in garden up to 4:50 p.m. I
went to M.C. hospital
July 1st On June 12th I went to Grunpys
to go into St. Boniface then for the pur-
pose of having caesarean re-
moved from right leg went into St
Boniface Hospital on 13th & had
operation on 15th it was suc-
cessful had to lay quietly in bed
until Monday 17th when stitches
were taken out of leg and on Satur-
day from 18th the lame bone was
found everything all right.

1907 A lovely day weather too hot on July 1st cold, we stayed in house only, hay, ice, house. Today went out & had late today to 1st my celebration, had a bad day. Wee was sick of course, and a big crowd of people, we got home at 4:30.
