1909 A fearful hot day  
Aug 20<sup>th</sup> both binders cut on  
Seven and finished the 30  
acres near as heat. Errol  
and Alex stooked on five  
and got it all stooked up  
very hot and hard to fit  
to work. We have only a little  
piece of barley fit to cut  
now and I am sending a  
binder to me for CC to  
borrow.

" 21 A nice forenoon but then  
a hurricane afternoon, Errol  
and Alex stooked on Seven forenoon  
after Alex went to Oak Lake and  
Cecil Errol fixed at separator.  
Melville cut a little barley fore-  
noon and helped Errol after.  
Cecil cut for him in day on  
Seven teen.

1909 A very hot day at times but in  
Aug 23 afternoon it blew very hard.  
Timbered stocked all wheat crop and  
also stocked up some barley we had  
cut. I went to Oak Lake forenoon  
and got repairs for binder. Errol  
worked at separator afternoon  
Melville cut some corn and got it  
in. Cecil helped Alex to stook.  
I had sore eye and headache  
and did nothing afternoon

" 24 A nice cool day both binders  
worked in wheat on Seven until  
eleven when Melville broke  
recorder. I went to Oak Lake after  
and got a new Ruster then binder  
worked well. CC Carmick worked  
good until evening and I will have  
to go to Oak Lake in morn. for repair  
for it. Got threshing machine fixed  
up and started today, it works all  
right and we threshed a little wheat

1909 A very fine day, Maggie  
Aly 25 and I went to Oak Park  
forenoon took out binder & an  
and fine and a half basket  
of wheat we threshed yesterday  
got 90¢ per bushel for it.

I took out after noon and  
both binders out the 26<sup>th</sup>  
Cornfield was idle forenoon.  
Youngs children here for  
dinner. Finished wheat and  
got two rounds each on  
barley

" 26 A fearful hot day and after-  
noon it blew a hurricane. No one  
could cut and we all were idle.  
Cut with both binders forenoon  
and chased around after. I was  
sick afternoon. Carroll threshed for  
H.V. Young south of river all day.  
Made 386 bushels

1909 A fine day Cecil and I had  
Aly 27 Cut in barley and Alex fin-  
ished threshing up all wheat cut  
then washed at barley. Ralph  
and I went to Giswold afternoon  
called in to see machine working on  
Youngs farm south of river  
it is running well.

" 28 Carroll finished threshing at  
Youngs at noon & machine was  
broke at the violent storm. Went  
to H.V. Youngs at noon and got  
man a Gallician to help. Took  
he, Carroll & Alex worked in barley  
after noon and finished threshing it.  
Giswold got it all out and also  
Cut a piece of wheat we had  
left on Seven, wheat is all out  
now. Cecil cut in oats all day  
and I got some of them threshed  
up. Cold all day and feel like  
frost today

1909 A fine cool day Mypie & I  
Aug 30 went to Oak Lake forenoon  
& waited until train came from  
west for casting for hoppers, but  
house three men that came up  
from Toronto had our dinner at  
Alex Thompson. Errol threshing  
at Alex Thompsons H.P.s all  
day machine did not do very  
well wants some more fixing up  
and engine does not govern  
right. Cecil & McMillan cut  
oats all day west of house  
and finished them. McMillan's  
header broke just before oats  
were done the knotted frame  
broke that makes them this  
year. Alex & Gallatin threshed  
wheat & oats all day finished  
the wheat. I hiked a mile to-  
day for a month for \$50.00

1909 A lovely day not too hot  
Aug 31 Finished cutting all oats  
today and that winds us up.  
Errol tried come in evening but  
it would not work so we are  
going to turn the cattle into it.  
Errol cut oats forenoon and  
Cecil finished it afternoon  
We began to thresh at noon in  
yard and made 322 bushels  
Sent one load out to Oak  
Lake.

Sept 1<sup>st</sup> Threshed in yard all day at  
wheat got along fairly well and  
hauled up wheat from back-  
setting near Carpenter's made 479  
bushels today we can keep thresh-  
ing going. Sent three loads out to  
Oak Lake and sold two of  
them at 86% per bushel.  
Very hot and fine weather  
for threshing.

1909 Threshed in yard all day  
Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> and got along well here  
about 1390 bushels done  
now. made 593 today. a  
lovely day and no wind  
almost too hot.

" 3 Threshed at Carpenters  
until five o'clock when we  
had to stop as it rained a  
little and got so tough we had  
to stop as it scrapped around  
Cylinders, the rain did not seem  
to bother steamers but our cylinder  
is too light. Maggie went to Oak  
Lake for a walk

" 4 A fine day and not too  
hot, boys threshed at Carpenters  
all day. I stayed at home fore-  
noon and fixed up Ag Society  
books all afternoon. Ralph and  
I went to Oak Lake.

1909 A lovely day not too hot threshed  
Sept 6 at Carpenters all day and  
got along well but did not turn  
out as many bushels as we  
expected, straw very long and  
tough forenoon

" 7 Threshed at Carpenter all  
day finished his wheat on  
fallow and threshed him some  
barley oats & corn. A very  
windy forenoon and nearly  
impossible to do any they

" 8 Wrote machine home last  
night and threshed in the  
forty acre rod piece all day  
made him some barley forenoon  
and we only made 1400 bushels  
but got at good afternoon and  
made 142 bushels in all  
today. Wind east forenoon and  
very little rain but none came  
I went to Oak Lake in buggy afternoon.

1909 A fine day wind N.W.  
Sept 9 we finished threshing 45 acres  
of sod at home at noon also did  
a few oats then went to Senat  
and made some 370 bush in afternoon,  
got five loads out to Oak  
Lake was home running well and  
we are making good time.

" 10 A fine day but pretty hot  
all day and very windy after.  
We threshed a few hours  
but had a lot of trouble with  
sugars running away so shut  
down and I went to Brandon for  
repairs got all we required and  
came home on evening train. got  
out big loads wheat today also  
got thistles cleaned. Maggie went  
to her mother's forenoon

1909 A very hot day as hot as  
Sept 11 any time in July, we put repairs  
on engine this day, and did not  
get going until nine o'clock  
finished the field near school  
on Senat and moved to far piece  
of wheat and got along well there  
also got four loads out to Oak  
Lake today.

" 13 Rained some yesterday so we  
could not thresh any ~~wheat~~  
today, in fact it rained a  
few showers today also. Melville  
backset afternoon with  
five horses. Alex disced with  
four more, got yard cleaned up  
and cracked around. Melville  
shot some ducks. H. W. Gandy  
threshing stacks at Dr. R.  
afternoon and went to town  
11:00 ~~noon~~ 1:00

1909 Blew hard from N.E. all Sept 14 day. Got out six loads wheat today and have run 1400 and now and will ship it tomorrow. Went to Oak Lake in day in hurry and ordered car for wheat and did the business there. Began to thresh at noon and ran very steady until night, wheat a little tough and hard to thresh.

" 15 A dull dark day and a few drops of rain fell but nothing much but it made threshing & tough. Went to Oak Lake in day and shipped a car of wheat 1449 bushels to Rainy River Grain Co of W.F. Lingle. Threshed wheat in sun all day and left about ten loads of shear to do morning to Carpenter tomorrow

1909 A fine day and we threshed Sept 16 at Carpenter's all day, his grain not turning out very well I went to Oak Lake to get him some when we stopped.

" 17 Very windy all day a regular hurricane big machines all quit threshing in afternoon but we kept going right along at J. Carpenter's and made 413 bushels, a lot of his grain was not well bound and wasted but he did not want to stop.

" 18 Went to Oak Lake forenoon and chores around after, and did not go to machine at all they threshed all day at Carpenter had a few showers of rain but not enough to stop them although all big machine stopped in afternoon. So far we've

1909 A fine day but looks like  
Sept 20 rain some and we had a little  
threshed at Carpinter's all day  
as usual made a poor thresh-  
ing but did well after. Have  
nearly all his wheat in east field  
done and went machine to his  
house tonight. Broke one of the  
kickers in deck and I went to  
Oak Lake at dark and it is  
fixed brought home man from  
Brandon to put on kicker  
21 Had a good shower of  
rain last night and this morn,  
we took feeder over to Carpinter's  
and put it on separator  
but only threshed a load with  
it and then took it off and  
fed by hand again only made  
13 bushels however, I had to  
take express to Oak Lake  
after and he went to Brandon

1909 A fine day. Threshed at  
Carpinter's all day a  
heavy frost and it were tough  
until noon. Finished his wheat  
at eleven and began at barley  
made bushels in all to-  
day  
22 Drove to John Kline, G. Gumpf  
and myself went to Kenton to-  
day to see gasoline engines  
and saw two Allis-Chalmers, Gay  
lois at work, they are doing  
good work and lots of it, also  
saw a Case out fit but it  
was done threshing. Frosty this  
morn. and wind cold all the  
way up from north but  
pleasant coming home. Gaps  
finished Carpinter's barley  
at half 12 o'clock and worked  
at oats after

1909 A fine day we threshed  
Sept 27 at Carpenters all day and  
finished him up of everything  
and moved home. A very hot  
day and we made over 800  
bushels

" 28 Threshed all day in pig yard  
at oats and made over 1150  
bushels the most bushels we  
have threshed in any one day.  
It was very windy from south  
H.W. Gray at Keno City had to  
stop down for wind slack up  
Kept at it another two hours  
would have finished our oats

" 29 We did not thresh today, but  
all of us went up to Kento to see  
machines work, had dinner at  
Kento and seen all the machines  
we could go up and come  
down. Very hot all day

(16)

1909 A very hot day and a very  
Sept 28 little breeze from east  
Heavy dew this morn. finished our  
oats in yard and then went to  
Seven and threshed barley made  
600 bushels in all.

" 29 Heavy fog and dew all  
forenoon nearly as bad as  
rain, we threshed barley in  
Seven but had a job  
to get along it was so wet  
afternoon it dried up and  
went well and we finished  
threshing the barley. I took  
a man to Oak Lake and  
he went west to Calgary  
he has been a man to  
with us.

" 30 Finished threshing everything to-  
day at 2:30 and fixed up machine  
after and turned machine to his  
partner tonight. My brother came, last

1909. fog and kept that way until  
we were thru high wheat that  
grew a stubble and we never  
made poorer time, got very  
windy & dry afternoon and  
P. R. and A. H. Harvey lost  
his separator left fire

Oct 1<sup>st</sup> Went to Mr. Bowmers this morn.  
to thresh W. R.'s grain came over to  
help and scaven home and placed  
at back setting with five horses  
Cecil disced all day with four  
horses and four men were with  
machine made over seven hun-  
dred bushels of barley today.  
A hot day.

" 2<sup>nd</sup> Cecil disced until noon &  
I plowed then afternoon Maggie,  
Grace, Cecil & I went to Oak  
Lane a hot day. Machine thresh-  
ed barley at Bowmers all day

(19)

1909 A lovely warm day. I went to  
Oak Lane in morn. and after  
Cut this tho & got in a load  
of oat sheaves. Days threshed  
at Mr. Bowmers all day. Maggie  
walked up to Ryerson Church  
tonight to hear Superintendent  
of All Peoples Mission from  
W. P. G. speak. Very dark to-  
night and feels like rain  
" 4<sup>th</sup> All fearfull hot day. I threshed  
at Mr. Bowmers all day and  
only had half <sup>done</sup> day to finish  
when something broke on engine  
and I will have to go to Brandon  
for repairs. I was working there  
myself all day as I could  
not get any one to take  
my place

(20)

1909 A very hot day again, Alex Oct 6 got up a few potatoes, Carol plowed. Melville went to Oak Lake forenoon and hauled home barrel of gasoline. I went to Brandon for repairs for engine. Cecil started to school to Griswold today

" " Alex and Carol went to the Farmers today and fixed up engine and finished his threshing Melville took mother and to Oak Lake where she and baby took train for Wapella. I have had cold and sat in most of day

" 8 A fine day got engine into place and crushed some three loads for other people. Carol took out load wheat for H.V. Young. I sat in house all day not very well

(21)

1909 A good frost this morn. we Oct 9 had four drills of potatoe plowed up and not picked and they were frozen. Carol finished back setting forenoon and plowed stubble. The larvae of May in south so on each quarter Melville finished discing fallow at noon and harrowed back setting after. Alex & I crushed forenoon tried sawing after but could not do much at it, so chores around afternoon

" 11 A very cold day, began blowing from north west yesterday. Cold to day, fearful cold, a little snow coming down every little while. Got home full green oats forenoon, & got them steamed at stable door. Carol went to Oak Lake afternoon for coal, home in store today. Melville harvested. Hippie came from Wapella

1909 A very cold day, saw some snow Oct 12 like real winter. Melville finished harrowing back setting at noon and after he helped Carroll plow on south end eighty acres. Alex chores around Maggie, baby and I went up to J.S. Little's afternoon, Mr & Mrs Smith there. I went north all day and we did not touch potatoes. 13 Blue had from north all day and kept very cold. Alex and I cooked some forenoon, had nearly as much trouble to start engine as in winter, Carroll and Melville to come until noon then we all got at potatoes and got up eight hours nearly half of them are frozen and we have to throw them out.

1909 Another cold day and we had Oct 14 some snow today and weather is a little warmer tonight. Cecil & Melville plowed forenoon and picked potatoes at ten, Alex and I did some cleaning forenoon. I took Maggie <sup>to Keweenaw</sup> out to Oak Lake forenoon and she went to H. G. She has been with us 13 months. D. Rydell came here tonight and his horses in our stable, he is moving to Marcella to thresh. " 15 A cold day but no much frosty plowed up four drills potatoes in hay, Alex, Cecil & I packed them forenoon, at noon Alex & I cooked two loads of soap for W. Canning & J.S. Little, we packed four more drills afternoon only three more drills to get in. Alex plowed all day. Went to Laramie meeting tonight.

1909 A nice day but still pretty cold. Errol did some plowing with walking plow forenoon and Melville was out shooting chickens as I had the place points away getting them & hopped, I went to Oak Lake forenoon took out five empty barrels and shipped to Canadian Oil Co. Alex finished potatoes forenoon as we have about 60 bushels in all. Sun did not shine much and it feels like autumn.

" 18 A lovely day. Errol plowed all day, Alex & I crushed nearly all day. I went to town in evening and bought some straw. We crushed six loads today

" 19 A cold day Alex plowed until noon and then hauled manure. Errol plowed all

1909 Day. Maggie & I went to parsonage tonight where there was quite a few and had a pleasant time, got home nice last

Oct 20 A dull day and wind east, I went to Oak Lake after noon. Alex & Errol plowed forenoon and Errol alone after, Alex hauled manure. Raining a little tonight as we go to bed

" 21 Very dull all day and we had both snow & rain rained a little though the night also but not very much fell in all. Alex & Errol plowed all day & Errol broke his plow bar right. He hored around all day. Got on some straw & such

1909 Errol disced on seven all  
Oct 22 day. Alex plowed until noon  
then banked house. Schooled  
around forenoon & went to Oak  
Lake after took sick & was  
plow to get points in it.

Or cold rain forenoon and  
afternoon it snowed nearly  
all the time but very little  
lay on ground as it thawed  
readily as fast as it fell. Some  
snow on ground tonight  
though.

" 23 Snow all day and noon  
and roads pretty muddy.  
I went to Oak Lake fore-  
noon and got pipes fixed for  
the they were water pump on  
engine got home at four and  
got it on. Alex finished bank  
in house. Errol disced on  
seven

(27)

1909 Cold today, Alex disced  
Oct 25 on seven noon and Cecil  
took his place a few hours. Errol  
plowed all day. Alex ran  
crusader & tractor & only did  
a little. Alex & Errol went to

Hay Creek some & I went out  
to Haynes Missionary meeting.

" 26 A fine day but froze very  
hard in night and did not thaw  
much all day. Errol plowed  
all day and Alex disced on  
seven.

" 27 Cold again today, but got warmer  
towards evening. Errol  
plowed all day. Alex did not  
disc any as I thought it  
was not thawed. He put in  
posts at yard and also across  
slope in field. I hauled &  
measured wheat bin for H.C.  
today. George, Cecil & I went to Baugabla  
tonight

(28)

1909 Very frosty this morn. but  
(Oct 28<sup>th</sup>) Errol was able to plow his  
Kept at it all day. Alex went to  
Seven to disc - but could not  
work at the wheat land, had  
to work at barley ground until  
now. He hove around all day  
Pretty windy often South  
and East

" 29 A fine day not cold, Errol  
finished plowing the 80 acres  
of stubble on east quarter of  
field, he then went to Seven for  
load of wheat and will take  
it to Oak Lake tomorrow. Alex  
disc'd on Seven all day. We  
all only Errol went to school  
tonight to a social there  
and had a fine time

(29)

1909 A lovely warm day. Alex  
Oct 30 disc'd on Seven all day  
no frost this morn. Errol took  
two loads wheat from Seven  
to Oak Lake and sold at 87<sup>c</sup>  
Cecil took out load ~~forenoon~~  
also. I went to Seven afternoon  
and burnt grass then fore-  
noon or prime same as Seven  
Nov 1<sup>st</sup> A lovely day. Wind south and  
sun shone nearly all day, at times  
very hot but when sun did not  
shine it was cold. Alex took  
load wheat to Oak Lake forenoon  
and after he and I crushed.  
I went to Oak Lake in buggy  
forenoon. Errol disc'd on Seven  
all day. I made last payment  
on three in machine today \$188<sup>35</sup>  
thank goodness it is paid at last  
if we could only hold what we get  
we would be rich

(30)

1909 Not very warm but a  
bit cool wind blew hard from south  
and as far as the 10 o'clock it  
was fine but it did not blow  
much and weather was pretty  
warm. Alex disced all day. Errol  
& I went up to St. Ignatius and  
Sara his wife & myself left soon  
Errol took load wheat to Oak  
Lake.

"3 A lovely warm day as hot as  
July at times. Errol and Alex  
along with G.P. & N.R. Smith  
wheeled to Lake to fish today &  
only caught a few. Maggie  
went to Ladies Aid at St. S.  
Litter today then she came  
to prayer meeting at night.  
John Donald here while  
long to day. He hoed around  
all day

(31)

1909 A lovely warm day Alex disced on  
Nov 4 Seven all day. Errol took out  
two loads wheat to Oak Lake.  
I went to Oak Lake afternoon to  
attend Quarterly official Board  
of the Methodist Church, it became  
dark and then had 2 horses  
to do. As warm as July today  
and I did not put on overcoat  
today

"5 A fine clear day but  
wind blew pretty strong from  
east all day. Errol took two  
loads out to Oak Lake. Alex  
disced all day. He hoed around  
Ceil and I went to St. David's  
Church to hear Mr. Salter  
tonight

"6 Alex disced until noon then he  
crashed. Errol took load wheat to  
Oak Lake forenoon & hot, prairie have  
been warm after. A fine day but cold

(32)

- 1909 A cold day wind south  
blow all day but very cold although  
sun where warm but wind  
was cold. Errol and Alex  
hauled stones from yard out to  
road south of Elkhorn,  
until noon then Errol hauled  
out as he and Alex finished  
digging a heat ground on  
Sewer and boat home dice.  
Drove to Oak Lake afternoon  
got a few fence posts,  
barrel of apples & brought  
home on fancy place.
- 9 A fine day. Alex put in some  
posts on Sewer across slough  
Errol worked all day hauling  
it & heat dice to road across  
slough
- 10 Drove to Oak Lake forenoon  
and brought home some picket

- 1909 for fence also barrel of apples  
and barrel of gasoline. Errol  
went out afternoon & hauled some  
fence posts & of all coal.  
Not a cold day but wind east  
in day, and north tonight started  
to rain a little still at it  
as we go to bed only not heavy  
feels like snow. Alex worked at  
road across & dug all day  
Nov 11 Three inches of snow - on ground  
when we got up, very cold and insi-  
nable although snow was soft  
and wet our feet, this snow  
came about a month too soon.  
Alex & Errol hauled out earth  
to grade on road today, got it  
all out and also some stones  
I went to J. S. Littles after-  
noon and bought two teams  
from him for \$32.00

1909 A very cold day very  
bor 12. frosty although there was  
very little wind and sun shone  
most of the time. Ed & I went  
to Oak Lake forenoon and  
got coal & hard coal for self  
feeder stove. We graded in  
road across slough afternoon  
we planned down there for  
him, and it was frozen  
hard about two inches deep.  
Alex went up to J. S. Little's  
for the two steers I bought  
yesterday. Melville got  
home from Buffalo today  
where he has been this day.  
Looks today as if winter  
would stay and winter has  
set in I guess, a bit  
too early.

(35)

1909 A cold day and did not thaw  
till 13 day. Melville & I went to Oak  
Lake in morn. and afternoon I  
had to go back as one leg of  
fence had just broken. Ed worked  
at first dry road all day, got  
into snow about three inches.  
J. S. Little came with chop  
and had to leave it as we  
could not work engine.  
14 Below zero in Oak Lake  
this morn.

"15 A cold day wind S.E. at times  
got warmer afterwards evening. I settled  
with Alex this morn. He has been  
here over a year and a half, I took  
him over to J. H. Donalds - he is hired  
there for winter. Bay & I got out his  
gray today we chores around about  
Bally & Gracie went to Banquet  
in St. David's Church tonight

(36)

1909 A fine day but cold chas  
Nov 16 and pleasant though. Boys  
and I worked at crushing & got  
of little chop finished also  
some for candles. Went to  
Oak Lake afternoon and stayed  
to attend a meeting of Layman  
Missionary movement, got home  
after eleven. Melville took  
up J. Little's chop afternoon  
and boat home D. Smith's rain.  
Carroll got load of straw

from Simeon

" 17 A fine day but pretty  
cold Carroll & Melville cleaned  
out calf pen forenoon & hauled  
out manure with sphaer after  
noon & I went up to Grandpa's  
and had tea there & got  
two roses too. Cloudy & feels like  
snow all the time.

(37)

1909 A fine day but so cold  
Nov 18 as we have had did not  
thaw any, but was a lot  
warmer. Boys did chores fore  
noon and went to Seven for  
load of barley straw. After  
noon crushed some for candles  
then I drove for G. Stevens  
and one for J. S. Little. I went  
to a church trustee meeting at  
J. S. Keene's afternoon

" 19 A fine day mostly but was  
cold but got colder towards night  
Boys got out some loads of manure  
I went to business afternoon.

Had Temperance meeting tonight  
and two joined

" 20 A cold day but pleasant. Carroll  
hauled manure. Maggie & Cecil went  
to Oak Lake forenoon. Mr. Colton  
here and renewed insurance

1909 Wind east all day cold  
Nov 22 & blustering snowed nearly  
all day. I worked in house  
most of time also picked  
some potatoes in cellar.  
Boys did chores out side. A  
cold night as we go to bed  
"K.C. & wife left to day for  
Wyo. as there was to Rock-  
ester Minn.

"23 Blowing & snowing when  
we got up wind still east  
and kept it up until after  
noon but as we go to bed  
wind has gone down and  
it is not cold. good sleighing  
now and it is very early.

Paul did not go to Giswold  
today he will go on Monday  
to board there. Boys gone up to  
K.C. tonight.

(39)

1909 A dull day foggy & not  
very cold. Howard Cecil and to  
Giswold forenoon he stays  
there to go to school and boards  
at home he & his brother ~~had~~  
Cyril took Melville out to Carr  
Lake afternoon and he went up to  
Videll to go to school there, Paul  
got some salt & coal and bought some  
load of coal. Soft all day and  
Snow did not shine. Wind in  
N.W. tonight and same colder  
"24 A nice forenoon and not cold  
wind N.W. but as soon wind got  
east and blew that way all  
afternoon and at dark began to  
snow and as we go to bed it is  
blowing a regular blizzard.  
Came hard all afternoon and until  
after dark. Very hard weather for  
this time of year

1909 A fine day and not very  
nor so cold. The blizzard that  
was blowing last night as we  
were told was calm this  
morn. Carol & I were until  
noon. Then I took Maggie over  
to H. R's. Then went on to Gis-  
mold and took Cecil home  
from Gismold, he is boarding  
there at Mr. McIntosh's. Maggie  
is staying all night at H. R's.  
Grace, Cecil & I went up to  
Social in Reformation Church  
tonight and had a fine time

"27 A. fine day but not very cold  
Maggie stayed at H. R's, last  
night and came home forenoon  
went to Oak Lake afternoon and  
did not get home again until after  
night. I bought a binder at  
Auction Sale there today
