1903 A cool pleasant day
Mar 16 Was at Worcester all day
and saw about thirty people
great interest being taken in
Canada and a lot coming
and I took train at 7:00
and came to Birmingham
Mr Mitchell met me at
New Chicken's Hotel and
gave me letter he had
for me from home, it was
written on the 20th Feb.
and only reached me now
I am glad now that I stuck
out and made Mr. Preston
give me ticket as a lot
of the men are coming home
and I won't be alone.

1903 Left Birmingham at 8.45 for
Mary Newport Papnells changed car at
Rugby and am now sitting here waiting
for train to start. Reached Croxson at
10.38 and left at 10.42 for New-
port Papnells reached there at 11.15
and walked out to Sherringtons
and am here now writing this in
the billage where father was
born. I have been to see the
old church, where Grand
father & Mother Smith were
married and also where father
was baptized. Looked up the
old register but could not
find any record of their mar-
riage nor the baptism of any
of the children. Got to Reading at
8 o'clock and took cab for West-
minster Hotel where I met Mr.

1903 Leacock and he showed me around Parliament Buildings & Trafalgar square & all the Government offices. It is all very grand and I could not begin to describe it here. Mar 18 I went to London Bridge Station this morn. and met A. J. Whiting and we put in the day around city and it was a big day and I am pretty tired tonight, I won't attempt a description of all I saw but will tell briefly if possible at home.

Mar 19 Left London this morn. at 8:30 for Liverpool had to change cars at Crewe and reached Liverpool at 2:00 took Cab and went to see Mrs Jury at

1903 Gov. office he said my passage was on boat so I did a little shopping and then came to docks, where I met five other of the delegates going home, we got on to the Bannerman by taking a tug and set sail about five it was very windy, I am in room 16 with Mr Cowan from Pilot Ground and Mr Gahan from Dalden, we have a fine boat and about two thousand passengers all told soon as we had tea I went to my room and stayed there and turned into bed at ten as I felt a little squeamish lots of the passengers sick and boat rolling a good deal

1903 A good dead Calmer this
Even 30 morning and when we got
up we were in sight of both
Scotland and Ireland, we are
going by the North Coast of
Ireland this time we came by
the South Shore coming, It is
now early and we expect to
be at Inverlona soon to take our
mail that is near Londonderry
Arrived at Inverlona 10.10 and we
are now anchored waiting on the
mail, Inverlona is just a small
village, but all along the coast
is houses and ~~that~~ ~~you~~ would
think it was almost a con-
tinuous village, we are close
in shore about a quarter of
a mile the County here is
Donegal, I would like to

1903 Get some word to Mrs Edward
Armstrong but there is no chance.
There seems to be a high hill like
a mountain running along the
shore about a mile in land
and between shore and it
the land is all cultivated.
Left Inverlona at 2.00 P.M. and
started for Canada and now
we can say we are homeward
bound in earnest. Pretty rough
I did not go in to dinner tonight
not very sick but do not
feel like eating
March 11 Slew a hurricane all day
today and ship rolled a good deal
nearly every one sick I eat a small
breakfast and spent balance of
day in bed and had steward bring
me something to eat made 274
miles today

1903 Sunday There was Service
Jan 22 advertised for 10.30 this
morn. but not enough people
on foot to attend so they can-
celled it, still blowing pretty
hard and very few at breakfast
and we had a slight snow
storm this morn. but now
it is better and sun is shining
a little wind dead ahead.
I feel better today and eat
some breakfast it is now
11.00. I kept on foot all day and
went to table the three meals but
did not feel any too well vessel
rolled a good deal and wind
dead. 242 miles today.

Jan 23 Blew hard until noon and
then got calm until near eight
when it got rough again. nearly

1903 everyone around today and
we made 324 miles but blowing
hard and rolling a lot as we go
to bed

Jan 24 Blew hard all day today and
also rained some, I felt splendid
when I got up but the steady
rolling all day upset me quite
a lot and don't feel nearly
so well tonight, find the
time very long and wish
voyage was over. Canes came
up to Cabin windows, ^{to} day.
Vessel made 316 miles ^{from}
yesterday noon until today
noon, and at this rate we
ought to be in to Halifax
on Saturday something.

1903 Sea as calm as a lake
March 25 today not a ripple and
vessel going well every body
all right and up at all the
meals. Saw a sailing vessel going
east today.

No Calm when we got up
but we ran into a swell early
wind also freshened and
vessel rolling a good deal, we
met an Allan vessel going
east this forenoon, also saw
two icebergs east of us, Raining
and dull with some fog
hope it dont get any thicker
or we will have to slow
down. Had a concert in dining
saloon tonight and had some
very good songs. Saw some vessels
today

1903 Two vessels in sight this morn.
March 27 when we got up both going
same direction as ourselves, one of
them the Canada that left
Liverpool a couple of hours
ahead of us, a lovely morning
and very one out on deck,
Mr Brown took a Snap photo
of the Canadian delegates this
morning and afterwards a
couple of Snaps at groups of
passengers. It has been a lovely
day a good stiff breeze from S.W.
but sun shining bright and clear
every one around all day and no
one sick. Saw two vessels this
morning and passed one this after-
noon going same way as we
were. We ought to be in
Halifax tomorrow afternoon

1903 A lovely day cold but
Mar 28 Clear and sun shone bright
all day. We reached Halifax
at 2 P.M. and were quite awhile
getting off, found a telegram
here ~~waiting~~ on us to come on
from Halifax instead of
going to St John on boat
we are now in Halifax waiting
for ^{train} boat for Montreal and
don't expect to get away from
here until about nine tonight.
Cold but lovely. Got into a sleeper
at Halifax at 8 P.M. and are
now waiting to start for Montreal.
Great Confusion here as there
has been three vessels unloaded
here today, and all had to put
of passengers, we had sixteen
ourselves

1903 Left Halifax last night at
Mar 29 clear, Casan and I left to-
gether road pretty rough and did
not sleep much, a very heavy train
on and we ran very slowly and
have lots of stops. Snowing when we
left last night and nearly an inch
on the ground this morning, at this
rate of going it will take a long
time to get to Montreal, we are stuck
now some where in the woods at
6.40 A.M. Reached St John at 1.40
P.M. have been running well this
last couple of hours a very nice
country along a river but I can't
see how so many people live, as
it is thickly settled along the valley
of the river and mountains on each
side

1903 A lovely day sun clear and
Mar 30 bright. Made a very poor run last
night expected to be in Montreal at
eight this morning but it is now
twelve and we are still forty miles
from Montreal, the engine is dying
every little piece along and we
have to stop and fix up. The
joke is gone out of this trip
now and we are all sick of
it. Left Montreal at 4 P.M. and
reached Ottawa at 7 went to
Joe Chop and found that Maggie
was still in hospital so went up
street and had a lunch then
came back to his house & found
her in, where we went to see
her at hospital, she is getting
better. A very early spring here
saw people plowing near Montreal

1903 Stayed in Ottawa all day
Mar 31 went to see Maggie fore and
afternoon in hospital she is better
and goes home tomorrow. I went
to train today and saw the man
that had been left in Montreal
I also saw Angus Leitch he was
leaving for Carl Lake today
also. My valise has not
arrived yet. Jim and I went
to the House of Commons tonight
and stayed until 12 o'clock.
A very nice day not at all cold
April 1 Br. C. is 41 today. I left Ottawa
at 8.25 this morning and got to
Graham Bay at 8.40 and then
walked up to Almas two miles
from there found them all
well and expecting me. Weather
lovely and warm and found
dug up fast

1903 A nice day but we had a April 2 big storm at night, thunder lightning & rain, it poured for quite a while. Warm all day John Lawry and his wife here at Alma's for dinner. My Calise came from Ottawa on the stage today.

" 3 J. Armstrong brought Alma and I to station at Graham at 4:30 and we took the train for Carp at 5 o'clock where Lou met us and but us home, found mother with a bad cold and coughing very badly. Had a big storm last night thunder and lightning rained very heavy also and tonight as we go to bed it is snowing very heavily.

1903 A clear bright day with April 4 wind from west and a little cold but the sun clear and bright, snow went a little. I went to Mrs Oliver afternoon and tonight Jim Armstrong was here for a while to see me. Mrs Wilson here to see me afternoon but I was at Oliver.

" 5 Sunday today, A nice day but very muddy. Tom took me in cart to Dave Kennedy then to Mrs Wilton and after to Jim Armstrong. Mr Hanlon & J. O'Connell in to see me tonight.

" 6 A nice warm day I walked up in morning to see Mrs Hanlon on L. Caranagh's place afternoon Tom took me to Mrs Johnston and then to Edwards

1903 we then came home and at night the two Armstrong girls and Irwin came down to see us and we had a pleasant time.

Apr 7 Lou & I went to Camp this morning and took train for Ottawa, Lou came down to see about his eye and went back in afternoon I stayed in Ottawa all day and visited with Maggie also see J. B. Kloeb today very warm and pleasant
" 8 Stayed with Maggie forenoon and afternoon went to see Arundel Holmer then Willie Armstrong, he was not at home but his wife was. I then went to see J. B. Kloeb

1903 at Sherbrooke Home but he was not at home so I took the train train car for Aylmer and reached there before six, and was surprised to meet there Harold and George Kloeb I have not seen them for twenty years, also saw Maggie Kloeb and had a pleasant time

Apr 9 A lovely warm day. Dr. R. H. Kloeb came down from Shawville with his wife and family, and I saw him for first time in twenty years. He went to Ottawa and came back to his father for tea. I had dinner at Dr. Chuscho today and also saw Alony

1903 Klock today. Came down to Maggie's in Ottawa tonight and found Willie Armstrong here. It was a very nice warm, calm day, Klock and I went to park west of Bytown after dinner. Also Sam Fred Klock today.

Apr 10 Went to see Mrs McCallan in Eddyville this morning and on way back called to see Suburban Kenny in Lindsay's store then to see Henry Rooney but he was not in. Came on to Maggie where David McElroy came to see me. Maggie & I had dinner before twelve and I started for Centum station but found train an hour late so went back to Maggie's and stayed there the hour and then went to station

1903 again, Jim McElroy came with me and we had to wait about twenty minutes before train came in, Jim came on to Union station with me and I got away from there at 2:30 over an hour late. Met Alex McElroy at Amprison and saw quite a few teams at work in fields

Apr 11 Did not see any snow until we got to Mattawa and there was lots from that until we got to near White-mountain from there to Kinnispy there was none. Made up time today and got along well

12 Although we left Ottawa nearly two hours behind we were at Portage today on time but lost some time between there and Kinnispy. Lovely and warm all day and land

Seems to be drying fast.
Reached Wiminigy at 1.30 and
did not leave until 6.30 we should
have ~~been~~^{left} there at 6.05. Reached
Briswood at 1.30 Sunday morning
I met me there and brot. me
home. They have started to plow
