1913 Alf. went to road this
July 10th morn. but only worked
an hour when it began
to rain and kept it up
all day, not very heavy
but a lot much have
fallen. Alma Armstrong
here. We sat in house
then fixed some at stable
11 Errol went to roads to-
day, Alf. began to run cul-
tivate in potatoes and
Pitcher ched thistle
in flax. I went to Oak
Lake forenoon to get saw
fixed up afternoon
we got all the wood we
have home saved. Had
a few good showers
of rain and had to
stop work at times

1913 Started raining before we
July 12 had breakfast this morn.
and kept at it nearly all
day not very heavy at times
but always some falling.
Got old granary cleaned out
and some of it pulled down
I went to Oak Lake afternoon
took out Resben & Louise,
then went on to J. Aitken and
bought a sow from him.
A lot of rain has fallen
and will help crops well
14 A fine day we had a
small shower of rain fore-
noon but afternoon was
fine. Alf. & I went to seven
and put two paper over sow
thistles and afternoon he
ran scuffle in potatoes lower
Errol went to Aitken for sow

1913 And Pitchard hoed
thistles in crop. Grandpa
came down from Napella
today.

July 15 - A small shower in
" " I saw Cultivator in corn
forenoon a lot of deer and it
was wet. Errol mowed some
wild oats in wheat fore
noon then began to rake up
hay. After noon he went to
E. Williams to barn raising.
Pitchard hoed thistles
in grain spalled mustard.
Alf saw scufflers in
potatoes forenoon then
he and Pitchard hauled
hay & stacked it. I fin-
ished raking hay and
then saw Cultivator again.

1913 A fearful ^{hot} day
July 16 Errol & I went up to
Smithers & bot. down two
loads of old timber from
cubert there, in after
noon Errol went to Oak
Lake & bot. home load of
lumber. I saw Cultivator
in corn. Alf & Pitchard
finished hay at noon
and after Alf cultivated
around trees and Pitchard
cut thistles. H. G. Gouey
& I went to Kermeth and
Audited School Books
" 17 Errol & I went up to
big gully near Smithers and
~~got two loads of lumber there.~~
I saw Cultivator in corn
afternoon and Errol went for
load of ^{grain} lumber. Alf saw

Ditchard was cutting. ~~Thistle~~
July 18 I ran Cultivator in
corn until noon then
Maggie, children & I went
up to J. S. Little's to S. S.
picnic. Alena Armstrong

hoed potatoes in field
forenoon and he & Alf. hauled
in oak hay after. A lovely
warm day.

Errol & Alf. hauled hay
forenoon and got gravel
after.

1915 A hot day. I went up
July 19 to Smith's gully and
brought alf lumber down
forenoon then Maggie & I went
to Oak Lake after. Errol
& Alf. got home ^{five} loads
of gravel. Charlie worked
at taking down granary.
Very hot day we need
rain.

" 21 A fearful hot day
and we had a few small
showers of rain but not
enough to lay dust and we
need a couple of days rain.
Mrs G. Lopez & Albert Maggie
here for dinner. Errol went
to Miranda fair. Alf. and
Ditchard got home six
loads gravel. I pulled
weeds in flax.

1913 A hot day but a
July 22 good breeze. Errol
& Alf. got four loads of
gravel today. Pritchard
worked at taking down old
granary. I went to car late
afternoon and brought home
two bags of cement

" 23 A very hot day cloudy
some of the time but sun
shone steady nearly all day
Errol & Ralph brought the
loads lumber forenoon and
Walter went afternoon instead
of Ralph. Alf. ran Cultivate
in potatoes forenoon, Pritchard
& I worked at taking down
granary all day and Alf.
helped afternoon. Very dry
crops looking up looked like
rain east but we got none

1913 A hot dry day and
July 24 no sign of rain. I
hoed potatoes all day
Alf. worked at granary and
got home two loads of
stone. Pritchard worked
at granary all day.
Errol & twins got home
four loads lumber.
W. Camp & wife here for
awhile today night

" 25 A fine day men pulled
down granary all day. I
finished hoeing potatoes at
noon and Errol & Ralph
got home two loads flat
Cement forenoon then Errol
started to harrow fallow
afternoon. Hot & dry a few
drops of rain fell but no-
thing of any account

1913 Cloudy all day and
July 26 about a dozen drops
of rain fell but it was
pretty hot forenoon and
cooled after. Errol & Harold
follow all day. Alf, Charlie
& I worked on Cement work
forenoon and they two alone
after as I went to Oak
Lake to give entries for show
got in the cement for footing
under well today.
Melville & Carl came home
tonight

28 A hot day although
wind blew very strong
all day from S.W. Errol
packed all day. Men and I
worked on granary founda-
tion. Still very dry
and no sign of rain

1913 A fine day until near
July 29 night when it clouded
up and we had a big electric
storm, thunder & lightning ter-
rible but not much rain
fell. I think the hottest day
of the season also a hot wind
cooked up grain in great shape
Got two loads stone today
and men worked at cement
afternoon and Errol ran
packer. I went to Oak Lake
afternoon and gave out en-
tries for a show.
30 I stayed in Oak Lake
all night and gave out entries
until noon. The whole family
went to show. we took out
some stock and got four
prizes in all. A fine cool
day and we had a good
day

July 31 A lovely day, breeze blowing from S.W.
Gerob finished packing at noon and after he went for load of stone east of reservoir. Max & I worked at cement & took our pump twice.

Aug 1 Harding fair today and Gerob went up. Max and I worked at cement and finished it at noon, afternoon alf. mowed on alfalfa ground and Charlie cut out some trees. Twins went to Williams and got a new sucker for pump. Terrible hot all day was up to see corn this evening and it is beginning to wilt and die for want of rain

1913 A very hot day. Alf. Aug 2 cut in alfalfa all day Gerob got load of shale forenoon and went east of reservoir for stone after. Charlie cut brush in bluff all day. I wrote letters forenoon and went to Oak Lake after, where we had a quarterly official board meeting. Grain coloring fast and not filling
" 4 A very hot day, Alf finished cutting in alfalfa field and then began in hog pasture but broke mowers so he put in balance of day at cement. Charlie hoed awhile in garden and then worked at cement Gerob went for load lumber forenoon then worked at cement after. A Carpenter has helping

1913 Another very hot day
Aug 5 Errol worked for
Carey all day. Men & I
worked at cement forenoon
and they worked alone
afternoon as I went to
Oak Lake and beat hay
twine. Melville came home
tonight from Braman
" 6 A fine day pretty hot
but a good breeze from
S. E. Charlie cut weeds in wheat
forenoon and worked at cement
after. Errol went for lumber
forenoon & Melville went to
Grinnold hill for load of
stone, afternoon both of them
worked at cement. Alf. went
to trader fair today on train
Maggie & I drove up in mfg.
and came home at night

1913 A very fine day. Rained
Aug 7 a good big shower last
night the first for a long time,
it rained quite a lot and
will do a lot of good. Melville
& Alf. went for load of stone
afternoon. Errol got home re
bags of cement forenoon, and
C. Pritchard cut weeds in flax
until noon, rest of us all
worked at cement work, Mr
Paul came at noon and put
in the windows for us and
we got away well
" 8 A nice shower of rain
this morn, before we got up
and it will freshen things
up. Melville ran mowers on
road today, rest of us worked
at cement Mr Paul came
and put in beams: a very
fine day

1913 A cold wind from east
Aug 9 all day. Finished cement
work at noon and afternoon
Errol finished fixed up binders
C Pritchard went home at noon
Alf. went to sew and fixed
around well with cement.
and afternoon he cut brush in
trees west of house. I went to
Oak Lake afternoon took Maggie
and she went to Wapella.
Melville ran cultivator on
fallow all day. Cecil came
home tonight from Brandon
East wind all day & drizzle rain
" 11 Very thick fog this morn. but
soon cleared away and it was
a lovely day. Errol went for lumber
forenoon. Cecil went to Wapella
alf. & Melville hauled wood & pieces
to wood pile all day. Charlie went
for wood for himself

1913 A fine day. Errol & Melville
Aug 12 will run scuffle
~~and disc on fallow all day~~
made two trips to Gravelled
today and brot. home cleaver
for our granary. Alf. ran disc
afternoon. Charlie & I got all
frame work away from cement.
" 13 A fearful hot day both
sun and wind, about as
hot as anything we had
this year. Errol ran scuffle
~~and disc~~ in fallow until noon
and then began to cut
marquis wheat, the first
cutting we have done.
Melville ran disc in fallow
all day. Alf. Charlie & I dug pit
in granary forenoon & they con-
creted it afternoon. I went to
Oak Lake & brot. home Maggie
Cecil

1913 A cool windy forenoon
Aug 14 Errol finished cutting
Margie's wheat at ten o'clock
then went to seven
and cut two rounds around
the oats we want for green
feed they are rather green
and after noon Errol went
to Oak Lake for a few bags
cement and load sand, but
came home without any as
it was too wet. Charlie & I
worked some at cement
forenoon then he helped
Ralph stack wheat. Began
raining about 3:30 and
poured for a long time some
hail fell also, as much
rain fell as we have had
for the last 12 months I
think, it has done some
damage

1913 A fine day warm sun
Aug 15 and wind from west.
Ground very wet from rain
yesterday and pools in places.
Mr Day, Ken and nephew here
all night, they left this morn.
went to W. Co. Charlie put in
some cement this morn. Then
helped saw wood. Errol & men
sawed nearly all day and there
is still some to do. Melville went
to Brandar today. Cecil took him
out in wagon and brought home
some cement & sand. I wrote
in home nearly all day. Aunt
Mary here for tea.
" 16 A very hot day at times. Got
all wood sawed & Errol got a big
load cum coal. Alf. hauled four loads
shale. Cecil went to Oak Lake afternoon
Charlie did some cementing & hauled in garden.
I worked at Apr. S. books all day.

(19)

1913 a fine day but we had
Aug 18 a little rain in morn.
although they had a lot
of rain in Oak Lake. Alf. Sick
forenoon and did nothing. Charlie
& I finished pit in prairie fore-
noon and after he went to seven
and cleared road for Errol in
oats. Alf. did some stooking
in wheat in pasture afternoon.
Ceil started mowing, H.
binder in wheat in pasture at
noon. Errol finished discing
fallow and then went to seven
and cut oats. Desbrielle & I went
to Oak Lake afternoon.

" 19 Began raining at 2:30 this
morn. and kept at it until seven
very big storm of thunder & light-
ning also some hail fell
and we had a tremendous

1913 amount of rain. Men
piled wood forenoon and
stooked afternoon. Errol
crushed some after dinner.
Ceil finished cutting the
piece of wheat in pasture
but we did not try to cut
any more. Errol took hub-
wheels out to Oak Lake early
and he went west to Rocau-
ville on the 8:20.

" 20 Foggy this morn. and a
slight rain began falling
about 9:30 and continued
until about one. Errol began
to cut in oats on seven but
only got a short piece up the
fields. Ceil began on wheat
near Carey's but had to stop.
Men piled wood. Maggie & I went
to Oak Lake afternoon. ^{hicc towards}
upbr

1913 A fine drying day seen
Aug 21 Chasie being here
wind was a little strong from
north for good cutting, but it
was a fine drying day. Errol
cut oats on seven and Charlie
stooked after him. Cecil cut
wheat near Casey's and Alf.
stooked after him. Carpenter
came at eleven o'clock
and began at pruney.

" 22 A very fine day and
Cecil finished cutting 24
acres of wheat near Casey
and began with Errol in
Oats on seven. Errol's Camer
broke early & he had to go
to Oak Lake and got hardly
anything done forenoon. Three
men working at pruney all
day

1913 A fine hot day. Carpenter
Aug 23 worked at pruney all day
Errol & Cecil cut oats on seven
but did not quite finish it,
Cecil had a couple of boards
down that hindered him.
Wind got east towards evening
and I suppose it will rain
again. Carpenter all went to
Oak Lake tonight

" 25 A lovely day although a
little too windy. I went to
Oak Lake forenoon and after
worked with Carpenter.
Alf & Chasie stooked all day
on seven. Cecil & Errol
cut on seven finished oats
& began at wheat. Errol
broke his binder and had
to go to Oak Lake tonight

(23)

1913 a very hot close day, Errol
Aug 26 broke big chain on binder
and had to go to Oak Lake
at noon. Cecil & he cut wheat
on seven all day. Carpenters
worked at framing and I
helped them. Looks like rain
tonight

" 27 A very windy day but hot
sun all day. Errol & Cecil
cut on seven after noon but
we had some rain in evening
and they both went out for
lumber. Heat soaked all day.
Carpenters worked at building.

" 28 A very windy day again
and wheat is shelling a lot
Errol finished cutting on seven
tonight had to cut a lot on
way. I went to Oak Lake after
noon for lumber.

1913 A fearful hot day and
Aug 29 had much breeze. Errol
& Cecil cut on fallow wheat
all day, it is a fairly good
crop. I went for lumber after
noon brought home 149 ft
of it. Ernie Carpenter cutting
for us this afternoon.

" 30 A fine day. Ernie Carpenter
cutting for us today, he and
Errol finished the wheat at
ten o'clock and then cut barley
balance of day. Cecil cut flax
all day. I went for load of
lumber forenoon. Carpenters
finished Cecil work of framing
tonight and they all went to
Oak Lake. Had a slight spitting
of rain today and it is dark
tonight

(25)

1913 A nice morning but a lot
Sept 1 of thunder and lightning
around and at ten we had a
big rain. Stopped all cutting for
some time. Errol was cutting
barley and Cecil at flax but
they both stopped and went
down to lake to fish. I went
for load of lumber after noon.
Men stacked, and Carpenter
worked at building
" 2 Very wet with dew this
morn. and day did not begin
to cut until near ten o'clock
Cecil cut flax until noon and
then Alf. cut and Cecil came
with me to Oak Lake and
went to Brandon. Got all wheat
stacked today and about 20
acres of barley. Carpenter
working at Granary

(26)

1913 Began raining this morning
Sept 3 at six o'clock and kept it
up all day a regular soaker and
wheat will not be fit to thresh
for a long time now. Mr. Lund and
one of the men went to Oak Lake
afternoon, but our own men and
Carpenter did nothing all day.
" 4 A fine hot day did not
rain any but still was too hot
to do much. Cecil went
to Grinnold forenoon & brot. home
some belting & buckets from
W. J. Youngs. Errol went to Oak
Lake & got some gasoline, after
noon they both worked at machine
men cleared out steer pens after
forenoon and after noon they
stacked up all barley & got a
lot of wheat & leaves set
up. I worked at Agr. Books all day

(27)

1913 A fearful hot day
Sept 5 close stuffy, also
rained a little forenoon
we had lots of thunder &
lightning towards evening.
Men set up stooks all day.
Ceil cut flat. Corral
cultivated some thistle
forenoon and cut barley
after. Sews to Oak lake
after noon.
" 6 A fine day and pretty
warm at times but not
so hot as we have had it.
Ceil finished cutting flat
at noon then finished barley
and cut some patches of oats
on Seneca. Alf cut corn after noon
with Corn Cutter. Jacob worked
at separator, went to Oak
Lake after noon.

(28)

1913 Ceil finished cutting patches
Sept 8 of oats on Seneca at noon and
began to cut stuff in alfalfa
afternoon. Jack corn until noon
then alf. Cal and I helped Earl
at machine. Charlie got all oats
stooked up & helped Jacob. Pretty
windy all day. Duly two carpenters
here today.
" 9 Blew a hurricane all day
forenoon from S. E. and after
from N. W. a very disagreeable
day could hardly work.
Finished cutting corn at noon
and got all stuff in alfalfa
cut also. Corral and I worked
at separator and got it into
yard and started going.
It runs all right. Calpenten
still here

(29)

1913 Threshed in yard all Sept 10 day today and made 550 bushels. Machine runs well and grain thresher cast, I hauled out two loads wheat. Pretty windy from west all day

" 11 A fine day but it blew pretty hard all day and made it bad threshing as wind was west. I took out two loads to Oak Lake, sold at 76¢.

Boys threshed in yard all day and made 650 bushels of wheat, we have 1200 bushels done now. First frost last night

" 12 Frost again last night, but a nice day a slight breeze from west until five o'clock when it turned straight east. I took out load wheat forenoon and after

1913 went with team and helped J Carpenter thresh. machine & boys there all day. Grace went to Oak Lake after noon

Sept 13 A fine day but very windy from south east and fallow drifted a lot. Boy threshing at Carpenter all day and made 765 bushels. I hauled out two loads from prairie in yard it is down a cent today and sells at 75¢. Looks like rain tonight

" 15 A good shower of rain yesterday Sunday and no one else here did any threshing until after noon. We threshed corn all day and did not finish it. I took out load wheat after noon. Wet until noon but a fine hot afternoon. Wheat 74¢ today

(31)

1913 A fine day, we all stooked
Sept 16 Corn until noon and
finished it then after dinner
the boys all went over to thresh
at Mr Carpenters and I put
on a load of wheat and went
to Oak Lake. They only threshed
a few stacks when feeder
belt jumped off and broke
some Castings Errol came out
to Oak Lake and we had to
send to Wff. for repairs. Wilfred
Smith came tonight and is to
work with us for some time
" 17 A fine day I wrote at
Agr. Society all day. Errol
crushed some. Wilfred Cecil got
out four loads wheat. Alf & Charlie
finished stacking Hungarian wheat
& picked up some barley in alfalfa
repairs for machine not up yet
tonight

(32)

1913 A fine day. Cecil and
Sept 18 Wilfred drew out four
loads wheat to Oak Lake.
Alf & Charlie stacked feed
out until three o'clock
then went to Mr Carpenters
to thresh, but found the
cylinder shaft bent, I got
repairs at Oak Lake today
and we could have started
only for shaft.
" 19 A fearful windy day a
regular hurricane. I took
cylinder over to Oak Lake and
did not get home until after
dark got it fixed at Stoneys.
Men plowed, Cecil took
Wilfred home & shot some
deer Errol crushed,
Mrs Carpenters here today

(33)

1913 A fine day, cold in morn.
Sept 20 and a good hard frost.

Cecil took out load wheat
forenoon and afternoon he
went to thresh at J. Carpenter
Went over early to Joes and got
Aplindas in feeder as job
started at ten o'clock machine
ran well after. Joes Carpenter
here all day

" 22 Stopped threshing at J.
Carpenter at noon and fixed to
see seven and Joes as got
some two hundred bushels done
when rain began to come down
pretty hard, it had been fall-
ling for some time, but not
sufficient to stop machine. got
out two loads wheat & brood, one
have put it in shed. Three
Carpenters here all day

(34)

1913 A cold wind from east
Sept. 22 all day. Three men and
Errol threshing at Carpenter all
day. Cecil & I got two granaries
over to seven also moved red
granary into place & got engine
into it for elevator.

" 22 A cold wind from east
all day Three men and Errol
threshed at ~~seven~~ Carpenter all
day. Cecil drew out two loads
wheat and emptied granary
in yard. A cold east wind all
day. I got some Agr. Society work
done. ~~Wiffen~~ ~~Joes~~ threshing

" 23 Cecil and I got both por-
table granaries over to seven
forenoon also moved red granary to
right place and moved engine into
it. Afternoon we threshed stock on
seven and got two loads wheat out
raining tonight

(35)

1913 A dull day some rain dropping
Sept 24 all day and also a very little
snow fell we heard there was
four inches fell in Wepf. Charlie
Pitchfork left today. Wilfred Smith
and Alf plowed all day. Corral
sick. Cecil went to Oak Lake
stiff for grassing. Went to
Kilden on 8.20 train got
back on the 3.30. Spitting a
little rain as we go to bed
" 25 A fine day clear and
sun & home all day. Moved
to Mrs Kennedys in morn.
and broke valve on engine before
we got a sheaf through and sent
to Brandon for it, & it came on
1.34 train. Got W. Co's engine at
noon and threshed 492 bushels
at Reubens. Cecil got out load
of wheat. Wheat in stock is soft

(36)

1913 A lovely day. I took horse
Sept 26 to Oak Lake left it there
and walked on to Alger
and went down to Brandon
did some business there and
came back on C.P.R. at 1.34
G. Connor came out tonight
and spliced rope for G. Lund
Cecil got out load wheat.
Boys finished threshing at
Reubens at noon then moved
to Pommer and threshed
all afternoon. About as good a
day as we ever get
" 27 A lovely day fairly windy
from S.W. a bright clear day
threshed at Mrs Pommer all day
Cecil & twins plowed & packed
all day. Saw Carpenter at gran-
ary and we got it working
and every thing works nice smooth

(37)

1913 A lovely day but it was
Sept 29 hot as July at times
Threshed out of stacks on seven
all day and made about 600
bushels, it is not turning out
at all, the poorest yield we
have had for a long time.

Cecil and I got four loads
out to Oak Lake. Carpenters
still at granary

" 30 A very fine day again with
north & west all day. Boys fin-
ished threshing all the wheat on
seven at three o'clock & went
home and we are threshing
wheat south of granary as the
wind was like as thresh in barn
yard. I took out one load wheat
forenoon, & we are putting the
wheat in granary now.

(38)

1913 A lovely day. Finished
Oct 1 all the wheat we had in
stacks at 9.30 and then threshed
barley until noon. Had 2667
bushels of wheat in all an
average of $18\frac{1}{2}$ per acre, that
is $9\frac{1}{4}$ bushels less per acre
than last year. We still have
the two acres of Marquis wheat
to thresh but it is stacked.

Machine went to Carpenters yester-
day afternoon. Went to Oak
Lake yesterday afternoon in buggy
" 2 Machine at Carpenters all
day and we expect to finish
it tomorrow. I went to Oak
Lake early in buggy & brought out
Mr. Anderson to see seven, took him
back and was home at noon.
Took out load of wheat after noon.
A fine day very hot but pretty
windy

(39)

1913 A fine day but cool
Oct 3 I got out two loads
wheat to Oak Lake. Baps
threshed all day at J. Carpenters
they have another house work
there yet.

" 4 Jim had all of his
Carpenters early this morn.
then moved to J. R. Kennedys
wheat on farm. I went over
with another team and
we had five teams hauling
stacks all day and made
596 bushels. A cold miserable
day wind very strong from
east.

" 6 Raining when we got up and
kept spitting all day also a little
snow. Took six horse engine apart
Cecil & Alf plowed some afternoon.
Maggie & I went to Oak Lake afternoon

(40)

1913 Very cold wind from NW
Oct 7 west all day. Cecil & Alf
plowed and packed all day, and
had to wear overcoats. Errob and
Wilfred went to Oak Lake forenoon
& got parts of six horse engine
fixed afternoon Errob and I
went to Oak Lake and W. Booth-
wick took us down to the island
where I bought eight head of
year old steers at \$41⁰⁰ each
and one for \$36⁰⁰ and also four
others two years old for 5 1/2
cents per pound and two dollars
per head extra.

" 8 A dull dark day & very cold
Sun came out clear tonight for
an while. Baps threshed some barley
& wheat out of stack at Reubens
today then came home and did some
hoggin wheat. I took load out after

1913 A strong east wind all Oct 9 day. We finished our Marquis wheat at ten o'clock and then moved to Mr. Pommers barley finished it and then to his oats there is still two stacks to do tonight. Our Marquis wheat went 35 bushels per acre. I got out load wheat to Oak Lake today

• 10 Raining when we got up and had rained some during night. Kept snowing a little during day but it melted as it fell. We got home one of the granaries from seven and two teams plowed all afternoon. Stock's good and wet now and will be for some time

1913 Alf. Corral & I dug potatoes Oct 11 all day and got out 28 bags They are a good size but very thin, ground frozen very hard in day and only thawed about noon, very cold north wind all day. Cecil & turnis plowed all day and we have about fifty acres fall plowed now

• 13 A most beautiful day very seldom we get just such a day as this and I wish it would stay like today for the next six months, it seems to me it would not be hard to get along and live right if conditions and weather were like today. Finished threshing Mr. Pommers at ten o'clock. Alf. Wilfred & I took up potatoes after noon. Corral & Cecil fix machine

1913 A fearful windy day
Oct 14 We began threshing oats in
