frost tonight. We are still  
waiting on some for machine  
& another Captain.

" 2 Sun shone all day but  
a cold east wind blowing  
and it was not warm.  
Bob & I worked at Mack all  
day. Cecil hauled out  
manure. Carol & Mack worked  
at separator. Sun is out on  
uprights on fence forenoon and  
went to Oak Lake after

1916 Rained last night  
Sept 4 Sunday a good long shower  
with lots of thunder & lightning  
so was one can thresh this morn.  
Cecil and I worked at Oak Lake  
boats all day. Mack hauled  
out manure. Bob took uprights  
off fence. Labor day and no  
school so twins put uprights  
on fence. Carol worked at sep  
separator. A fine day and drying well  
" 5 Cecil went to Oak Lake  
forenoon for stuff for repairs  
I went to Griswold in even-  
ing for Cecil. Mack hauled  
manure from south of Grassy  
Creek machine going after noon  
got a load of hay to threshed  
tied the wreath but it is a  
little tough. Bob & I fixed  
wagon.

1916 A fine day but dull,  
Sept 6 at times and Sun did  
not shine all day. Tried threshing  
oats & barley in my, but it was  
too wet also tried wheat afternoon  
it was not hard so we stopped.  
Left some machine out a load  
of grain home, fence fixed  
motor out to be fixed.

" 7 A lovely hot day, and  
for threshing. No cedar in yard  
at wheat but pump belt  
bothered all day and we did  
very poorly had to quit early  
and phoned in A. J. but  
he can't come until tomorrow  
morning. Wheat at compound  
a poor sample it may go  
to 5 bush & am doubtful.  
Cecil setting up stools west  
of house.

1916 a lovely day wind S.E.  
Dept 8 Threshed in yard all day  
had to go to Oak Lake at noon  
repairs for engine also broke  
tightener on separator and  
we had to get one from Mr  
Carey's machine. Did not  
finish the 40 acres near  
W. R. is yet.

" 9 A dull day very little  
Sun Shine and felt like rain  
but none came wind east all  
day. We threshed steady until  
noon then Mr. Carey came for  
belt tightener we had of his  
and I went to Oak Lake but ours  
is not up from N.P. yet so  
Ezra & Cecil took two loads  
wheat to Grinnell & sold at  
\$1.20 per bushel for do 5 wheat.  
Truck hauled because Bob got  
up fence posts

1916 A fine day back wind  
Sept 11 bled out & had time  
to get all the. Cecil went  
to John Harlan's early and  
got a wheel off his separator  
and got the machine going  
early. I took some sand up  
& we went to Kinsman on the  
sixth o'clock train Ralph  
met here team and I  
got home motor car.  
Worked from west field  
all day, wheat good sample  
but trapping out poorly.

\* 12 A lovely day very hot  
at times. Finished threshing  
all wheat west of house at  
3.30 and moved to Reulens.  
I took load to Oak Lake  
and sold at  $1\frac{50}{50}$  bush.  
bought some gasoline & coal  
oil

1916 Rained this morn. about 4.30  
Sept 13 machine got going at Reulens  
and threshed for an hour and  
then had to stop. A heavy shower  
fell for awhile and has stopped  
threshing for some time. Grand  
left today, Cecil took him out  
to Oak Lake. I went to Griswold  
in express in afternoon. Errol  
Cecil & Bob set up wheat thresher  
east of house

\* 14 A cold wind from  
N.W. all day and if it goes  
down tonight it will freeze  
hard. Errol & I went to  
Griswold with two loads  
of wheat and nearly froze on  
road. Men setting up stacks  
of wheat forenoon. Began to  
fall plow today & Bob  
did some cultivating in evening

1916 Very hard frost this  
Sept 15 day, the first real  
frost we have had and  
it has killed everythig,  
the water troughs all  
frozen over. I was all at Mr.  
Wadys threshing. I made two  
trips to Giswold with  
wheat. Lewis started for  
Ost Lake in car but broke  
on road & had to call him  
back. Car into Story's a  
front spring broke, we  
had to go after bags in  
expenses. A nice day but  
cold

" 16 Boys threshed all day  
at Mr. Kennedy's. Lewis & I got  
out three loads wheat to Gis-  
wold today. Very cold all day and  
froze hard last night and will  
again tonight

1916 A very fine day although  
Sept 18 we had a small shower  
of rain in the morn. Finished for  
Mr. Kennedy's on Sec. 8 at three  
o'clock and began in our wheat  
east of house and made 198  
bushels it is good wheat and  
may grade No 2 but is not  
turning out much per acre  
Rebels wheat a very poor  
quality and small yield. I  
went to Ost Lake forenoon,  
took out four plots to get fixed.

" 19 A very hot day but a  
good breeze from S.W. threshed  
in wheat east of house all  
day made 476 bushels good  
wheat but a great lot of  
wild oats in it. I was clean-  
in it in elevator all day.

1916 Rained a little last Sept 20 night and this morn, so we could not thresh. Started starting at seven but it was so windy we could not. Harold went to Gruenwald with a load of wheat. Cecil is plowing and Bob is fixing places for pigs. Maggie & I went to Ossenden in car it was too windy to be pleasant.

" 21 Another very windy and cold day. Threshed until ten o'clock and then stopped afternoon. Harold & I went to Oak Lake & got 4 1/4 ton coal home and brought home a plan that was getting fixed at Remond. Very cold.

1916 A cool dull day Sun. Sept 22 Shone very little and an cool, very like rain at times but none fell. Finished all our wheat today at four o'clock then sowed to rye and started at oats. We have 2324 bushels of wheat in all a good crop considering the year. " 23 threshed oats on Sunday all day made 785 bushels they are hard to handle and not turning out to the straw. Very soggy and wet in sun, as bad as a rain, but warm and fine after ten o'clock " 25 Rained last night and we could not thresh. Cecil helped plowed west of house all day. Harold crushed forearm & took load wheat to Gruenwald after. I got gasoline at Oak Lake forearm & wheat to Gruenwald after

1916 Rained hard last  
Sept 16 night and dull & dark  
all day very cold & wind north  
don't know when we can  
thresh now. Cecil took  
Wilfred home this morn, two  
plows going all day most  
of house. I went to Oak  
Lake afternoon and boat,  
Jennie home she has been  
at Edmonton. Bob got some  
potatoes dug and Errol  
got some threshing done,  
" 27 Coal all day and wind  
north. Errol & Cecil plowed  
rest of house. Bob & I  
got out potatoes. A good  
dry day as sun shone  
and it was windy.

1916 A fine day, Errol went  
Sept 28 to Oak Lake forenoon  
in car. I took load w head to  
Oak Lake Griswold, Cecil  
plowed. After noon we threshed  
oats on Sevens.  
" 29 A fine day, trying to thresh  
but machine did not work  
well and forenoon only did  
fifty bushels, I had to go  
to Oak Lake and get detector  
arm ground down at a jacks,  
after noon they did better  
afternoon. A good sun and  
breeze all day.  
" 30 Threshed until two o'clock  
then had to stop for wind. Got  
plow going and took two loads  
wheat to Griswold. Bob got out  
some potatoes. R Armstrong and  
family here for tea tonight  
a miserable windy day

1916 Yesterday Sunday was a Oct 2 very dull cloudy day and looked like snow all day Richard & family left here for home at six P.M. and it was a good job as it began to spak snow about 8.30 and this way when we got up there was two inches of snow all over the ground it all went away before night but it was a dull ugly day. Wilfred Smith went home at noon. Cecil elevated & cleaned wheat also crushed a load for W.C. and some for ourselves. Enos went to G. Hamps yesterday got back tonight. Cecil Grace & Muriel went to W.C's to see Aunt Jessie tonight.

1916 Snow had from N.E. all Oct 3 night and rained before we got up. Enos & Cecil went out to plow at eight o'clock but it began to rain at night nine thirty and they had to come in. Rained hard and steady until three in afternoon very cold and a lot of rain fell water every place. Maggie and I went to Oak Lake in top buggy to see Sister Jessie off, she has been in the west since middle of August. Stands and sheaves will not thresh now for some time

\* \$4 A dull cold day and snow did not shave all day and very little dry by done. Cecil & I plowed until noon and after noon Cecil broke in pasture & took Enos to Oak Lake and

1916 He took train for Chicago  
I went to Giswold from  
Oak Lake and brt. home some  
flour. Our mare Sudge died  
tonight of inflammation

Oct 5 Bob spent all forenoon  
digging a hole for hedge. Cecil  
of 4 pl. plowed up pasture  
breaking it up. No school so  
twins went to Oak Lake  
forenoon with plow points.  
I worked at potatoes all  
day. Boys all went to H.H.'s  
and helped him get cows  
out of well.

6 A lovely warm day  
and a good breeze from  
west. Broke in pasture all  
day with two teams, turned  
all the oat sheaves in bunches  
I went to Oak Lake afternoon  
and took 16 and three empty

barrels & shipped same  
hens. We all went to hear  
Bengough tonight.

Oct 7 A very cold day  
a strong wind from N. Cloudy  
& dull. I dug potatoes forenoon  
and took load wheat to Gis-  
wold after. Cecil and one of  
the twins plowed all day fin-  
ished breaking up pasture.  
Bob worked at potatoes.  
Anne Falconer came last  
night and is visiting here.

89 A heavy white frost  
and foggy until ten, began  
threshing oats in evening but had  
to stop until seven as they were  
too wet. I took load wheat to  
Giswold got a lot of oats  
threshed afternoon. Anne Falcon-  
er went to Justice today.

1916 A fine day very hot Oct 10 at times blustery wind was cool from south all day. Threshed oats or seven and finished them at 4:30 and we have 3400 bushels. Machine went to Mr Kennedy's Section four and began at oats there for him. " 11 Machine threshed on Sec 4 for Mr Kennedy all day and job along well. I went to Oak Lake forenoon and brought home two barrels gasoline. Afternoon I went & I went out & got some traps, traps few here. Bought them they weigh 9460 pounds, we put them on oat stubble or seven

1916 A fine day very pleasant Oct 12 machine saw at Mr Kennedy's Sec 4 all day. Scattered forenoon & then took a load of wheat to Lumsden sold at \$1.43, after leave back Lumsden & I went to Oak Lake in car. My wife at Mrs J. Cairns town afternoon at Red Cross meeting.

" 13 A lovely day. I plowed all day. Machine worked on four for Lumber and finished all his threshing. Grace went to Oak Lake afternoon.

" 14 A lovely warm day sometimes very hot. Threshed barley all day & I stayed in granary and cleaned it, it is turning out very poorly nearly half the field done and only 675 bushels

1916 A cold dull day Sun Oct 16 did not shine all day and wind was north. Rained last night, we began threshing early in mng. but did very little afternoon as it was too wet and in afternoon water pump would not work and we did very little all day. I went to Old Lake in car in evening for repairs then when home Kieffed & Cecil were out again for more repairs.

" 17 Snowing hard when we got up this mng. and kept at it all day a big storm from east over a foot of snow feels it is soft and wet under foot. Cecil Kieffed & I did chores and sat in house until soon the boys cracked Bob sick today

1916 A dull day snow went Oct 18 away a very little and tonight as we go to bed it is very dark and trying to snow some more, it is just a question if this snow goes away. Cecil took Kieffed home forenoon and went on from there to Old Lake. Snow about a foot deep allows Kieffed around all day. Bob still sick and did nothing today

" 19 Bob Cecil & I got in all the potatoes today, some of them were frozen and I guess more than one in cellar will develop rot later. A dull day and snow did not have a particle, dark & dull and very frosty tonight

1916 Another dull dark day Oct 20 and sun did not shine all day very little thawing done but towards night snow got softer and went a little back & raw wind from west & north all day. Cecil crushed & put some windrows in stable, and after noon I went to Wesshaw funeral at Lake. Bob chores around getting stable ready for winter.

" 21 A cold day and dull sun did not shine at any time today, George went home and roads fearful muddy. Cecil took out 71 bushels wheat to Griswold today that finishes all our No 3. I started to Oak Lake with Cen afternoon but Carl broke and Cen came home

1916 Sun shone all day Oct 23 and wind was south but yet it was cold and George did not shear lambs. Cecil took a year old heifer out to her Rockhenick in afternoon & Bob, have a little coal for Bob, chores around & chores a little.

" 24 A dull day sun did not shine and it rained for two hours between ten & twelve. Cecil took Cen out to Oak Lake forenoon and another one in afternoon, had two teams on wagon with Lamonds cart behind. Roads fear full with mud I went to Dixie ton meeting afternoon and took Mr R. out. Cecil gone out tonight with G. Smith to hear Percy Hayes.

1916 A fine warm day  
Oct 25 and snow has gone  
a lot today. Cecil took out  
heifer to her birthmark this  
morn. and after noon he plowed  
I cleaned some barley <sup>forenoon</sup>,  
elevated wheat & crushed  
in afternoon Bob & I killed  
two pigs & I crushed some more  
this evening.

" 26 A nice forenoon but  
after noon we had some heavy  
showers of rain. Cecil was plowing  
out of house all day with ~~old~~  
horses drove one gang and led  
the other one. Bob & I dug po-  
tatoes all day & got in about  
thirty bushels, ground very  
wet and makes miserable  
workings

1916 Froze pretty hard this  
Oct 27 morn. But, Cecil went out  
and plowed until noon. Bob  
& I had potatoes but had a  
job to break frozen ground.  
Began to thaw at ten o'  
clock and kept it up until  
three in afternoon and about  
two inches of soft snow fell.  
Cecil crushed some afternoon  
Bob & I peeled over potatoes  
in cellar. Grace went to Oak  
Lake early & took train - for  
Varden came home after noon.  
" 28 A soft day and snow  
melted some but not all gone  
yet. I picked potatoes in cellar  
forenoon and after went to Oak  
Lake took out Muriel & her Lin.  
Cecil got load straw for horses  
& hauled out manure. Bob cleaned  
out steer pens and got hay & straw

1916 A nice warm day no frost Oct 30 this morn. and as warm as April all day. Cecil put up some hay, steam then got out a load of manure and plowed afternoon I picked potatoes all day in cellar a lot of them rotten. Bob helped me some. D. Smith here tonight. Snow all gone again " 31 A lovely day froze hard this morn. Cecil got started to plow early but it was pretty hard for awhile, Bob & I did chores and at 9:30 got started at potatoes, it was frozen pretty hard until noon but after noon it worked fine, got up 17 bags of potatoes a lot of them frozen and we threw them away. nice & warm after noon but freezing hard tonight

1916 I went to Dad's to have fence wire & iron in buggy and knot. home John little and we started to thresh barley after noon brought machine down from field and set south of granary made 300 bushels after noon, I have a man from Des Moines tonight. A fine day " 2 Threshed barley in yard all day and finished it at eight o'clock 16 tons, wind got east near night & that made it hard and it was very dirty threshing. Looks dull and like snow tonight " 3 Put away machine forenoon and fixed up fence, scrubbed, after noon Cecil plowed Bob & I worked at potatoes a fine day not cold worked in bare hands and without coats

1916 A fine warm day wind  
was up S.E. seemed hot forenoon  
Bob went to Oak Park for coal  
for himself after was me  
both got up potatoes Walter  
Ralph picked me four 16 bags  
into cellar. Cecil began to plow  
at ten o'clock.

" 6 A lovely day yesterday it  
was anniversary at Ryerson there  
was no service at St. David's  
and we had a full house it  
was a lovely day and no fire  
was required. We frost this morn.  
and I began to dig potatoes and  
we got them all up and in cellar  
pretty late for that time about  
<sup>150</sup> bushels in cellar and took  
about 30 by frost. Cecil plowed  
rest of home until four when  
a big storm of snow came along  
and stopped him <sup>on snow</sup> I plowed a little

1916 A nice day and not cold  
harvested barley & cracked  
all day. Cecil has had sick man  
out and Bob chores around  
and fat in hay & straw  
Kean went some but still a  
lot here and very cold tonight  
" 8 Froze hard last night  
and kept cold all day did not  
thaw much. I picked & carried up  
eight bags of potatoes & Bob took  
them out to Kean & brot himself  
some coal home. Maggie & I went  
out at noon she went to a meeting  
of Home Economics and I went to  
annual meeting of Agr. Society  
President of Agr. College was there  
and spoke to us and at night we  
had a concert in aid of Patriotic  
Society made \$79.00 at it  
Cecil hauled out manure all  
day with spreader

1916 A cold day sun shone  
but 9 bright and ground softened  
a little in middle of day, but  
only for an hour or two and  
froze again very cold tonight and  
freezing hard. I wrote forenoon  
and crushed after a load for  
Uncle Will and some for  
ourselves. Bob took out ten  
bags potatoes to Knights Oak  
Lake & got some coal for  
himself. Cecil hauled  
brassine all day

" 10 A cold N.W. wind all day  
very frosty & as cold as far, nippin'  
& went up to J. J. Smith's today  
had dinner there. Roads fearful  
rough. Bob down helping Cary  
today at house. Cecil hauling  
brassine

1916 A good bright Sun all  
day 11 day but still N.W. wind  
and very keen & cold. Cleaned  
out steer pens forenoon and  
after I went to Oak Lake in  
truck & boat. bought a Duroe  
jersey Hat got him from  
Jim Meadows. Roads awful  
rough hard frozen and the  
small wheels of trucks found  
every hole. Bob hauled at  
his own house and Cecil  
hauled brassine

" 13 A keen cold day but  
clear and Sun shone bright all  
day. Cecil crushed & cleaned  
some wheat afternoon, went  
to Oak Lake afternoon attended  
Imortekly board meeting about  
some lime coal.

1916 A clear bright day but  
Nov 14 Keen scald. Cecil took  
forty bushels of wheat to Gis-  
mold and sold at  $1\frac{1}{2}$  per bushel  
he brought home 16 bags of  
flour for us & Bob. I cleaned  
some wheat forenoon & afternoon  
went to Oak Lake for coal.

" 15 A fine day warm as  
Sept. I cleaned wheat & cleaned  
barley all day. Cecil hauled  
maize forenoon and went to  
Gismold with wheat sold  
at  $1\frac{1}{2}$ . Bob got hay & straw

" 16 Another lovely day warm  
& nice and ground & cleaned a  
little. I went to Oak Lake forenoon  
for Coal but it was all  
done so I took load. Cecil took out  
load for P. Phillips. afterward  
crushed cleaned barley. Hods  
all gone to wood Parliament night

1916 A lovely day warm as  
Jan 14 Sept. Maggie & I went to  
Oak Lake forenoon & shipped  
a crate of roosters to Wpg.  
Grandpa came out with  
us, after noon I cleaned barley  
Cecil took load wheat to  
Gismold. Bob at Careys  
helping on house all day  
J. T. Little here all night and  
dehorned some Steers for us  
this morn.

" 18 A lovely warm day and  
nice to work. I cleaned barley  
forenoon and took to Oak Lake  
after six lambs and sold at  
 $9\frac{1}{4}$  cents they weighed 490 and  
brat.  $45^{\frac{3}{4}}$  also had out three pigs  
weighed 495. Cecil took out two  
loads wheat to Gismold  
Bob hauled maize

1916 Yesterday Sunday was for so a fine day dull but not cold. We all went to Oak Lake to church in Oak Lake at 11 forenoon and heard Rev. Mr. Chapman preach in Wesleyan Church. Near night it began to snow and was snowing as we went to bed. This morn. there was about two inches of snow on ground, wind was east all day not very cold, Dane & Murray came over in morn. and helped us load 19 hogs and we took them to Oak Lake & sold 3660 lbs of pigs in all at 9 $\frac{1}{2}$  cents per pound. Cecil hauled a load of barley for W. C. this afternoon.

1916 Cold strong wind from N.W. South West snow shore bright clear and it will likely turn warmer. Cecil took load barley to Oak Lake for W. C. fore noon and after he took load wheat to Griswold for G. Gillespie. Bob went to Mrs Abbott's funeral afternoon cleaned wheat all day. 22 A lovely warm day and snow that fell last Sunday night went away some. I went to Oak Lake in morn. & brought home four barrels apples for ourselves one for Bob & three for W. C. Cleaned barley afternoon. Cecil took two loads wheat to Griswold. Bob began at sheep shed afternoon

1916 23 A fine day cold and  
very ~~windy~~ <sup>windy</sup> but fine for  
working got colder towards  
night. Cecil made two trips  
to Griswold with wheat  
and we now have all the  
300 bushels out to G.  
Gillespie. I cleaned barley

hay & worked at sheep shed.

" 24 Cold all day ~~but~~  
pleasant for working. I  
crushed all day for ourselves  
and as feed for the horses.

" 25 A fine day, I crushed until  
noon and then cleaned barley until  
night. Cecil hauled manure forenoon  
and went to Oak Lake afternoon  
Ivins & Bob cleaned out steer  
stables forenoon & Bob worked at sheep  
shed in sun.

1916 A dull dark day and  
Nov 27 Sun did not shine a  
cold chirping wind all day, I  
went to Oak Lake in my  
and got drives shod all around  
roads very slippery. Cecil went  
out in car at noon. Bob & I  
killed pig afternoon.

" 28 Dull all day and  
Sun did not shine it was  
not cold forenoon but got  
very windy from west after  
noon and cold. Cecil & I went  
up to Leader in motor forenoon  
and came home afternoon, then  
he took Maggie out to Oak Lake  
and she has gone to  
Trapella. Bob worked at  
sheep shed and did  
chores around.

1916 A dull day and sun  
how 29 did not shine all day  
Cecil hauled out manure and  
got some straw. Bob got  
straw for steers and worked  
at stable. I cutted some  
cleaned some barley & cleaned  
wheel for J Carpenter. Feels  
like snow all the time but  
was fall.

" 30 A fine day Sun did not  
shine until near evening but it  
was not cold and we could  
work bare hands all day.  
Cecil went to Oak Lake forenoon  
to get some lumber & barrel gasoline  
got engine going afternoon  
and cleaned wheel for  
J Carpenter. Bob got out of  
meat & worked at sheep  
shed. Got home load straw  
from sonen

1916 A lovely warm day, I  
Dove man power at J. Carpenter's  
wheat forenoon and then crooked  
for him after. Cecil & D Smith  
went to Sioux and Rapid City  
this morn. in motor car. Bob  
chored & worked at sheep shed  
Harrill went home with Sonoff  
tonight, Grace & Ralph went  
to some meeting in St Daniels  
Church tonight so Walter & I  
had the house to ourselves  
" 2 A fine day warm and  
pleasant. Got stable all cleaned  
and manure out at noon. I went  
to Oak Lake afternoon and  
waited for night mail from  
east. Bob got hay & straw  
afternoon. Cecil & Dave got back  
from Rapid City. Louis went to  
Riyerson & put some wood in  
Church

1916 A lousy day warm as  
Dec 4 September. Rember hauled  
up three loads oats forenoon  
and crushed 48 bags for  
him after noon. Cecil hauled  
straw forenoon & went to  
Oak Lake after. Bob finished  
sheep shed today

" 5 Another very fine day  
I finished crushing for  
Rember at noon and went  
to Oak Lake in car after.  
rods frozen hard & rough  
but not bad. Cecil hauled  
straw forenoon & fixed up  
little engine after. Bob  
hauled straw in front field  
had letter from Maggie &  
Capella she will be home  
this week I think. Isab  
Rae from W. R. today

1916 A cold N.E. wind all  
Dec 6 day but not very frosty  
I tried Cushing forenoon and  
only got a little done as  
belts kept bothering. Cecil hauled  
straw forenoon and went  
to W. Gouffs afternoon and  
helped him rig his engine to  
saw & crush he crushed a  
little when he came back.  
Bob hauled straw. I took our  
processor up to prayer meeting  
and after supper took him  
as far as Bismarck on way  
home.

" 7 A fine day but a little  
colder. Cecil at Gouffs today helping  
to saw wood. I wrote letters most  
of day. Gene went to Red Cross meeting  
Dr W. C. Grace, funeral & I went to  
hear Rev Hinckley in Cenavous Hall

1916 Colder than usual all day  
Dec 8 but not bad. I went  
to Indians to measure stack  
of hay but he was not
