1918 Had several showers of Aug 23 rain forenoon and we did not start cutting until 2:30 afternoon then got along well. Had all three binders going and got a lot cut. We also got two gates on between Carey quarter & east quarter.

" 24 A hot day but very cool from South west no dew this morn. So we started early to cut I was cutting south of house Low & Cecil cut in follow east of house.

25 A hot day and good harvest day. Cecil & Low cut over eighty acres east of house I cut in forty south of house and finished it. I had to go to Old Lake at noon for repairs

1918 A fine day finished cutting Aug 27 wheat at noon and cut barley after noon got a lot of it done, it is a fair crop. Boys stooked wheat all day. A very hot forenoon but cooler after dinner. A. Stewart came out to fix my binder as it was not tying well.

" 28 A lonely day, but we only had two binders working until noon and only one after other two out of commission, made two trips to Old Lake in car for repairs and will have to take the binder down and to blacksmith tomorrow, boys still stooking wheat and we have about 20 acres barley or seven to cut.

1918 A fine day. Tom & Cecil  
Aug. 29 Cut on Seven after noon as  
it took Tom until noon to fix  
up his binder. I took money &  
binder out to Oak Lake. Got  
E. Raymond to work on it and  
he put in the day at it. I got  
home at dark and I think it  
will work now. Louis & Bob  
finished stowing wheat & began  
at barley on Seven

" 30 A fine day but very wet  
in morn. and we did not start  
cutting until ten o'clock, but did  
not come home from Seven until  
we had finished barley at  
two o'clock. Went to Oak Lake  
after it was over got Ray's face shot  
in front & beat home some coal oil  
& gasoline. Tom & Cecil took out engine  
tonight for J.S. Little. Louis & Bob  
stooked barley all day

1918 A fine day but a cool <sup>wind</sup> day  
Sept 31 <sup>off, 50% of us</sup> stooked forenoon  
at barley and after noon <sup>five of us</sup>  
was stooking. Cecil was fixing up  
his machine and got it set ready we  
got the seventy acres of barley on  
Seven all stooked up.

Sept 2 A fine day we fixed  
up wagons & forenoon began to  
thresh out afternoon, got  
a good many threshed they are  
very dirty.

" 31 Started threshing the  
forty acres of out this afternoon  
and only had a thousand  
bu. less than a very poor crop  
new machine into Corn yard  
and began at wheat it  
is the field south of home  
and is going about ten  
bu. less per acre.

1918 Finished field south  
Sept 4 of house and began  
at fallow got a pretty well  
seed and country is real healthy  
and don't know how  
many bushels.

" 5 A fine day and we  
threshed wheat all day  
moved out of yard at three  
o'clock and set in fallow.

" 6 A very hot day and  
we threshed wheat all day  
I stayed and put it into grain

" 7 Finished all our wheat  
as soon today we have  
about two hours and bushels  
Machine went to Remers and  
they expect to finish his  
wheat tonight. I took load  
of wheat to Old Lake after  
noon sold at 2<sup>st</sup> & fearful hat

1918 Very hard frost this morn.  
Sept 9 even the green grain growing  
on fallow is frozen and there  
is ice on the horse trough. Began  
to cut barley on Carey place, a very  
poor crop thick enough has a poor  
head. Cecil went to help Mr. Gumpf  
with his machine. We threshed  
a load of barley for the pigs this  
morn. Warm though day will cold  
again this evening and feels like  
frost again

" 10 A dull cloudy day and  
Cold snow with rain binder all  
day Son & I cut in barley on  
Carey place until fine ice back  
when it began to rain and  
we had to stop. Cecil had to  
take binder canvas to Griswold  
and get it fixed he only made  
a couple of rounds with old  
binder

1918 A fine day and we  
Sept 11 Cut with three binders  
until three o'clock when the  
big binders ran out gears and  
Ceil had to stop. Tom and  
cut all day, a lot of green  
stuff in barley and it cuts  
too dry. First again this way.

" 12 A lovely warm day, I  
went to Griswold forenoon &  
got a canvas chair for binder.  
Tom & Ceil ran binders fore-  
noon then in afternoon Ceil went  
to help binder with separator  
& Steve Wolf came & stocked  
for us. Tom & Tom barley all  
afternoon.

13 A very hot day a few drops  
of rain this morn. but not enough  
to stop us cutting. Tom & I cut  
barley until noon then went

1918 to Oak Lake in car with  
Sugie and Ceil drove my  
binders, we may finish the  
dry place tomorrow but not  
sure.

Sept 14 Very cold all day and we  
had to wear coats & mitts on binders.  
Finished cutting all the barley on  
dry place tonight but there is still  
some stocking to do. Folks weak to  
Oak Lake tonight to hear bush Harris  
talk on his trip to France. Will  
freeze very hard tonight.

" 16 Cut with two binders in  
green oats west of home all day  
got a lot done and they are a fine  
crop, we will have a lot of feed  
as they are both long & well headed.  
" 17 Finished cutting the 39 acres  
of green oats west of home at noon  
and began getting all stacked up tonight  
per

1918 Tom took out a load of wheat to Oak Lake after noon & boat home two barrels gasoline. I was in bed all day chub my knee on barley yesterday. A good shower of hail today.

Sept 17 We intended starting to thresh barley this morn. But it rained some last night and we did not start until noon. Ralph went to Gisvold with a load of wheat. Tom disced or eighty acres near miles until noon. Bob got potatoes & fixed greased wagons. Walter cleaned up framing & crushed oats. Byau to thresh barley on Sorenson's farm and made 570 bushels. A cold windy day. Busted a wagon tongue this afternoon and I had to go out to Oak Lake for another one.

(101)

1918 A heavy frost this morn Sept 19 but a fine warm day threshed barley on Sorenson all day and if nothing happens will finish it today tomorrow noon not turning out very well, had a good sample. Cecil had to go out to help John Little thresh his engine forenoon, he is gone out again tonight and will help him in even.

" 20 Engines would not work for an hour this morn. and we did not get a very early start, but finished barley as dad had 2180 bushels from the seventy acres on Sorenson. An engine expert here Sept 21 for awhile. Says threshed on Raulen See 4 at oats finished 20 acres there and went to Valley on 33 he has a very poor crop. I crushed

1918 forenoon and took wagon out  
to get top box made for it  
after went a very hot day  
Sept 23 Raining & when we got up this  
morn. and kept dropping all day  
not very much. fell but it  
made things disagreeable. Ralph  
Cecil took out this Cows to  
W. Portmeirion in morn. only work-  
ed horses a few hours fore-  
noon but got a lot of shearing  
done.

" 24 A lovely warm day and  
dried up well. Went to Oak  
Lake forenoon in wagon pretty  
windy but drying fast. Cecil  
took 104 bush. barley to Gres-  
wold with four horses. Tom  
driving eighty east of house  
Ralph ran Cultivated there after-  
noon. Bob & Walter got out some  
potatoes

1918 A fearful hot day, as  
Sept 25 warmer as July. I took  
load barley to Greswold fore-  
noon with four horses and after  
noon went down to flea and took  
out a load of oats for Reuben.  
Boys began to thresh for him at noon  
and finished him at noon.  
We got some potatoes and  
some drying done.

" 26 A fine day clear & cool  
Shing. Tom & I got out 372 bushels  
of barley to Greswold. Bob  
was at potatoes. Cecil & boys  
were threshing at Greys & finished  
him in morn. and moved machine  
to Greys barns

" 27 A fine warm day but very  
windy and fellows drifted a lot  
Cecil got out a Jack & fixed up  
Mac hse. Tom & I got some loads  
barley to Greswold. Bung & Bob at Greys

1918 A fine day has started Sept 28 to rain this evening at five and kept at it until ten o'clock and will pass threshing hard for awhile. Tom & I took loads of barley to Griswold forenoon and after he & Bob took loads out. Went to Oak Lake afternoon in car and met Sister Nancy she is on road home from Nipf. to Edmonton. W.C. & Lizzie here for tea. Boys threshing at P.J. Griswold all day

" 30 A fine day but cold all day. Tom & I got out two loads barley forenoon and that finished the ch at Griswold. afternoon he went to dice potato letters & went to G. L. meeting after dark with Ida Lee. Boys & Bob worked at potatoes. Cecil went to Oak Lake after war for gasoline

1918 A fine day, but wind got out, very cold from N.W. afternoon Boys threshing at Griswold all day Tom ran dice & Bob worked at potatoes. I went to Brandon & got lights on car fixed. Nancy went to Dr. C's this evening

" 2 A fine day but very cold this evening. Went to Oak Lake in car in evening and my ears were cold wind south with got warmer during the day. I went for load of hard coal afternoon. Boys threshing at Griswold all day. Bob finished getting out a potato bed today

" 3 Boys finished threshing at Griswold at noon then went to Newkirk and threshed for him afternoon. Went to Oak Lake forenoon & got a load belt coal. Cloudy around after

1918 A nice forenoon but a close Oct 4 and it began to drizzle rain at noon & kept it up all afternoon not much fell but it stopped threshing and teams came home from Reubens.

" 5 A dull day and not drying much. Tom drove in 40 acres south of house all day. Bob was putting in fence posts in lane to Carey quarter. Ralph harvested after noon in field near hillside. Walter crushed all day. Maggie, Muriel & Isaac to Oak Lake afternoon Maggie's brother came from Tapella today.

" 7 A cloudy forenoon then warm & clear after and everything drying up good. Tom finished drying forty acres south of house. Lewis set tiny up barley stooks. Bob worked at fence. I took W.C. to <sup>Gonego's</sup> funeral to Korman.

1918 A good drying day, a warm Oct 8 after noon. Lewis set tiny up stooks & sheaves at noon. Then afternoon Lewis went to Bay City fair in Oak Lake hamlet. George went also. I went to W.C.'s afterward & went with the & George to D.M. Klemow's funeral. Bob putting post all day.

" 9 Went to Oak Lake forenoon in wagon got some gasoline. Machine started to throb at Reubens at nine o'clock & finished all his oats & moved home tonight & will thresh a little oats we have before going out to barley.

" 10 Finished the oats at ten o'clock and went out to field Carey quarter for barley and threshed there balance of day. Barley a poor sample and not turning out much per acre a very hot day. Red cross water here today.

1918 A very hot day and we  
Oct 11 threshed barley all day  
on Carey place, it is turning out  
very poorly and is a poor crop  
and a poor sample.

" 12 A fearful windy day  
so bad could not thresh, we  
threshed a few loads in morn and  
then had to stop. Took two loads  
out west and to Griswold after  
noon. Dined with Dr. R. up to  
J. Jaspers bought a room  
at \$50.00. Wind went down  
with sun and very cold tonight

" 14 A dull day and we  
had a few sprinkles of rain  
twice but not enough to stop  
threshing. Threshed barley all  
day on Carey place, barley  
looks very feed and not  
turning out well

1918 A fine day very hot  
Oct 15 and a fine day. Threshed  
barley on the Carey place all  
day and finished it tonight, a  
very poor quality of barley  
and only yielded 17 per acre.  
Took K. Hatter out to Osceola  
Lake at noon and he went  
on to Grapella. Got word  
from W. C. Lindsey tonight  
that schools are closed  
for a few days on account  
of Spanish Influenza.

" 16 A fine day clear &  
pleasant. We were hauling oats  
into loft all day and got  
three loads up and two more  
on. Cecil & I went up to  
J. Jaspers tonight - hot.  
Had a rain this A.M.  
& I bought between us

1918 A very cool east wind  
Oct 17 all day and felt like  
winter. We hauled in sheaves  
all day and got them all  
hauled home 31 loads in all.  
Samuel went to Oak Lake  
in buggy afternoon  
" 18 Tom & I took these loads  
wheat to Oak Lake Grinnold  
forenoon then in afternoon I  
went to Oak Lake in express  
and Tom & Ralph went to  
Grinnold it rained nearly all  
afternoon and they had to  
trace up hill at Skinner.  
I took out two empty tanks  
& boat in a tank of coal  
oil. Grace & Samuel went to  
Kinder today & came to Oak Lake  
and staying at Uncle John's  
tonight

(20)

1918 A dull forenoon but  
Oct 19 a good driving afternoon.  
Cecil fixed up car & machine  
forenoon then Tom & he went  
to Grinnold with loads of  
wheat after. Dullish forenoon  
and wrote letters after. Bob  
was cleaning up around lots  
on Corey property.

" 21 Tom and I made two  
trips to Grinnold today with  
wheat. Ralph disiced all day  
or seven. Cecil is not well  
and went to Oak Lake doctor  
says he has gouty.

" 22 Went to Brandon this  
morn. to get car fixed & stayed  
all night. Wind cold and  
east all day. Boys hauled  
out wheat all day &  
Bob disiced

(21)

1918 Oct 23 Left Brandon for  
Oak Lake on ten eggs home  
for dinner. Finished hauling  
a car of wheat forenoon &  
got out three loads of barley.  
Drove to Oak Lake in car  
after noon took out violet  
little who has been visiting  
here. Very little snow all day.  
Oct 24 A little snow on ground  
when we got up this morn. but  
it soon went away. Tom &  
Ralph made two trips to Gis-  
mold today with barley. I  
crushed forenoon & diced on  
several afternoons.  
Oct 25 Very foggy until ten o'clock  
I diced on several until noon it  
was foggy in morn. but soon thawed  
out. I went to Mr. Jaspers with  
G. Gordon after noon he brought home

1918 a snow. Got out four loads  
barley today. Bob went to Oak  
Lake after noon & brought home  
Camerons cattle rack for to take  
hull out tomorrow to Griswold.  
Oct 26 A cold dull day foggy  
all day & cold south wind.  
Got out four loads barley to  
Griswold. I took out big hull  
to Griswold sold to Jew at \$1.00  
after noon fine after week to  
Oak Lake in car.  
Oct 28 A dull foggy day. but warm  
& pleasant afternoon. Took out  
twenty four bags to Oak Lake  
forenoon eggs  $\frac{9}{10}$  for them.  
Bob out two loads barley to Gis-  
mold afternoon & also had team  
in dice on several. Bob was fixing  
fence around Oak & train

(23)

1918 A fine day not cold but Oct 29 pleasant. Cecil & Tom took out two loads barley to Gisnold and that finishes two car loads we have hauled there. Afternoon got two teams plowing in small field east of stable. Walter disced on several all day. I took out two calves to Laramie forenoon and wrote in my books after. Bob finished putting a fence around stream pile in yard.

" 30 A cold wind from N.W. and felt like freeze up all day but got warmer towards night and feels like snow as we go to bed. Tom & Ralph plowed near stable all day. Walter disced on several. Cecil & I went to see J. Little's horses forenoon and after he went to Oak Bluff. I wrote in house

(24)

1918 A fine day not cold Oct 31 Walter disced on all day and finished the forty acre field there. Tom finished <sup>at noon</sup> the small field near stable and Ralph plowed for fallow down on Carey quarter. Tom also plowed there afternoon. Cecil crushed some stones to make lake in car afternoon. Dr. Purdy came to see Tom this morning and she has the influenza. How I a fine day. Ralph & Tom plowed on Carey place all day. Walter harrowed near stable forenoon & disced on Carey place after. Cecil was cutting brush down there also. Daniel & I went to East Lake afternoon. Tom been keeping better.

(25)

1918 A very fine day not  
hot & cold. Tom Ralph plowed  
all day. And Walter disced  
Cecil crushed a door for a  
Carpenter, Cecil is not well he  
has quinsy. Went to Giswold  
with W. D. afternoon, we  
had to go by Halls Bridge, as they  
are fixing Kennedy's bridge. We  
came home by Oak Lake and  
got some apples from W. C.  
Burns.

" 4 A fine day Tom Ralph  
plowed fallow all day. and Walter  
disced on Carey place where  
they were plowing. Bob not  
working yet. Went to Oak  
Lake forenoon in car. H. R.  
Lapins of Oak Lake died  
this morn. at four o'clock and  
was buried in afternoon

(26)

1918 Raining when we got up  
on 5 this morn. I took out  
plow point to get shaped in  
boggy and it rained all the time.  
Went away and kept at it  
all day, the first heavy  
rain I have seen in Manitoba  
in Nov. and a lot cold, snowing  
as we go to bed. Did nothing  
all day.

" 6 Heard this morn. that section  
man in Oak Lake died with  
influenza last night, that  
makes three deaths there  
and there is a lot of cases.  
About four inches of snow  
when we got up and it kept  
dark all day not freezing any  
but not thawing much either.  
Got out some manure today.  
Bed it is very sloppy getting  
around

(27)

1918 has cold but nothing  
now, 7 am and I guess Brown is  
here to stay although there is  
no snow frost in ground, got  
out manure all day, and  
weave in house, has much  
chance to do anything snowy  
a little as we go to bed  
tonight. Day cloudy all  
day. Heard over phone that  
Germans had accepted  
Armistice and fighting was  
stopped.

" 8 A fine day and not  
cold snow went a little  
low & Ralph hauled manure  
got home load barley straw  
for cattle. Three of Kennedy's  
horses died today. Dr. Lee  
and vaccinated us all to  
day.

(28)

1918 A fine day and not cold  
hor 9 but snow went very little  
Got a load of ground and  
hauled south of house, then  
got home two loads stable and  
put in stable. Tom hauled  
out manure from sheep yard  
got home fine steers from  
Barthwick and will feed  
them on straw this winter.  
I bought 20 hens & more from  
J. S. Little for \$275.00. I give  
them enough straw for them.

" 10 A warm day and snow  
went a lot. Tom hauled manure  
from sheep yard all day. Cecil  
went to Oak Park in my car  
& brought out Tom Barthwick to  
visit Kennedy, they are all sick,  
only Clarence. Walter went out in  
afternoon for medicine for them.  
Killed three pips at home this

(29)

1918 / A cold day Sun clear  
Nov 12 & bright but cold wind  
from N.W. Ralph & I went to  
Stan in traps & brought home  
a mare & foal that I had  
brought from J. S. Little.  
Afternoon Cecil & I went up to  
W. Gumpf's to see some cattle.  
Tom hauled manure all day  
got three pigs cut up and  
brought home load of shale.  
" 13 A fine day and snow  
went away some. Tom hauled  
some in afternoon. Bought five  
steers from W. Gumpf at \$168<sup>00</sup>  
each and five calves at \$40<sup>00</sup>  
each. Got home three loads  
shale. Tom hauled manure  
all day.

(30)

1918 Cecil helping Kennedy  
Snow 14 today. Got three loads  
shale home. Took Tom Barth-  
wick to Oak Lake from Kennedy  
had my dinner there, and did  
not get home until dark. A  
nice evenin day.

" 15 A nice warm day and  
Sun shone bright & clear. Got  
one load shale foot of hill and  
two loads from Carpenter  
have the two east stables ready  
for cattle now. Cecil did Ken-  
nedy's chores and went to Oak  
Lake afternoon. Tom hauled  
manure over to Carey place all  
day.

" 16 A fine day very muddy & soft  
under foot. Got one load shale from  
Carpenter today. Bob got hog from  
H. Warren. Tom helped me to  
Oak Lake in express.

(31)

1918 A cold day but pleasant  
Nov 18 did not get home any. Tom  
took Jack & Ray out to Oak Lake  
and got them & had them drawn  
in amue after noon. Got ten head  
of Steers from Denton W. Gauff  
and paid him \$540.00 for them  
got one load gravel home from  
Carpenters and also got all our  
Storm cash w. Clarence Kennedy  
had flu this morn. & Cecil had  
to do all the chores there & Walter  
went to kennels.

" 19 A fine day but cold  
and freezing some all day. Walter  
& I went to Oak Lake forenoon  
& brought home a Holstein  
bullock that I got from Stonewall  
got gravel enough for stable  
and will get calves in to  
their own place tomorrow.

1918 A fine day but fra-  
zen so doubly wearing calder  
Cecil, Maggie Grace & Tom all  
went to Oak Lake afternoon  
in car. We got home four loads  
of straw from Seven &  
Peak behind stable

" 21 A cold day but  
clear & bright very cold  
tonight. Got home some straw  
today from Seven. Grace &  
Cecil went to Vester in  
car.

" 22 Thermometer down to  
zero this morn. but a fine clear  
day and pleasant to work. Took  
Maggie out to J. S. Little's and  
she stayed there as they have  
the flu. Got home some straw  
today from Seven & Cecil carried  
a load for a Carpenter

(33)

1918 A cold day last night  
Nov 23 so forty as it was windy  
from S.W. Got home two  
loads gravel from Carpenters  
and put them into her house  
Ralph, Grace & Muriel all  
went up to Revere & was  
vaccinated again for flu.  
and Grace has all symptom  
of flu due to inoculations.

" 24 A fine day Grace in bed  
all day Dr. Lundy came from Giov-  
anni & pronounced it flu and her  
temperature is  $103\frac{1}{2}$  I put mustard  
on all right and she is better.

" 25 A fine day again not  
cold Muriel took flu this morn.  
both she & Grace are in bed  
Dr. Lundy was out this after-  
noon. we are putting on mus-  
tard and Dr. don't anticipate  
any danger

(34)

1918 Yesterday was Sunday  
Nov 25 And Grace was in bed  
all day and was sick I sent to  
Giovanni for Dr. Lundy he  
pronounced it flu, we are treating  
her with mustard. Muriel also  
took the flu this morn and she  
is in bed upstairs. I sat  
up last night and attended  
to Grace this morn. Mrs. Green  
& Mrs. Kennedy came up and  
stayed all day and they  
stayed up tonight with she  
& Muriel

" 26 A fine warm day  
Put up two beds in parlor to-  
day and moved both girls  
down stairs. Muriel heats acting  
badly and we thought she would  
have collapsed last bed  
doctor here twice today Grace  
is better tonight

(35)

1918 A lovely day not cold  
Nov 27 and we had doors open  
part of the time. Kinnell had <sup>earache</sup>  
had night and her temperature  
Kept at 103 all night, I  
was bathing her & attending all  
night, Grace better and much  
better tonight. Doctor here twice  
today. R. Green took flu this  
afternoon and Dr. Andy  
took Cecil and to Oak Lake  
Hospital tonight as he has  
a bad attack.

" 28 a fine day and we had  
doors open quite a lot today  
Kinnell having a hard time  
with flu her head bad  
Grace doing well

(36)

1918 Another fine day but get-  
ten 29 very cold. Tom &  
Ralph took some hens & roosters  
out to Griswold & shipped to  
Swift, Canadian Co of Beef.  
Girls fine today.

" 30 A fine day but we have  
some snow now as it snowed  
some last night. Walter  
took flu at nine o'clock this  
morn. and went to bed. Grace  
got up today, and sat around.  
Mrs Churchill came out tonight  
from Oak Lake to help us and  
Mrs Andy from Griswold  
came also she is a trained nurse  
and the patients will get the  
care they ought to have.  
nearly six inches of snow  
fell today & last night

(37)

1918 Yesterday Sunday was  
Dec 2 a fine day so much  
Snow now has it ugly & slippery  
getting around buildings are  
still running and weather is  
unusually cold. Ralph took flu  
yesterday, he went to bed  
soar as he eat his dinner  
and all day today he was very  
lethargic went to Oak Lake  
this evening & brought home his  
Ranney a trained nurse  
he took Mrs Churchill out  
to Oak Lake and her family  
went home in afternoon

" 3 Patients all doing  
well but Hugo & Carl  
keep any thing or her sto-  
mach yet. A nice warm  
day, I crushed 28 bags  
this afternoon

(38)

1918 A fine day not cold  
Dec 4 but sun did not shine  
any dreary looking. Tom & I  
got chores done. Doctor  
Bob Lutherford here for  
dinner. Maggie called us up  
on phone for first time since  
she was sick at J. Hittles.  
Cecil also called us up.

" 5 Dark & dull all day and  
got colder towards night. I  
went to Griswold with cream  
can afternoon. Patients all bet-  
ter today.

" 6 A nice warm day. Went  
to Oak Lake had dinner at  
J. Hittles. Cecil there got out  
of hospital this morning, he & Hugh  
are getting better but we must  
get them home until Sunday.  
I got home a hen crate today

(39)

1918 A fine day and not  
Dec 7 cold. Doctor did not  
come today and the patients  
are doing well

" 9 A fine day but wind  
strong east and looks like  
snow. Reuben, Mat. buggie  
& Cecil home from Oak  
Lake this afternoon. I  
wrote out some news & rotted  
to Griswold and shipped  
to Swift Current in  
exp.

" 10 Snowing when we  
got up this morn. and kept
