1927 Nov 21. I finished plowing for oats
on Coney place at noon and tomorrow
with three horses three after noon.
Walter killed in oats all day. Ralph
finished plowing potatoes & hay in the
afternoon in the same field for some
time. The Webster's did not finish
Coney tonight.
Dinner, & a nice forenoon I commenced work
around plow with Ralph ahead of me
on Coney place & finished it this
Ralph got out of steam for heating
& I went down to the kitchen & legs
to dinner out there after dinner and
Walter killed in oats. It rained hard
at noon & could not till after I
went to the place in hay. Ralph
estimated the tax case field was
stable. Raining tonight we had fell
Walter could not work after to be
as hard was too wet

1927 Nov 22. Walter is 57 years and they are
some 2-3 but they were 10 years old they
he is not very well and has some stomach
for medical treatment. Ralph's plow
all day in oat field for hay. Walter
started forenoon and finished till
ing in oats after noon. Time all day
with wind south west the first wind
from that direction we have had for
a long time.
3 A very cold wind from north west
all day and feels like June tonight.
I plow in oat field for hay all day
Ralph plow until ten o'clock and
then commenced out on Coney place. Walter
started corn in the same field as still
I took to cart out last tonight & got
a first spring in.
4 A fine day saw some changes all
day but there was a very cold breeze
from south west. I finished plowing
sitting across for hay at noon
over

1927 and removed sets on Cay
place afternoon. Ralph's hollow
sets until soon a thin tree to col-
timate east eight for haley but
could not so we have to show
it again. Pratta removed ten
field over stable where corn is
corned and then he sealed some
haley in east eight for first day
we have found the 'year' haley
& two friends came up from West-
very tonight
June 6 A very fine day yesterday &
today the first summer days we
have had yet. I finished removing
sets on Cay place and then that
Ralph's place during in eight
sets of home. Pratta covered haley
there all day. We visited Thursday
tomorrow if it does not rain.

1927 We intended to begin Thursday
June 7 this day but we had a shower of
rain and did not start until evening. The
usual mile left home belt and
only for about ninety hundred of
what's the hole, it is in fine slope
down and shakes well. I now do
in east eight for now and Pratta
dilled in haley. A strong change from
north west all day but it is east
as we go to bed

" 8 A real hot day regular summer for
first time. We finished Thursday's work
at eleven o'clock and of the noon Ralph
got home rain and cleared up haley
Pratta dilled in haley on east eight
and I now do there.

" 9 A strong north west wind all day
and other fields like first tonight. I now
do on east eight all day and Clarence
Remigio now removed at our haley all
day and Pratta covered Clarence's
over

1929 Ralph went to Cart Lake in wagon
forenoon and fire stable & school
afternoon

June 10 A cold water was laid out
it was a cold day so we did
not share all the time. When shoe
was cast right for barley all day
Walter walked in barley all day.
Ralph came home, fire stable
and school around. Maggie Grace
went to Walter's did visit Mrs. Miller
and tonight Maggie, Grace & Walter
went to a musical meeting in St
Allans hall.

" 11 A fine day and sun alone nearly
all day but there was a cold breeze
from southwest. I finished drying
in east night and Walter came
barley there all day. Ralph came
and shared around. Boys went
out to Cart Lake tonight

1929 A fine summer day warm and
June 13 Good growing day. Walter finished
drying barley about ten o'clock and
then hauled out the corn, when he
went up to Cart Lake to see how
corn plants got on. Little time I
plowed about lunch and end of day
field (the east side) and then went
to Cart Lake and plowed a long
there. Ralph had in garden and
ran cultivator on a piece of barley
ground. Maggie & I went to Cart Lake
tonight got corn, plants, feed.

" 14 I plowed corn and hauled some
barley in wagon to Cart Lake today. Walter
went to Cecil's finished seeding his
corn. Ralph finished haying today
today. A hot day.

" 15 A very fine day Walter ran cultivator
in field on Cart Lake all day. Ralph
& I got all straw sack of home thing
a screen door and put fly screen on
our

1927 Wm. Lewis, also got some heavy snow
in garden, rain changed around &
some cleared & some of barley on
ready for last year tomorrow.
Walter Lewis's license here for tea
June 16 a warm day but it was cloudy
at times we had some thunder and
some heavy rain passed over especially
to the south, we did not have any
I took last barley to last year from
it graded to 4 & sold for 43¢ per
sheaf. Walter helped George Smith
to check and he finished his what
Ralph ran calculator on every
place in follow. I cleared what
reaped in garden after noon

* 17 a nice day had some
thunder and a lot of rain most
evening, we got a small shower
near night. Walter ran calculator &
harrow on every place all day on
follow. Ralph cut six beams with

1927 Wm. Lewis and Fred in garden, I finished
clearing what & checked in garden and
reaped three or 4 of stable.

June 18 a hot day a lot of showers went
around and we had a small shower
near night but it rained very heavily
on the east of last year. Walter saw
for J. he showed all day, Ralph fin-
ished calculating the first row of
follow on every place and also har-
rowed it. I took last wheat that
take forenoon, & helped Ralph
sketch some more at noon or there
about many trees on the stable.
Walter went about 1/2 mile long & what
day he stayed out with him.
June 20 a very hot clear day a very
heavy shower & lightning storm passed
east of us there must have been
a very heavy rain, we got no rain
that but at 5:30 in evening we got
a very heavy rain in that day

1927 Thursday & lightning. Went
a big one to Suckas to the hills
foreman & Ralph took a swim
out and she was shipped to
Wgt. Penick after the same time
Ralph met her on lawn, and
showed, Walter has cultivated
in forty acres west of home,
Evel had her for dinner & dinner
Came after dinner.

June 21st A heavy shower of rain this
morning but the lanes of hay are slow
drying bright and wind blew strong
from north west. Walter clipped at
shades all day. Ralph's dog was up
found some thin school for
worms in afternoon & showed through
in south east forty acres, and
Ralph spread manure on Crag
place. Boys & went out to a
meeting in car to the church
Sunday

1927 A fine day hot at times
June 22 but pleasant, I finished
plowing along to S.W. 40 acres and

"23 A fine day wind was all day,

then took a load of water to car
here.

"24 Still and hot looking all day and the
sun coming about three o'clock and wind
a bit. I took the loads to the car
here got very wet coming home after the

mine on Coney place.
June 25 A very hot clear day. Rabbit
& Walter spent mine on Coney
place all day. I found brown
skinned & black in trees forenoon and
in afternoon went to Oak Lake in
region and brought home a
pig. That piglet had killed
the rooster I got in Walter's house
yesterday. Grace had her Sunday.
School class here for a picnic
today, Grace and boys are gone
to Oak Lake tonight.

" 27 A very hot day also some thun-
der and lightning but we did not
get any rain although a lot of
rainfall. I had in garden Rabbit
cucumber in week forty all day
young runner John Brown the
fan today and he eat sweet

1927 Colder on Coney place all day
Walter went to Oak Lake with box
of wheat and stayed a night
Barn Spr. building.
June 28 Clear day in Brownie
today. Walter went to Redwood
valley, buried home, and then
cultivated potatoes. Rabbit for-
gotten cultivating in week field
& then went to Coney place & water
cultivated there. John the runner
cut some sweet corn then
cut pig pasture and was
cleaning away north of stable
& took land today. Oak Lake
afternoon that is the last year
we have to sell of 1926 crop
" 29 A fine day. Sun alone my
hot and a nice breeze from South
west. I had sweet-corn all day
on Coney place and got all the pig
tears some that was cut next up
and

1923 John the Russian ran Cult-
tivation with six horses on fallow on
every place all day. Raphael returned

got home one silver that Raphael
had potatoes after now. Walter ran
cultivation in corn. A very bad
storm of thunder & lightning tonight
