

1929 Ruthven plowed in south  
Sept 27 forty acres all day as it  
was too wet to cultivate. Walter  
enriched and chored and also  
finished getting in all potatoes  
from 21 I went to Cart Lake store  
went in express & brought home  
our share of hay that night  
Killed & laid out in down after-  
noon. Leila & Maggie went to  
George Smiths for tea. Very dark  
tonight and a few drops of  
rain falling.  
"25 Did not rain much last night  
but it was very cold all day and  
wind north east. Walter finished  
wheat to Cart Lake. I plowed in  
south forty all day. Ruthven  
finished cultivating fallow to-  
night  
"26 Sun slow wind all day, but  
still it was cold and a cool

1929 breeze from N.E. all day. Walter  
took his bands wheat to Cart Lake  
today. Ruthven harrowed the downy  
on every place all day. I plowed in  
south forty. Willard Smith, wife  
& baby here for dinner.  
Sept 29 a dull day and it rained through  
noon. all afternoon very light but the  
did not take teams out to work. I  
plowed forenoon and wrote after noon  
Walter took his wheat to Cart Lake.  
forenoon and enriched after. Ruthven  
win harrowed on every place forenoon  
and enriched after, as horses now  
away & horse harrow.  
"30 Rain of yesterday did not wet  
ground very much deep. Ruthven  
plowed in forty acre field near Dret-  
dgers all day. I plowed in south  
forty and finished it. Walter took  
some sweet clover seed to Ruthven's  
have him clean it forenoon and

1929 after noon he took a load of wheat to Car's place,

Sept 30 A fine day and plowed in South west forty. Ruthven plowed three other acres and then removed on Carey place. Walter took care last of his Ruvers wheat today

Oct 1st A very hot day and the rose flies no longer the horses a lot in afternoon for the first time in a month. Ruthven's removed

all day on Carey place. I plowed in forty near Ruvers all day. Walter went to Car's place in evening. There to receive for hay and some there for sale, then returned to Ruthven. J. H. Donald also his wife and sister here afternoon today.

" 2 A very warm day and had to put some oats in horse grain. Ruthven finished removing on Carey place in afternoon in forty

1929 near Ruvers all day. Ruthven in afternoon began to work on Carey place. Cecil brought in his potatoes here in afternoon. Walter went to Day Smith's for that day, we thought that there for 75.00

Oct 3 I plowed near Ruvers all day. Ruthven's out south on Carey place and Walter went for hay grain. A fine day and not so warm as yesterday

" 4 A fine day and plowed in south west forty acres all day. Walter went to Day Smith's for load of hay and Ruthven's out south on Carey place. I came up from Ruvers today on train's load was out for hay, well by Ruvers today.

" 5 A cool dull day it rained a little in afternoon but nothing worth while. Walter's out load of hay on Carey place in morning then was

1929 Don't have a home for dinner. Walter  
eaten had afternoon, splored in S. W.  
forty and Rasthans out through on  
Coney place  
Dex by a fine day facing out but  
pleasant out saw alone all day  
and Rasthans out could on  
Coney place. I went to Brimwell  
forenoon to see W. C. Lewis and  
afternoon Walter, buried and went  
to holly hantony's funeral,

will leave Brimwell for it on Friday.  
Lottie having a little cold night as we  
went to bed and still coughing some  
when we got up this morning, it had  
also moved some during night and  
coats of ground was thro' way. That is  
why I kept plowing. Rasthans plowed  
all day, he heard, Walter went to  
Walter for Carter Rice cleaver  
very good & clean all day  
" I stopped plowing in west field  
at noon, have about ten acres of it  
plowed and in afternoon saw showed  
to Don Lake in Car. Walter cleared  
we learned some Round wheat today.

1929 and also got home two boxes of poles from Croy place. Ruthven's car would in Croy place all day.

Oct 12. Minutes in home with room and in afternoon went to meeting of the workers in N. S. S. A. Mr. Wapnie is going to Kopenia as delegate. Walter went to the meeting for a part of day. Ruthven's car to park in Croy place. Very hard frost last night with a nice clear day.

" 16 I left home for bridge Park last Monday. The 17 and visitors there until today when I came home, had a nice time there, they had a lot of snow and there found to very much and very one in fall blowing and roads are shaly out of it. Ruthven's car wheels cutting gravel on the Croy place and Walter has

1929 been hauling home wood from there we will not have to buy any wood this year. Weather fine and warm. Wapnie got out of the log today. Walter and I went to Hanning found the paper tonight.

Oct 19 A very warm day nearly like July. Ruthven's car gravel on Croy place all day, Walter was digging out our roots there also. Karrison, Kelly, Walter and I went to a meeting in St. Paul church in Brainerd tonight.

" 18 I did not do much today not feeling very well, Walter dug out our roots on Croy place and Ruthven's car gravel there all day, a lovely warm day.

" 19 A very fine day only a little rain fell in morning but not much. Ruthven's car gravel on Croy place. Walter went to the lake and was dog's tails big down day. Grace, Ruby and I went to Brainerd to see Grand Division married.

1929 a fine day. Walter & Gene  
Dec 21<sup>st</sup> went to home last yesterday  
and went to bed with brown

I did cooking and was around  
house all day. Ruthen's was filling  
sand on Long place

" 22 A fine day again, Walter & Gene  
for beer from home but about  
four o'clock, Ralph also came  
up from Reunung. Ruthen's but  
could on Long place for home  
two loads of paper. I began to plan  
near school after dinner

" 23 I plowed near school all day  
Walter & Ruthen's but could  
and they cut last roots on Long  
place. A fine day

" 24 I plowed forenoon near school  
and in afternoon I went to last lake  
in car. Walter & Ruthen's worked in  
bluff on Long place forenoon and  
in afternoon Ruthen's plowed

1929 near school and Walter went to  
Reunung with Ralph, the latter came  
up at noon. Last year last night but  
a nice warm day.

" 25 A very fine day. I plowed near  
school forenoon then began to work to  
last lake after noon. Ruthen's day  
out onto on Long place forenoon &  
plowed after noon. Walter still at  
Reunung.

" 26 A fine clear day but a strong  
wind from west, I plowed nearly  
home all day. Ruthen's day out  
out onto on Long place all day. Walter  
Ralph came up from Reunung today  
then went to school by dinner & took a  
center their classes down with them.

" 28 Snowing & blowing hard from  
north east when we got up the morn-  
ning and kept as it all day, snow  
drifted three feet deep in places  
and a bad hoar-frost. But all

1929 horses and cattle in stable today for first time this fall killed three deer & three fawns today. Still blowing so we go to bed but no snow falling now

Oct 29 Snow fell nearly all day but not much felt although I shall not wonder if there is a foot or less now. It was not tall.

Event around today

Oct 30 The bees we had had all Summer John Secor said left this morning after putting in some months with no special bees. I went to get some in wagon afternoon and brought home some lumber to repair stable, Walter came up from Reunow on train and brought him home. Skinned a little today but made very sloppy and very little snow was seen

1929 Snowed nearly all day and Oct 31 we have nearly a foot on level now it was not cold but very disagreeable Walter went out late in afternoon and brought back one from G. Miller can wagon down very hard in snow and he took four horses for 27.10 pounds home

Nov 1st A fine day and snow got very soft and went away a lot Walter went for load of cord again with four horses, also got some lumber and boxes of furniture, Friday bought a fishing wheel & Goodwin here for tea

Oct 22 a fine day and very soft and a little but went away very little also. John went to get to Cary Lake and he went to 1929 by 12.30 train expects to be back about Friday. My K. (Scott) had some snow with Walter comes back

1929 A fine day now very hot at  
San Antonio, but there was a cold  
wind from N.W. all day, snow

" I A call came from south west all

came up from *Myk* today brought no  
fine *Myk* and a lot of other birds.  
" I Wind strong from south west all day  
and saw *Myk* in fox *Myk*  
towards evening. *Myk* took the *Myk*

" *Myk* the *Seotimus* left at two o'clock  
after being here 3 1/2 days. *Myk* *Myk*.  
" *Myk* (*Myk*) have for dinner.  
" I A nice warm day and *Myk* *Myk*

1929 A fine day, covered a very

all done and have a nice pile of  
wood. Carl has a load home with  
him. Ralph went to car house at noon  
in car, took out two loads to be  
taken.

" 16 A very warm day and soon after  
four o'clock, a lot of snow. Ralph  
and Walter went to J. Smith's for load  
of barley. He has two thousand hills  
left up soon. I sharpened saw  
went down to Linnwood after noon

1929 Reppel chased around the  
room and Walter Cusack

Jan 18 A very heavy snow storm and  
Blizzard came over here so the  
last night we did not last by  
and not much left. Cecil is  
staying here for dinner & night  
that there home in case they  
come down with us down  
Crawford, A fine day today and  
not cold but is kept steady  
all day. Reppel & I walked  
to Bramton and attended  
a demonstration of pure seal  
farming course. Came home to-  
night, a little snow on  
road but they were smooth  
and good

" 19 A cold wind from the  
west all day. Cleared seal wharf  
for shipment to Regina Railway  
at 49 barrels cleared will

Jan 20 A cold day before this  
morning and everything frozen up.  
Walter has had seal wharf to  
late afternoon and shipped to  
Culberg & Davis. We cleared by

" 21 A very cold day had Phillips  
came for 30 barrels of seal wharf  
today and we also received 289.25  
from Mr. St. Douglas of Hartley  
for 130 barrels of wharf to be sent  
him in January and by to hold it.  
Cecil came today got a load of seal  
baggage all frozen up this way.  
And it was sent before we got  
them frozen

" 22 A very cold day and we had a  
fine heavy snow fall that was very  
much felt. Cleared seal wharf all  
day. V. Montgomery came today a

1919 paid us 408<sup>00</sup> for coal  
what.

Jan 23<sup>rd</sup> Cleared some under seat.  
today, also saw ice some, but  
I have went to last part in  
ear after noon. Had snow  
down stairs today but  
not under feet.

" 25 A dull day and it snowed  
several times at night & not much  
fell. Ralph & I cleared what  
I know and it all to some Ralph  
got that up stairs, and I cleared  
out the horse and pig pens.  
Walter went out with 33 bundles  
what to get horse after noon  
I think, have some coal, but  
very cold but snow was disa-  
storable

" 26 A nice snow day and snow  
what some. Cleared coal what  
with Carter three all day, boys

1919 also finished today the balance  
of my wood. It would be fine  
if it were for my collar than  
it was today.

Jan 27 A fine day but very cold but  
it showed a few changes of snow  
in fact some snow has fallen every  
day this week. Thimble stomach  
all at last what we went to clean  
today at noon, I did some scrubbing  
after noon, burning collar trough,  
at night & we had some snow since  
dark also. Boys got the beds of  
wood up

" 28 A cold day regular January weather  
Gordon Henny came at noon and took  
the Carter three clean away. Boys got  
load what's also got three loads of  
wood up to house, Lawrence Henny  
got mail today

" 29 A fine day cold but not too  
but it is cold for this time of

1929 Near. Walter's I went to Deer  
Lake in cutter after noon there  
was a good meeting there that  
Walter, a standard and I had other  
business. The first time we  
have slept in cutter out  
for 30 but so cold today that it  
snowed from north east all day  
afternoon, not much fell but  
it kept steady at it. Now  
went to Deer Lake with Charlie  
in cutter after noon  
Dec 2 A cold day so below zero  
when we got up this way, and a  
strong south west wind all day  
and a little snow tonight. Boys  
took our heavy top to Deer Lake  
today, they averaged 192 pounds  
apiece, and they bought a team  
of drivers from Deer Lake

1929 A very fine day not cold but  
Dec 3 Clear. Walter done his  
work up to noon and then

4 A fine day and not cold the

noon. Boys & I tried to go to bottom  
" A dull day no wind some with  
noon when it began to storm  
from south west and he got  
at it soon falling all the time we  
took wheels off buggy & got in into  
it. Grace and Ralph went out

1929 to Carl Larin in Custer & the  
two at Aunt Higgins' B.C. At home  
over too, it was very stormy & dark  
but they had no trouble.

Dec 6 Steam pretty hard, nearly  
all night but it was a fine  
day, they said it was very nice  
I think a steam that all day  
& pleasure some from today  
and says should. Walter's  
go up to the oil tonight in  
Custer.

" 7 A fine day, but cold. Walter  
went to the oil, but in the end  
took because he had to see to  
how the others were. He helped  
them fix some, he got home  
at 9.30.

" 9 A fine day and fairly cold.  
Killed fine burkys forenoon and  
from home after noon. Boys got  
about under steam from

was unusual meeting of Open Society  
today. One Wallace from south

1929 Ralph and I have gone to  
Dec 16 a small yesterday a fairly cold  
day. Today was fairly cold but not  
bad and a slight breeze from west  
and just it is now blowing from

with Cameron and is staying helping  
him clear shims.

17 A very nice day here it was  
thirty below for the day, down  
Walter went to Camp Blue in water  
Cameron. He'll come down from  
Basin's store up on ridge. There  
was a ~~lot~~ of snow today 5 for the  
children for Christmas tree. Very  
cold tonight.

18 Very cold this day. Snow is now 37  
below zero and the same in. Clear all day  
and clear tonight. Walter went to  
Lake of tomorrow for mail he also got  
home a load of shims.

1929 A very cold morning now  
Dec 19<sup>th</sup> some light snow all  
day but it kept very frosty. Walter  
got load of cat-steps today.  
Children from school are practicing

fog in afternoon. Very nice all day. Was  
very frosty at night. Walter went to  
buy some apples. I went to  
buy some milk. The school

" 21 A cold clear day almost but  
cold. Walter got load when Stan  
from Camp place today. Ralph  
came home from Ceils today  
" 22 A cold day Ralph went to the

one came up from Brandon in early  
hours. No school all day

1929 A fine day but the cold was a

1929 A nice warm day finally  
 Dec 27 very frost. Ralph went to  
 Car Lake at noon and brought  
 Mrs W. C. and the three girls  
 out & they stayed the afternoon  
 and had supper, we had a  
 pleasant time. Walter took them  
 back after one o'clock. Betty is  
 would not stay so warm as  
 this for balance of winter  
 " 28 A very fine day a slight wind  
 from west all day, it hardly froze  
 any last night. Boys for last when  
 stream today. Walter went to Car Lake  
 afternoon attempted a meeting of his  
 club there, the two girls went out  
 with him.  
 " 30 Went up to Church Spectator  
 it was a very fine day and snow  
 melted a little. Today very fine  
 again and snow melted a little, some  
 bare patches coming in fields. Boys

1919 Got a load of wheat straw to-  
 day. Bridgman came & took Sam  
 away.  
 Dec 31. Ceil & family came down for  
 dinner & took today after dinner Ceil  
 & Lucretia to Car Lake, he went to see  
 Aunt Higgins & Lucretia to Noyes for  
 Amble. A nice day and not cold  
 " 1930 A very warm day and a nice day was  
 cold, Walter went up to Ceil & Lucretia  
 had had their clean pair and tonight  
 Lucretia & Lucretia went out to Car Lake  
 in order to see how well and well  
 Smith and Ralph is going on to Car  
 tonight, Lucretia went to Car Lake with  
 B. Mike had night & went to Henry  
 where to look to see to meet her, she  
 expects to leave Brandon on Thursday  
 day for the evening  
 " 20 A fine day again and Walter did  
 all the chores alone as Ralph  
 went to Brandon last night

1930. Starting very hard when we  
saw 3 got up this morning, so that  
we could not see higher and it

1930 A cold day again. The clear  
Jan 20 and bright. Walter went to

Car here afternoon took out  
eight barrels wheat & shipped  
to grain dock, & put home a

load of feed barley put in from  
good at \$1.51, per bushel,

" 21 Ralph, Grace & I got up at  
four thirty this morning & dis-  
tanced in to the range speaker  
after notable men at the after-  
noon of London Conference on

disarmament, A nice clear day  
but pretty frosty, and a slight wind
