Sun Dec 4: A very mild day but cloudy and foggy most of day. Walter, Muriel, Bea and I to church in car this A. M. while Mother looked after Doreen. Bea & I up home for dinner & home here at 2.30 P.M. I up home again at 5 P.M. to milk.

Mon Dec 5: Another mild cloudy day. Did chores this morning & then I went to town in wagon this aft and got 1400 lbs of briquette coal. Home at 6.30 P.M. Cecil down home this aft. & worked at pump behind granary but did not get it all out. Started to snow at 4.30 P.M. and quite a little fell before 9 P.M.

Tue Dec 6: Another beautiful day mild and bright. We did chores this morning and I got roosters up to home ready for starving until to morrow when will kill ready for Thanksgiving morning. Twelve of them. Galt & I took sack of straw and burned

brush on the road west of school. Bill & Doris Debeck's two children here in car at 8 P.M. and stayed until 10 P.M. A lovely moonlight night.

Fri Dec 7: Another lovely bright warm day. He went up home this AM and worked at roasting until 3 P.M. killing 5 for mothers & six for us. Six birds got out so brought them home. Cleaned out stable after 7 P.M. Muriel & Walter out to skate tonight in car.

Satur Dec 8: Skipped school this AM with Virden cream truck. Cecil down to pump this AM. Hatt & I did chores & I came down here & unloaded coal. Then Hatt & I burned brush on the road this aft. Muriel & Bea over to Ruby's to missionary meeting this aft. A dull cloudy day but mild & fairly warm.

Fri Dec 9: Quite warm and nice nice all day although quite a strong wind from west and cooler tonight. Did chores this AM while I brought down 4 bags chicken feed & took same load of sweet clover hay & wagon with which I had hauled coal. Hatt & I went on road burning brush this aft & finished tonight at 5:30 P.M. A lovely evening bright & moonlight.

Sat Dec 10: A colder day & a few snow flurries this aft. Hatt & I did chores this AM & then went to school & put on 3 storm windows on north side of school. Muriel Walter Bea & I went out to town in car this aft. Walter & I went to pool meeting while I curled - winning 11-6. Home at 5:30 P.M. in light snow flurry. A lovely afternoon.

Sunday Dec 11: A fairly nice day. Walt
Marcell & I to church this A.M. while
Bea stayed at home with baby. Stayed
home this aft & evening. A very nice
day.

Monday Dec 12: A little colder
to day with wind from S.W. Walt chose
this A.M. & got feed from barn fire
Took home load of sweet clover hay
& one of straw. Bea up home washing
the left. Ground icy but not much
snow.

Tuesday Dec 13: Took washing up
done this morning, Bea went up this
aft and washed. Walt & I came down
here this aft with rock & got a load of
shells & a load of straw. A moderate day
with wind from west. Walt down to
A. Carpenter's 1/4 in valley and cut

Wed Dec 14: wood all aft. I took
13 roosters up home in wagon this A.M.
& then came down this aft & split wood
all aft long. Then Milne up home for
supper. Colder to day & pretty chilly tonight.

Thurs Dec 15: A very much finer
day with wind from west. We were up
home for dinner & killed and dressed 19
roosters ready for census truck tomorrow
morning. (13 for us here & 6 for home flock)
Walt & Marcell out to skate in ear
tonight.

Fri Dec 16: Census truck took chicken
this morning. We cleaned out 2 days manure
this A.M. Walt left early for A. Carpenter's
bush & got home at 5 P.M. I split wood
at up home all aft. Two lads called with
fish & we got \$5 & worth. Colder
tonight and snowing lightly as we go to bed.

Friday Dec 16: About an inch of snow fell last night but not a bad day & almost melting at noon. Half away cutting wood again early today while I split wood up home. Mr & Mrs Tolbeck & Mary up here from 3 P.M. until 9:15 P.M. in car. A lovely evening and turning warmer again.

Sat Dec 17: A fairly cold day but wind strong from west. Did chores this AM. and then, Uncle T. D. and I away to town at 12:15. I curled the aft - coming at 9:30. Walt attended Pepp. Society meeting and just in president home at 4 P.M. A warmer evening.

Sun Dec 18: Sue & I drove in car at 11 A.M. with Walter & Muriel, and then up home for dinner. Home here at 2:30 P.M. and for rest of day. Spent afternoon addressing Christmas cards. A lovely day & mild tonight.

Mon Dec 19: A lovely fairly warm day. Did chores this A.M. while Walt cleaned pipes. Split wood up home this aft while Walt & Walter went to town in car. Walter out to town in car again tonight to state. Brandon & Sue agent around this aft. Muriel over to school to train children this aft.

Tues Dec 20: Walt went to bush the aft while I split wood over home. Got 10 eggs today. Decorated house tonight for Christmas. A little cooler to-day but very nice.

Wed Dec 21: A lovely bright day. I killed three roosters here this A.M. & then went over home and did a few chores. I then went curling in town - in car and home at 6:30 P.M. Walter waxed floor this aft. Four of us to Xmas tree at Harvey school tonight.

Thur Dec 22: A lovely bright day. Did chores this A.M. No school today so did not light fire. Mrs & Mrs H. Dampf came at noon and traded live turkeys for gobblers. I helped Hs Milne fix up school after last night's concert (take down platform etc.). Walter ready to bush and now has $5\frac{2}{3}$ cords cut. A little cooler tonight. He bathed tonight before retiring.

Friday Dec 23: A very nice day, calm but cloudy. Did chores this A.M. Walter chopped wood this aft and finished down in P. Cupat bush. I hauled a load of straw from the barn here, up home. Finished chores at home at 6:15 P.M. & then came home to prepare for going to Kenney tomorrow.

Sat Dec 24: Dad chores this A.M. and got car ready. Then Bea & I away to Kenney in car arriving there at 2:30 P.M. Into Brandon then with Mr. Pollock in Plymouth & back to Kenney at 6 P.M.

Snowed a little this A.M. but a very nice day. Dark & cloudy & like snow as we go to bed.

Sun Dec 25: Christmas day & snowing and storming all day. All visitors expected could not come so home with Pollocks for Christmas dinner tonight. Bill Pollock, Jacks, Firs & Rozelle all intending to be down but could not. Turning colder

Mon Dec 26: A cold day but storm almost abated. Mr. Pollock tried to get to highway with car but stuck in snowbank so I put our car in sled & Mr. Pollock took me to train tonight leaving Bea and Dorcas at Kenney for a few days until weather gets better. Oliver Nowall on train & Walter met us in cutter arriving here at 12 A.M. Snow 3 feet deep in places. Temperature down to 20° below zero

Tues Dec 27: Slept up home and ate there & will continue to do so until Bea comes home. Went down to stoke up fires & gather eggs three times to day. We did chores this A.M. and I got down feed the aft and shelter left at 3 P.M. for Taylor for supper. I did chores & to bed at 9:15 P.M. Bitingly cold again tonight. six eggs today

Wed Dec 28: Did chores again this A.M. and went down to my place 3 times to look after fire etc. Got out rock shingle this aft. Horses did not come in last night but in tonight. Very cold tonight with wind from N.W.

Thurs Dec 29: Very cold today and so little done. Shelter feeling very tough with bad cold. Started getting shingles ready for rack. I went over to my place 3 times again

to look after fire & poultry. Six eggs today. Oliver & Muriel got up to Rubys for cutter night for supper. Bea phoned me from Kenney tonight.

Friday Dec 30: Cold this A.M. but warmer this afternoon and snowing lightly. Clear this eve. Gall & I got in big load of oat hay this (oats). Mrs. Leo drove and flew here this aft for 3 hrs. A nice clear night.

Saturday Dec 31: A much milder day with horrid from the west. Started doing chores this P.M. when Bea phoned from Kenney that she was coming on bus. So I left at 11:15 for town with train in cutter. Bea & I had dinner at Uncle T.J.s & then home fire at 4:30 P.M. A lovely evening. Oliver & Muriel came down and got things warmed up.

Sunday Jan 1: A lovely day. Cecil and family down to Mother's for noon dinner. Bea stayed at home with baby who has slight cold while I went up to Mother's for noon dinner. Jim, Jean, Ina, Cecil, & I down at 3 P.M. here until 5 P.M. A lovely moonlight evening tonight and everything cozy. Mr. Baillie did the morning at 4 A.M.

Mon Jan 2: Storming and snowing this morning and kept it up practically all day. Raked the manure in the yard, Hattie picked wheat samples this aft. Maril & Oliver down here this aft. & then Hattie down for supper. All of them went home at about 10.30 P.M. Snow ceased at that time.

Tue Jan 3: Dark and cloudy all day with wind from south east. Did chores that Hattie took Oliver to train at 12.30 P.M. I brought

rack here and got load of straw & took it up home. Hattie attended Mr. Baillie's funeral service but home at 4.30 P.M. Not cold but cloudy & an odd flake of snow tonight.

Wed Jan 4: A beautiful warm day today. Did chores this morning and lighted fire at school for first time since before holidays. Maril & I left for town at 1 P.M. where I curled & lost the game again. Edythe French arrived this aft. from Madison. Hat to stay a couple of days. Brought home a battery for radio tonight. A beautiful warm evening and almost full moon.

Thurs Jan 5: Another lovely day. I did chores this A.M. and got half two jugs of sweet clover leaves into loft this aft. I came down here at 5 P.M. & got good clothes in bag & Bea & Oliver and went up home for supper. A lovely time

and home at 9.30 P.M. Full moon tonite

Friday Jan 6: Mild again today. Walter took Edith Soule to 2:15 P.M. train and went to Brandon himself to have dentistry done. Edith went to Sudbury Ont. Walter will return by 11 P.M. train. I shovelled snowdrift out of ice-house up home this aft. Glen Milne stayed at our place after 4 P.M. until 7 P.M. Doreen coughed 15 lbs 4 oz. tonight. Dark & cloudy all day.

Sat Jan 7: A nice mild day again with wind from E. S. Cloudy this A.M. but bright this aft. About 15° above zero. I cleaned out our ice house here this aft while Walter fixed harness and lashed window and then at 4.30 left for Mrs Taylor's for supper. A lovely evening.

Sun Jan 8: A beautiful day. Went up home to Mother with Doreen in sleigh at 3.30 P.M. and stayed until 8.30 P.M. Walter away to Mrs Smiths for supper tonight. Walter milked his cows tonight but I did chores after supper.

Mon Jan 9: A lovely mild day most of day but a little cooler this evening. Did farm W.W. all day. Walter took Mother up to Cecils this afternoon where she will stay a few days. I got in a load of wheat straw into loft this aft. Brought up home all aft to help with washing. I brought her home in hay rack at 4.30 P.M. A cloudy evening.

Tues Jan 10: A fairly cold day but not severe. Did chores this A.M. and got sleigh ready to haul manure and put sleigh box on manure sleigh ready to haul ice.

Walter and I down to river in sleigh this aft & got twelve blocks of ice. Home at 5 P.M. did chores up before supper. Walter ~~saw~~ and Maribel away to Hompey's to single folks crocodile party.

Wed Jan 11: A colder (20° below zero this morning) day but milder this aft. Walter & I put down load of ice in ice house this A.M. and didn't go clean out stable. Walter got load of ice this aft. I left at 11:30 A.M. for Oak Lake to curl taking Anne Milne. Home at 5:25 P.M. and Walter home shortly after. A nice night.

Thurs Jan 12: A mild calm ^{cloudy} day. We took out 2 days manure finishing at 12:30 P.M. Walter went for ice at 1:45 P.M. Bea & I up home this aft. Seven women there to first course. I cleaned out pigs and put down ice

and did odd jobs. Walter home at 6 P.M. and we both finished up milking before I left snowing and blowing at times.

Fri Day Jan 13: Put down load of ice this A.M. and Walter got another load this aft. Maribel went up to Cudly this aft with team in cutter and brought Mother home at 5:30 P.M. A mild cloudy day with a light fall of snow. I did odd jobs etc. aft mending door lock etc.

Sat Jan 14: Quite a little cooler this evening. Did chores this A.M. and Walter ~~went~~ went taking streets T.S. to town to what Pool & seed grocer's meeting. I put ice in ice house & packed with sand dust. Did milking before I left for home this evening.

Sun Jan 15: 30° below zero this A.M. and bright and cold all day but calm. Uncle V. C. up to Hompp's for 12 P.M. dinner Walter took him up in cutter with team. Then Walter away to Taylor's for supper at 4 P.M. I did chores up home and arrived here for supper at 7 P.M.

Mon Jan 16: 32° below zero this A.M.
did chores this A.M. and got in a
load of oat hay and a load of straw
from here for team up home. Both
of us up home to do chores this evening.
A great deal warmer this evening.

Tues Jan 17: 24° below zero this morning
and a little warmer this evening. Did chores
this morning and in the aft I killed
& Bea helped pick five chickens. I then went
up home & mended Walter's coat.

Cleaned seed cabinet for snow. Mother & Maric planning on going to Brandon tomorrow where Mother will undergo medical treatment.

Wed Jan 18: I took Mother & Maric to
train this morning and home at 1 P.M. Walter
did chores this A.M. and cleaned seed cabinet
this aft. I mended Walter's coat. Warmer
this aft but dark & cloudy tonight like snow.
Walter & Uncle Tom alone over home tonight.

Thurs Jan 19: A very nice day. I left
with Burney & Mac at 1 P.M. for river & brought
home load of ice lins at 5 P.M. Walter went to
town with Burney at 2 P.M. & got Mother and
Maric off of bus and home at 4 P.M. Mother
feeling much better. A lovely evening. Bea
made 8 lbs butter this aft.

Friday Jan 20: A little cooler today with wind from north. Spent afternoon putting ice down and pouring water on it. Shirley Carpenter here after 4 P.M. for supper. Then Clara & Irene here for evening and played crochole. A lovely evening. Walter cleaned wheat for show all afternoon

Sat Jan 21: A stormy day but cleared up enough this afternoon. I fixed kettle & trees this aft while Walter cleaned show wheat. Bed baked bread today. Very cold tonight but cozy in house.

Sun Jan 22: At home most of day but Bea, Doreen and I up home for supper. Not very cold but blowing a little from N.W. and drifting a little most of day. Home at 9 P.M.

Mon Jan 23: Another mild day with wind from N.W. Took out two day manure this A.M. I went to town this aft in slush and got 2200 lbs of meal & 1500 lbs of beef from Knights. Home at 6 P.M. Miss Wilson up home for supper. A very nice evening. Walter cleaned wheat sample all aft.

Tues Jan 24: Another nice day and partly cloudy. I brought coal doores here this A.M. and unloaded it. Then Walter & I got in fed this aft - a load of oat hay and a load of straw from down here. A very nice evening. Shirley Carpenter got crochole board here this morning.

Wed Jan 25: A much milder day. Walter spent day in doing chores and doing up books in house. I left for town at 11 A.M. and cecled two games - winning one and losing one. Home at 6:15 P.M. Bea over home for noon dinner & washed there this aft.

Friday Jan 26: Much milder today. Deb chores this A.M. and went to ride this aft and got a load of ice. Walter did books again this aft. Bea did ironing this aft.

Saturday Jan 27: A lovely day again, bright & fairly warm. Walter down to valley and got load of cord wood (about $\frac{1}{2}$ cord) while I broke up blocks of ice and put them in ice house. Elaine came here after school while Ruby and George came at 6 P.M. for supper. Spent a very enjoyable evening. Jessie Tomp and Hazel short visiting Muriel this aft.

Sat Jan 28: A little colder today but calm and clear. I cleaned out henhouse here and put 25 pails of water in ice well here. Walter to town this afternoon and I will be away for the evening. I did all chores at home & am home here at 9 P.M.

Sunday Jan 29: Snowed lightly most of day but stopped somewhat this aft so Bea and I took baby & up home for supper. Anna Milne chd for part of the afternoon. She came home at 8.30 P.M. Cleared of tonight but blowing a little.

Monday Jan 30: I cleaned out stable this morning while Walter went to Graceland and got Dr. Purdie. Muriel took him back this afternoon while Walter and I put up a load of sweet Clover in loft. A very nice day moderately cold but roads heavy with fresh fallen snow. Baby had cold in head last night and today but not serious. Mother's condition not changed much.

Tues Jan 31: A cold day - stormy this aft strong wind from east. Home early for dinner & then Walter & I got load of straw

from down here this aft. Geo Smith down
here this aft in cutter with Ruby. Geo Milne
brought mail this aft. A stormy evening.

Wed Feb 1: Strong breezes from N.E.
North and N.W. today. Stormy and cold tonight.
Halter took Mother and Muriel to town at
1 P.M. where they caught the thru train to Osgoode
where Mother will take treatment. I mended harness
this afternoon. Halter home at 4 P.M.

Thurs Feb 2: Bright and clear for part of
day but stormy and cold. Snow drifting
badly in places. Did chores this A.M. and
then went down to river at bridge & brought
home load of ice for Geo Milne. Halter
mended harness this aft. Halter & Uncle T.S.
batching.

Friday Feb 3: A very cold day but calm
with very little wind from west & N.E.W. Did
the chores this morning. Halter mended
harness and cutter tongue this aft while
I stayed down here this aft and drew
water by pail and put in ice well (about
100 pails). Halter away to carnival in town
tonight.

Sat Feb 4: Stormy but not so very
cold. Wind from N.E. I left for town
in cutter & came at 12.45 P.M. Word from
Muriel and Mother in town today. Halter
cleaned out stables this aft. I came home
at 5 P.M. Lost game to-day - 6-13. Wind
cold pretty cold to-night.

Sun Feb 5: Snowing and blowing
all day to-day. Halter & I came down for
supper here at 6.30 P.M. & Halter went
home at 11 P.M. Stopped snowing & moon
shining at 10 P.M. Quite cold.

Mon Feb 6: Not storming this to-day but very cold. (26° below zero) Walter & I got up sweet clover (one big load) into loft. Mr. Gompf brought mail tonight. I brought down Walter's cream & curds tonight.

Tues Feb 7: A strong N.E. wind and snowing lightly all day. I got a load of straw from down here in the loft while Walter scrubbed the floor up home. He helped me throw the load off. Ruby & George brought down cooking ~~meat~~ at 12 P.M. to Walter. Dark, cold and stormy tonight.

Wed. Feb 8: 40° below zero this morning & although I got fire lit at 8 A.M. at school. There was no school today. Mrs. H. Gompf and daughter Louise were badly frozen when back

in our field last night. I went to Oak Lake this aft. with a few mail. A little warmer this evening.

Thurs. Feb 9: Fairly nice day with wind from S.W. Lit fire going at school early this morning. Walter & I ~~had~~ fixed harness in house this aft. I took manure to field this A.M.

Friday Feb 10: Lit fire early this morning but no school today. We fixed harness again this aft. in house. A lot milder tonight, 32° below this A.M. Put manure in yard today.

SAT FEB 11: 30° below again this morning but much milder during the day. Took manure to field this A.M. Bill Doreen & I up home this aft and came home at

9P.M. Walter & I got a load of straw from down here this aft. George Wilns got the mail for us today. Charlie Dorff up here for a while this evening.

Sun Feb 12: A very stormy day snowing and blowing all day. Home from Walter at 11:30 A.M. and then up here again at 5 P.M. and Walter came home here with me for supper and stayed until 10:15 P.M. Still storming as we go to bed.

Mon Feb 13: 25° below this A.M. but a rather nice day and bright. Lit fire early this morning and school to day. Took manure to field this morning and Walter and I got in a load of oat straw feed this afternoon. An awful lot of snow everywhere and quite a bit of trouble breaking out trails.

Tues Feb 14: Valentines day. Did not take out manure this A.M. but put it on pile in yard. Walter to town this evening this aft & brought home our high chair from Station. I shovelled out our ice well & put in some water. To bed fairly early tonight. Stormy this A.M. but calm this evening.

Wed Feb 15: A very cold morning 34° below. I mended harness this aft. Bea & I up home this aft where Bea baked & churned. Stayed for supper and home at 8 P.M. Stormy tonight but not cold - wind from S.W.

Thurs, Feb 16: Strong S.W. wind today and fairly cool 26° below this morning. Took manure to field this A.M. and then went to town this aft with team or sledge and got 945 lbs of briquettes coal. Walter mended

Sun Feb 17: Aft got down feed etc. Getting a little warmer this evening. Letter from Maril bright Mother out of hospital

Friday Feb 17: A lovely warm day and snow melted a great deal this afternoon. Brought down load of coal before dinner and took Bea & Doren up for to Walter for dinner and we washed clothes this afternoon & finished at 4 P.M. Walter waxed the dining room floor & finished at 4.30 P.M. He came home at 8th/8 P.M. It felt warm this eve but wind from N.W. this evening.

Sat Feb 18: A cold stormy day blowing and snowing all day. Piled manure in the yard this morning & I didn't go up home until 4 P.M. after dinner and then came back at 6 P.M. with chores all done. Snow pile everywhere - a real blizzard. House very warm tonight.

Sun Feb 19: A bright day but very cold. Halt & I did up housework over home this morning and watered stock. I went over again at 5 P.M. & we did chores before 7th 6.30 P.M. & then Walter & I came down here for supper. Halt went home at 10th P.M.

Mon Feb 20: A very cold day (38°) below zero A.M. Piled manure in yard this A.M. and got in small amount of feed this aft & spent rest of time digging rack out. Mother & Maril came home today & Gis Milow brought them out in double cutter. Wind in south all day Still very cold tonight.

Tues Feb 21: A very cold day 32° below zero this A.M. Took manure to field this morning. I got in two loads of feed this aft while Walter went to Taylors for supper. I did chores over

done before coming home to supper. A very cold night.

Tued Feb 22: Cold this morning & 32° below again. Put manure on pile. Then A.M. Walter took work team & sleigh to town at 12 P.M. for load of coal and to attend pool meeting. Not home yet at 7 P.M. Mother feeling better today. Annie Milne over for a time this aft. much warmer this evening & wind from south.

Thurs Feb 23: Ruby came to visit Bea at 9:30 this morning and stayed until 1:30 P.M. When we all went over to mother for the afternoon. Cecil & Marian down there for the afternoon. Walter took manure to field this A.M. while I came down here for 10 min. to fix up pipes which had fallen. Walter fixed harness this aft. while I hauled snow on road did other shovelling around yard.

Friday Feb 24: A little warmer today with sun and from 3 W. Walter went to town in sleigh this aft taking Uncle T. S. and got a ton of Davis coal for me. I carried water from pump here to fill ice well but still have much more to carry before well is full. Uncle T. S. came home with Geo Milne and Walter arrived at 7 P.M. Shandy this evening but becoming warmer.

Saturday Feb 25: A much warmer day. I left early this A.M. for Beaufort taking 11:15 train and returning at 11 P.M. Dr dentistry done quite satisfactorily. Walter did chores this A.M. and brought Davis coal down here & put it in sled.

Sunday Feb 26: Bea & I up to Cecil at 11:30 and stayed until 5:30 P.M. A lovely day-mild and melting in the sun. Walter did chores today. Bea went to town with

Slimmons.

Tues Feb 27: Another very nice day. I did chores this morning & I brought down a bag of chops and one of barley before dinner. Walter & I got in two loads of oat sheaves into loft and one of feed straw. Bea and Muriel washed today. Marj. & Helen ~~were~~ ^{going} for supper tonight so I brought Bea home in sack at 5.30 P.M. A lovely evening.

Tues Feb 28: Another lovely day. Finished chores at 11 A.M. and cleaned wheat with fanning mill and the two of us sat it again all afternoon. Walter fairly sick with cold tonight so I did chores. A nice moonlight night.

Wed Mar 1: A warmer day today. Finished chores at 11 A.M. again and Walter mended harness while I cleaned grain this A.M. I carried carts to the ice well this aft and then got chores finished fairly early & came back with team & cutter for supper. Then went to town at 7.30 P.M. to curl. Won the game against Jack Goodwin and home at 12.15 P.M. Walter down to valley for wood this afternoon.

Thurs Mar 2: Went to town at 9 A.M. and stayed all day playing two games & losing both of them. Had dinner at Mr. Hallaces. A fairly warm nice day, shifting in the sun but cool tonight. Walter did chores this morning and got a load of wood this aft. I was home & brought Mrs. W. Dorothy home with me. Anna Milne & Clara Carpenter visiting up home today.

Friday Mar 3: Cool today. Walter got two loads of wood from valley to day. I did

chores this morning & cleaned up gunny
this afternoon. Phil & Lillian Smith and
Mae Godwin visiting up home this aftⁿ
Mrs Gillow there for supper. Be up home
all afternoon and for supper.

Mon Mar 6: A cold day - 14° below zero
with wind from N.W. Did chores this A.M. and
got in two loads of feed straw into loft this aft.
Cold this evening. Mother rested well through night
and today. Doreen 6 mos. old today - weight 19 lbs.

Tue Mar 7: A very nice day but

game at 7 P.M. taking Miriel with me to skate.
Elm visiting here & stayed all night with Big
Ruby at home a while this aft. with Mother.

Sun Mar 5: A nice bright day &
fairly cold. Ethel Kinnels down this
aft to see baby. He got chores done at
1 P.M. and I was home again 6.15 P.M.
A lovely evening bright & cold.

Friday

Fri Mar 10: A warmer day. I went with team and cutter to Mr. Morrison's funeral and then went on to F. Lytle's for supper & then to Davis for the evening. I fixed harness this aft. and put soles on boots. I did chores up home this evening.

Saturday Mar 11 Sat Mar 9: I did chores this A.M. and then I cleaned what I'd got but had to stop on account of no gas. Walter got around a load of rat sheave and put them in loft. To bed early tonight.

Sat. Mar 11: A lovely warm day with wind from S.W. I curled this aft in W. McDonald's sink against J. Goodman and wood. Uncle T. He went out with me. Marvin & Cecil too & family down this aft. Ben took Doreen up in ship this aft. I did chores this aft.

Sun Mar 12: A nice warm day & melting a little. I got back here after doing chores this morning over home and home at 5 P.M. Bra Doreen & I went over home for supper. Home at 8.30 P.M.

Mon Mar 13: Colder today with wind from N.E. at 20 m.P.H. and 4° below this A.M. Hatt & I did chores at home then I cleaned what this A.M. with engine & finished cleaning Penonon before dinner. Hatt & I cleaned Thatcher's wheat all afternoon with panning mill doing about 60 bush. Snowing a little today. We got 6 eggs to-day. Ben did up 5 lbs butter today.

Tues Mar 14: Another cold day. Did chores this morning and got in 1 hr. of cleaning what (Thatcher) Hatt & I took cow to Milne this aft & got back at 3.30 P.M. Cleaned what until 6.30 P.M. A calm evening but cold.

Wed Mar 15: I took Bea to 11:20 train this morning where she left for Minnay and intends staying until Monday. Walter did chores this morning and the two of us cleaned Fletcher's place this aft. Loaded up a load of oats & barley tonight ready to take to Geo. Milnes in the morning to be crushed. I am staying up at Mother's for meals & for the night but down home to look after hen & fires. 20° below zero this A.M. and cold all day.

Thurs Mar 16: Another cold day with wind still blowing from N.W. Walter took load of grain to Geo. Milnes & got it crushed before 1:27 P.M. I did chores this A.M. and then Hall & I got load of straw from my place and then got in a bag of sweet clover. Cold again tonight. Got 8 eggs down at my place @ \$18 here.

Friday Mar 17: A cold day again with strong wind from N.W. We did chores this morning and cleared some wheat. Took Stokes' cows to Milnes this aft and then got chores done early and Walter and I got ready and went to curling party in Hallers Hall at Oak Lake. Very cold when we returned home here.

Sat Mar 18: Warmer today wind from the south. Did chores this A.M. and then Walter left early for Oak Lake with sleigh to attend Pool meeting and brought home 2150 lbs of coal (tarvis) I mended harness this aft. A very nice evening.

Sun Mar 19: A little warmer to-day but we slept and read all day. Mr. D. came down here and cleaned up house and looked after fires. Marcell went up to Cecil on horse back for the aft.

Mon Mar 20: Found warmer today
with wind from S.W. Did chores this A.M.
and then Father loaded up a load of
sweet clover sheaves while I came down
with load of coal and put it in ~~the~~
cellar. We then cleaned grain (wheat)
Cecil visited at our place for an
hour this evening. I left at 8 P.M. in
Malone's double ~~the~~ cutter and our
horses for Oak Lake and brought Bea
and May home at 12.30 A.M. Roads
very bad.

Tues Mar 21: Father away to Bdn
all day with dredgers. I went after May
Goodevin at Clarendon Mandys. returning
returning George Milnes cutter this A.M.
I did chores this aft. & finished at 11 P.M.
Spent home at 8.30 P.M. A very warm
day and snow went considerably.

Wed Mar 22: Another warm day
and snow went considerably. Besides
doing chores we cleaned wheat through
flouring mill & then finishing we cleaned
through kickin mill. Mary up home
for a time this afternoon. Real warm
this aft.

Thurs Mar 23: Another very warm
day and snow went away a great deal.
I did chores this A.M. while Father cleaned
wheat and salted pork this morning and
then went to Geo Milnes and saved
wood and stayed for supper. Ray Goodevin
down for dinner and took May home
with him aft. I cleaned wheat with kickin
this aft. (Latches)

Friday Mar 24: Walter cleaned out all the A.M. with kickers while I did chores. He went at it again this aft while I started to fix harnesses. Muriel took team in a sledge and took Marjory Pollock Beatrice and Dorothy to Milnes for the afternoon in sledge. Mrs. Pollock phoned at 3:15 P.M. that Bill's baby was sick and that Marjory was wanted at Hamota. Jack would be on Highway 28 at 7 P.M. so I took Mary up in democrat & small team. Took 1 1/2 hr. to go up & same to come back - roads fair & much better than I expected. Home at 9 P.M. and had some supper. Colder to-night.

Sat Mar 25: Colder today. Walter away at Mill. To Anne Carpenter's to saw wood. I did chores this A.M. and mended harness this aft. Walter home at 3:15 P.M. and scrubbed floor did chores etc. Cloudy all day but clearing off to-night.

Sun Mar 26: Colder again this morning but brightened considerably this afternoon. Cecilia family down to Brothers for noon meal & Bea baby & I up at same time. Ceci brought us home tonight. Wind still in north as we go to bed but calmer. Dust blowing considerably this A.M.

Mon Mar 27: Cold this A.M. but still this & so melted considerably today. Walter went to town this aft. with light team in Democrat and 10 bags of dirty sweet clover to be cleaned. We both cleaned out stables this A.M. and let horses out to feed this A.M. I got in load of sweet clover and one of bedding this aft. Piling manure in the yards. Bea up home for dinner & stayed the afternoon washing clothes with Muriel.

Tues Mar 28: Another lovely day and snow melted a good deal, but plenty left. Cloudy most of day. He did odd jobs today. Walter got around to bush what from main granary to engine house. I fixed fence & paired horses feet. A lovely evening - wind from south.

Wed Mar 29: A nice warm day all day with wind from west. I left at 10.45 A.M. taking Marcell with me for Clifford Smith's with Gug and then went on to Harvey Tolton's. Got home at 6.30 P.M. Ruby came down at 10 P.M. and looked after mother all day. Walter took her home after 7 P.M. Walter did chores and cleaned barley all day.

Thurs Mar 30: A very nice day & snow melted some more today. He

had got shore done early this morning and cleaned barley through all day until 6 P.M. and almost finished. Cleaning barley for first time through wind cleaner Geo. Melne to town in wagon this a took over mail. Snow almost all gone.

Friday Mar 31: Another nice day but a little colder than yesterday. Wind from N.W. He finished cleaning barley first time this A.M. I got in load of straw (bedding) & load of sweet clover today. Walter washed floors. Walter this aft. & then helped me. Geo. Melne to town in car this aft.

Sat Apr 1: A very nice day, frosty this morning but thawed this aft. He did chores this A.M. and I fixed some harness this aft A.M. Walter went to town this

with team in democrat to get Cresson machine and attend the agricultural society meeting. He arrived home at 8 P.M. I fixed harness this aft and did chores. First rain shower this evening. To bed fairly early tonight.

Sun Apr 2: A very nice day. Did chores early this morning and then got back to chores again at 5:30 P.M. Got up home this aft while I looked after Cresson. Bill Edolph in town and came out with Cecil tonight. Aunt Mary Little in town to-day from B.C. A very nice evening.

Uncle G. out at noon and brought Aunt Lizzo (St. C.) & brought Aunt Mary down again after being away ^{for days}.

bicycle and oil. The boys finished sowing

all aft while I sowed Rensou wheat
there on N $\frac{1}{4}$. Uncle Tom & Rob out

aft.

Tues Apr 25: Raining this morning lightly but I sowed until 11.30 and Bill plowed here in 3 acres sweet clover until noon. Rained heavily all afternoon and filled rain tank by 4 P.M. I did odd jobs & split wood. Bill and Walter did odd jobs churning making box for tractor polishing car etc.

Wed Apr 26: A lovely warm day. And Mary & I up to Cecil this morning with him in derrick. Sunday Apr 28: A lovely warm day fair & bright. Bill finished sowing sloughs this morning and ~~sowed~~^{cross-harrowsed} 40 acres of clover in east 80 this aft. Cecile man down this morning and got a bad spraining done. I exord & harrowed tiny 6 acres of sweet clover and then started cross harrowing my 40 acres of wheat. A lovely evening.

Sat Apr 29: Another lovely warm summer like day. I cross harrowed the wheat in N.E. 40 on this place and finished at 5 P.M. Walter did odd job this morning and went to town with Lyman in car who hurt his foot in rake. Bill sowed sloughs in field (N.E.) in Rowan wheat and got tracks ready this morning. Bill cultivated 540 in E 80 this aft while Walter sowed flax after him. Bill Walter & I to town tonight a beautiful moonlight night.

Tue Apr 30: A lovely warm day. Bea went to church with Walter & Edythe while I stayed with Doreen. Bill & Louis and family arrived at 1.30 P.M. for dinner & stayed until 9 P.M. Walter Muriel & Edith down after supper.

Mon May 1: A warm bright day I cultivated sloughs in my wheat & soothed morning and烧ed them this afternoon Then raked stubble in field east of house here. I finished sowing oats in C 50 this aft. while Walter harrowed flax longways. A lovely evening. Like rain in west tonight.

Sat May 6: Cooler today with wind from N.W. Quite a heavy rain last night and a strong wind. Did not do any land work today. Bill crushed this morning while

Walt & I cut up potatoes and planted some. All three of us planted this a/f and finished at 5.30 P.M. Bill & I tried out different implements on field east of house here but just plugged up - too soft. Walter & Bill out to town in car tonight. Walt attending a calf club meeting.

Sun May 7: A cool morning with strong winds from N. W. Bea Dorion & I to church with Walter in car while Muriel stayed at home. I was up home to cut Walt's hair this a/f. Dot Benister visiting here this a/f brought flowers. Bea visited Muriel after supper while Walter away to Ruby's for supper & then on to Gaylord. Cecil over home this morn and then down here until after 10 P.M.

Mon May 8: Windy from west all day I drilled in 35 acres west of our house

here, while Bill cultivated with tractor ahead of me with 7 ft cultivator. I seeded oats in garden and then cultivated with horses in bluff. Walter planted garden over some shade of day. Boys down to help close barn loft door tonight.

Tues May 9: A miserable cold windy day & wind from N. W. and air filled with dust. Hay land blew a lot today. Showers of rain at 4.30 P.M. & 6 P.M. which settled dust. Walter sown weeds oats in C 35 on C 7 all day & while Bill cultivated in 40 acres east of house here & finished at 7.30 P.M. I seeded here all day (barley) Cold tonight and very like frost.

Wed May 10: Finished sowing barley on his 7/4 shortly after 3 P.M. I then came down here and planted 2 rows of potatoes. Bea up home all afternoon while Muriel

went to town with Clara Carpenter. Walter
was weeded on C/H all day & soil finished
in 3 more hours. Bill cultivated with
tractor in W 80 acres all day. Very cool
tonight and like frost.

Tues May 11: Walter away to Vicksburg

on the N.H. Bill home tonight but no one to
town.

Sun May 14: A lovely day and Mother's

supper and took Bill back with him.

Mon May 15: A rather disagreeable
day and windy most of day. I sowed

Thurs May 16: Cool & breezy all day again, I sowed barley all day in west 80 while Walter finished corn weeding this AM and was started in W 80 after dinner. Play land blowing badly and no sign of growth. Bill home from Cecil tonight with tractor. I went up home after supper but soon home & put in 2 rows of corn in garden.

Fri May 17: Finished sowing barley early this A.M. & sowed some small in W 80 I spent rest of day sowing oats for green feed in W 80. Bill was needed all day in same field as I was. Walter did odd jobs. Play seems to be quite blown out today. Walter & Bill away for Agr. Socib. entertain. Tonight I am here tonight.

Thurs May 18: Cloudy & raining for a time this morning but bright rest of day & fairly strong wind from N. W. I finished sowing at 3 P.M. to day sowing oats (green feed) in 80 west of house. Walter worked walls in house all day while Bill were weeded in W 80. Barley on this place up today. I now cultivated slough over seed this aft.

Friday May 19: Strong winds from N. E. all day. Bill was needed in barley west of house all day. I sowed slough in my wheat with oats & barley ones with barley this P.M. and then cultivated crested wheat grass all aft. on C.H. Walter sowed floss this A.M. and went to Bed. this aft. taking Bear as far as him where she will stay a few days. I am staying up here tonight.

Sat May 20: Walter left early this morning for wheat to Celilo and then to Montgomerys and did not get home until 7.30 P.M. I fixed fence down at my place this A.M. and went after quack grass harrows to Gss. mtns this aft. Bill who weeded all day in W 80 but did not finish barley. Rained a little at noon but did not stop work

Mon May 22: I got going with quack grass harrows in S 40 of 480 early this morning and over 2 done tonight. Bill finished wire weeding in W 80 tonight. Walter to town in car this A.M. to collect for Agricultural Society & home at 2.30. He washed his aft. and did odd jobs. Very cool and windy. Wind from N. E and very strong. Bill finished harrowing and brought exp cultivator from C.Y. Mr. & Mrs. Pollock & Florence Mary Rose and Mary brought Beatrice home this evening at 9 P.M. Cool & cloudy this evening

Wed May 24: Cool & partly cloudy & wind from the east. Walter finished sowing the wheat in W 1/4 S 80 tonight at 6.30 P.M. I fixed grass harrowed garden down here this A.M. after getting meat from beef ring. Then took harrows home to Geo Milnes & then drag harrowed garden up home. Took short horned cow to Milnes this aft (Uncle L. G. and I) & then raked Russian thistle in field down here myt school and lit two straw piles. Bill cultivated in 50 acres west of house here all day.

Thurs May 25: Another cool cloudy day. Walter stayed with mother while rest of us went to Oak Lake to see the King pass through. It was also school field day. After dinner Bill cultivated with tractor again in field west of trees here while Walt disked summer fallow in S.E. 80. I got cows moved down here did odd jobs.

Fri May 26: I spread straw on south side of S 40 in E 80 all day where drift dirt had blown from rest of field 40. Walter disked in S.E. 80 all day. Bill cultivated and almost finished about another acre. Bea & I up to Cails in car tonight and got 81 chickens (39 for Walter) and got 3 pigs also for Walter. Home at 10.15 P.M.

Sat May 27: A lovely day with wind still from the ~~south~~ east. I got a load of straw up from my place for bedding and did other odd jobs. Walter disked this morning and cultivated garden this aft with tractor & did other odd jobs. I raked stubble off of discing in S.E. 80 this aft. While Bill disked there with horses. Walter & Muriel away to Brandon tonight in car. Bea & I looking after mother tonight.

Sun May 28: A very nice day. No church at Ayersont but chaumigas at St. David's. Uncle Rob Mrs. Shulver Smith Aunt Linda & Margaret Hagg visited here this afternoon. None of us went to church. C.R. Conroy set this eve for eggs. Here I up home after supper with baby.

Mon May 29: West wind & quite warm. I raked stubble in S.E. 80 while Bill ditched there with horses. Walter did odd jobs. I had bad cold all day & tonight. Married & Bea up to St. David's tonight in car while I did dishes & looked after baby. A warm evening.

Tues May 30: A lovely morning and I did odd chores up home for a time and then went to Rivils with Polly in buggy & got Jack horse & brought back

manure spreader. Walter ditched with tractor all morning in S.E. 80. Bill left early for Greewood bridge where he worked with four horses on road gang. Quite a heavy shower at 1 P.M. to 3:30 P.M. as Bill & I did odd jobs. Took out cream separator fixed hood of tractor took posts out of fence in yard & Walter crushed from 4:30 to 6 P.M. A lovely evening with water everywhere.

Wed May 31: A real wet day. Started to rain at 8 P.M. & seemed all day fairly heavily until 5:15 P.M. Bill went to Brudenell to do road work but returned at 10:30 P.M. because of rain. I made a chicken coop & window box today. Walter washed walls at home. A great amount of water fell & seemed quite generally lost food chickens to day by rain-drowned. So moved them all inside granary.

Thurs June 1: Dry today. Cloudy this A.M. but bright this aft. I went to town this morning with Polly in buggy & home at 12 P.M. I hauled potash up home this aft while Bill plowed sweet clover land with five horses in S.W. 20. Walter washed walls & did odd jobs this A.M. and went to A. Carpenters & fixed limegine. Cloudy again tonight.

Fri June 2: Rained almost all day from 5 A.M. to 4 P.M. Walter to town in buggy this A.M. in rain and home at 2.30 P.M. Bill did odd jobs making soap etc. I did odd jobs here & up home splitting wood here after 5 P.M. Hated everywhere and everything soaking wet.

Sat June 3: Wind N.W. and a lovely bright day all day. Walter washed walls all day morning and crushed for lime this aft. I fixed tire on car & worked at mower. Then I mowed lawn this aft & finished at 5.30 P.M. Bill plowed in S.W. 20 all day with 5 horses on 2 furrow plow.

Sunday June 4: Rained almost all day from 5 A.M. to 4 P.M. Walter to town in buggy this A.M. in rain and home at 2.30 P.M. Bill did odd jobs making soap etc. I did odd jobs here & up home splitting wood here after 5 P.M. Hated everywhere and everything soaking wet.

Monday June 5: Walter away to Fort William this A.M. at 10.15 A.M., by going to Redwood on bus and will go from there with J. Watson in car. He did not go to church to-day as I have bad cold. Mr. Elliott up home for dinner to day. Mrs. Cowing & family up home this aft. Mailed Bea & Ina out to town in car at 4 P.M. to get Nora who will stay for a time.

Tues June 5: Cloudy at times with strong wind from N.E. Bill away early to work on road at bridge without horses. I plowed in S.W. 20 until 3.30 when I finished West 2. I tried cultivating slough and garden but too wet. Dark & cloudy tonight and like more rain.. Bill helped me with milking up home to night so down here at 6.45 P.M.

Tues June 6: A dull cloudy cool day. Jack ^{had} come up home the A.M. and took cows & pig to town for d. milne. Bill away on road all day & home at 7 P.M. I disced with tractor in S.E. 80 for 5 1/2 hrs to-day. Flowers going around but not much fell here.

Wed June 7: A cool cloudy & ~~windy~~ ^{rainy} disagreeable. I disc'd for two hours with tractor this morning but disc plugged again at 11.30 So went after A. Carpentier this aft & got discing again by 4.30 P.M. & quit at 5.30 P.M. All through chores by 9 P.M. Bill on road all day & home again at 7 P.M. Nora still up home. Uncle J.S. to town for the day.

Thurs June 8: Coldest still to day - wearing big coat on tractor. Disc'd 7 1/2 hrs to-day almost finished 80 acres. Bill home from working on road at 7 P.M. & finished for the present. Went back in car after supper for his coat. Very cool tonight & like frost. Col'd up home for dinner at noon

Fri June 9: A heavy hoar frost this morning & beans & potatoes frozen here. Bill disc'd all day finishing 80 acres! & the best of day out C.H. I cultivated sloughs

in SW 80 and sowed him in oats.
Cultivated slough in S.E. 20 tonight.

Fri June 10: Bill finished discing
on C4 tonight at 5 P.M. I sowed slough
in S.E. 20 this A.M. & then tried cultivating
slough down here but too wet. Sowed
slough in S.E. 20 this aft broadcast
with sweet clover and then harrowed
it. Harvey Milne brought harrows home
this aft behind car. Bill out to town
in car tonight. Mac & Andy Goodwin
over this aft. for short time. A very
cool week. I wore heavy underwear sweater
and smock all week.

Sun June 11: Bea Muriel Drew & I
up to church in car. Up home for noon
lunch & found Walter home from Ft. William
with Uncle T.J. Rested most of afternoon
while Muriel & Bea over to B. Camps
visiting. A lovely day & evening a
little warmer.

Mon June 12: A moderate day. Bill
away on road all day. I borrowed the
plowing in S.E. 20 this A.M. after Walter I
took Marica to Wilkes. Walter cut
hedge all day. I sowed slough in barley
field on this place, in oats. Up early this
morning & killed gobblers & sent it away
with cream truck. Through chores
early tonight & worked in garden.

Tues June 13: Cloudy today and
quite a shower at 3 P.M. but did not stop
soe making Russian shuttle in S.E. 80. Walter
cut hedges all day. I went to Leo Smith's
early this morning & got dinner & pigeons.
Bill on road all day with 4 horses at grade
on Greenwood road in the valley. A lovely
evening

Wed June 14: A heavy shower through
the night & then rained off and on all

day. Raked manure truck all day however
and finished tonight. Walter cut hedge most
of day but helped Cecil crush threshaff. Cecil
also got load of sheaves this aft. Bill on
road again all day. George & Ruby down for
a short time this morning. Rainy today
fairly disagreeable but did not go down far.

Thursday June 15: Walter went to town this
A.M. in car. I got load of straw down here
this A.M. & then hunched stubble in S.E. 80 after-
noon. Then burned the bunches all aft while
Walter finished hedges and then walked

manure this afternoon. I emptied load
of chop & manure and fixed engine this
morning and then mended harness &
then cleaned up buggy shed up
home this afternoon. Raining lightly still
as we go to bed. Quite cool all day.

Sun June 18: Rained again at
times again all day. No church to-day. Bill
Doreen & I up home for a time this aft.

Marion & family their four supper & then called here on their way home at 8 P.M. Clearing off tonight but more showers forecast for tomorrow.

Mon June 19: Showed off and over most of day and very cool. I wore heavy underwear & two pairs trousers & now too warm all day. Cleaned out sheds up home this A.M. & then Bee & I up ~~bed~~ to Cecil for dinner. Cecil away to town weather too cool so just put supper on here. Walter cleaned out pig pens & did odd jobs while Bill plowed more in S.W. 20. I dug some post holes in fence line on lawn here after returning from Cecil. Clear to night but forecast for showery again.

Tues June 20: A bright day at last Walter away to Brandon early to attend

U.A.M. convention & home at 6:45 P.M. Bill down on road all day but finished tonight. I cleaned up old stack bottoms north of barn and drew it south of willow bluff & burned it when I finished tonight. Bee & Queen up home this aft to wash. A lovely evening. I did milking up home but Walter home to do separating.

Wed June 21: A few light showers today but not much water fell - but a very heavy rain through the night last night - about 1 inch fell. I fixed fence down here - chopped wood. Walter fixed at binders and Bill cleaned up yard north of stable at home and then helped Walter with binders. A very nice day and a lovely evening. Barker for Brandon saw her this aft. A grand time of year and crops looking very nice.

Thurs June 22: Looked as if it might be dry all day but showers floated around all day & at last showered here at 7 P.M. but not heavy. I took dice home to Amo Casper this morning and then fixed up wagon & grubbed it. Bill worked at sweater all day and almost finished it. Walter did odd jobs fixing wagon tongue etc. A lovely evening.

Friday June 23: Dry most of day until evening when we had a thunder shower at 7 P.M. to 9 P.M. I cultivated all day here in 50 acres west - none too dry but must get it done. Bill cultivated in S.E. 80 all day with tractor. Walter laid in garden all day up home and did chores early & away to Oak Lake to saw tonight.

Sat June 24: A heavy thunder shower through the night with a little hail in it. Went on cultivating however - both Bill & I. We got about 50 acres cultivated tonight in S.E. 80. Walter cultivated potatoes up home this morning and raked up stubble in S.E. 80 and burned this off finishing the field tonight. Marcell, Walter and Bill away to town tonight while Bea & I went up & looked after Mother. Young fellow selling first aid kits here tonight & all night. A little shower at noon. Old Milne over catching gophers this A.M.

Sun June 25: A lovely day all day. Walter to church with Ruby. Bea & I away to Kemnay at 12.45 for general family reunion at Pollock's. A lovely time and home at 11 P.M. in heavy thunder shower. Walter did chores down here tonight.

Mon June 26: Quite a little rain fell last night so did not cultivate today. I hauled manure out of the yard all day while Bill did odd jobs - draining crank case of tractor, repairing separator etc. Walter worked at combine -孵化器 and then sprouted potatoes this afternoon. Bill & I worked late in garden during tonight.

Tues June 27: A lovely dry day all day but looks like a thunder storm coming as we go to bed. I cultivated west of here on K place all day until 3.45 P.M. and then went to town in car with Mabel & May. Gilbow and brought home Mrs. Leo Milne. Bill cultivated with tractor in S~~W~~ E. 80 all day. Walter hoed in garden most of day, took my team when I went to town.

Wed June 28: Walter hoed this morning and then to Brandon with Willie Montgomery to a Pool field day at Brandon Egg Farm. I cultivated here all day and Bill did some with tractor on C~~H~~. Walter home at 1.30 P.M.

Thurs. June 29: A lovely dry day with wind from N.W. I cultivated here this A.M. and hoed in garden this aft - here. Walter hoed in garden at home & cultivated here ~~for~~ this aft. Bill finished cultivating on C~~H~~ this evening. Beal over to Beebeys for dinner & supper & they walked home with her & baby. A beautiful evening.

Fri day June 30: Dry all day to day I finished cultivating in 5 acres S.W. of home here at 9 P.M. & then took 4 horses & cultivated spaces in the garden. Took two horses

* took a load of straw up home from
loft here. Bill & Walter fixed binder & tractor
& started to cut sweet Clover here at 11 A.M.
Had dinner here & finished the 6 acres
at 4.30 P.M. and did 6 rounds arounds
15 acres before quitting tonight. I threw
back shaves for the boys - until 4.30 P.M.
then went home & sharpened up mower
knives. Mr. McKeown of the singer
sewing Machine Co. here tonight.

Sat July 1: A lovely bright day
until night when we had a light
thunder shower. Bill ~~Walter~~ & I threw
shaves out around 15 acres at home this A.M.
before they started to cut. I then brought
gray teams & mow down hill & cut yards
around buildings all day.

Sun July 2: Married Bea & I to church
this morning and to Cecils for dinner. I
went through his bees while there and then
through my own when we got home. Walter
out to church in town tonight. Bea & I up
home to visit for a time tonight. It had
supper out under the trees but light shower
while we were out. A lovely evening. A
heavy shower went south & one north
tonight.

Mon July 3: A beautiful day, warm &
clear. Cutched sweet Clover like all day while
the boys stocked our home. Walter crushed
this morning and went to town this aft to
get animal for beef ring. A. S. Stewart
down this aft to see Walter. A beautiful
evening - this clear and full of fresh clover
smelling aroma.

Tues July 4: Brandon Fair to-day.
Bea & I and Loren up to Cils and got
Marion & Ciel & down to Pollock's at 10.30
then on into Brandon and spent the day.
Home at 2 A.M. Bea stayed down at
Kenny expecting to return Thursday. Bill
diced thick grass in S.W. 20 this A.M. &
I wire weeded on 50 acres over here this aft.
A lovely bright day & a grand time.

Wed July 5: Up home for 3 meals today
Bill wire weeded here this A.M. while it
drizzled rain all morning so did odd
jobs this aft. I mowed with scythe & did
odd jobs this A.M. and tried wire weeding
this aft but did not get on very well -
too damp. Walter did odd jobs all day. Clear
& bright this aft and a lovely evening.

Thurs July 6: Walter did odd jobs this A.M.
cleaned car fed horses salt etc. and got ready
for Brandon. Muriel Ruby & Hall got away for
the fair taking Anne Taylor, Marion and Ruth
down to look after Mother & got supper for Bill
& I. Bill fixed at separator this A.M. and
I wire weeded the lot. I wire weeded this
A.M. and helped Leo Smith put up hay
this aft. until 6.15 P.M. when we had heavy
showers. I did chores down here after supper
& then went home & looked after Mother ~~until~~
until 3 A.M. when Walter & Muriel returned
from Brandon bringing Beatrice & Loren
with them.

Friday July 7: A wonderfully lovely day
warm at times but breezy at times. I
stroked up my sweet Clovers ~~at times~~ ^{this morning} (knocked
down by cows) and wire weeded this aft, getting
along fine. Bill fixed at tractor & cultivator this P.M.
& cultivated in S.E. 80 this aft. Walter ploughed potato

all day to day.

Sat July 8: A lovely dry day with wind from N.W. I were weeded here all day and got long rows finished. Walter did in garden all day at home while Bill cultivated with tractor in S.E. 80. Bill & Walter away to town tonight. Bea & I worked in garden tonight.

Sun July 9: Muriel Bea & I to church this morning & slept this aft. A lovely day all day & a grand evening. Walter away this aft but home at 9 P.M. when Bea & I were up there so he & Muriel came down here to visit until after 10 P.M. A lovely evening.

Mon July 10: Walter did odd job this morn. while I finished more weeding here & did

garden summerfallow up home. He mowed road all afternoon while I did odd jobs up home & then worked in garden here. Bill cultivated in S.E. 80 all day. A lovely bright dry day warm at times with wind from south.

Walter then put on load of sweet Clover at my place while I raked up hay north of barn & inside of fence in barley field. Walter out with plot inspector tonight while Meriel went to town for Doreen Wilson who will stay at our place. Jersey had male calf tonight.

Sat July 15: A nice dry day. Walter & I got up sweet Clover on this place this morning ~~this morning~~ but Walter to town this aft to fix up fair grounds so Bill & put up Clover here & almost finished. Bill used John Deere tractor on wire under

on summer fallow (S.E. 80) this aft morning

Tues July 16: A very nice day to church this morning. Doreen Wilson Walter Bea baby & I to church this morning. Turned pretty hot & dry this aft and crops seem to have suffered considerably. Mural Bea baby & I took Mrs. Steward down to the lake this aft & she had supper with Stewards from Cane Valley, Coburns and Langeters & Smalls from Kenton & Cels & ourselves besides Mr. Smalls. A very nice & time in spite of rain storms which came in on our way home at 7.45 P.M.

mon July 17: Could not lay the A.M. because of rain shower last night so I siced all morning while Bell made hoppers for combine. Walter did odd job &

looked at crops which are whitening up badly, except thatched. Walter & I put up load of sweet Clover in barn here this aft & then Walter went wire weeding in S.E. 80 & W 80 in C 4 with John Deere tractor, while I got load of hay from around slough north of barn on the N. We are preparing entries for the fair, tonight, which takes place tomorrow. A lovely evening. A small light shower at noon to-day but not enough to do any good.

Tues July 18: Fair day. Walter out early this A.M. to town & then home after dinner and took Bea & baby ^{Merle} Beatrice Marion's Keith & I to the fair. Took Isa & Cecil early this A.M. Then back after supper & got Cecil & took them home. Bought us home at 7.30 P.M. A very nice fair. I rod weeded on C 4 W 80 this morning with John Deere tractor

Fri July 19: A very warm day Walter Bell & I stacked sweet Clover all day and got up three stacks. School meeting bright and Clarence Kennedy re-elected trustee. Storm went north tonight. Hecting rain very badly.

Sat. July 20: Another very warm day with wind from south. We stacked all day until hail came down heavily causing 100% damage. Strip about a mile ~~wide~~ and we were in the middle of it. Up home tonight for short time Cecil down looking at crop. Foster's pains of glass broken here.

Tuesday July 21: A rather desorganized day. Walter away to town this morning to post hail claims etc. I crushed with John Deere tractor. Bill tried to cut with

scissors but it broke so he fixed up mail box. Walter unloaded chop his aft & did odd jobs while Bill wire weeded on C₁₄ with J. D. tractor and I disked in S. W. 20 with 6 furrow. Mrs. & Mrs. Pollock Jack & Mary up tonight on way home from ~~Lincoln~~ Vermillion fair. Left at 11 P. M. Some showers today but cold winds from N. W. all day.

Wed. July 22: A moderate day. Walter & I finished stacking the sweet Clover after dinner & then got up some hay off of inside my south fence. Sergeant of Marey Morris Co. here for short time this aft to see combine. Back into town in car tonight taking Bill Adolph & our baby. Home at 11.30 P. M.

Thu July 23: Annie Wilson's daughter Bernice with Mr. Constable up from Justice today. I didn't go to church to-day but

Doreen Muriel Bill & Bea went. A very nice day - lot at times & a few showers. Uncle Tom & Uncle Rob out this aft.

Mon July 24: I too cultivated in 3 fields summerfallow here this A.M. until 10 A.M. with J.A. tractor. Bill took J.B.C. to Cetts & came home on bicycle taking J.A. there & I went on home & seed with 6 horses in 20 acres S.W. finishing tonight. Bill & Walter got swather fixed up & got going at 6 P.M. in hulled barley in S.W. 80. Bill kept going until 9.15 P.M. Mr. Elliott out to day.

Tues July 25: A hot dry day. I cultivated west of trees here all day & got on well. Walter around crop with adjustor all morning & then started swathing in barley but broke shaft at 3 P.M.

so went to town to get it fixed arriving home at 7 P.M. He took Doreen Wilson with & our baby. Bill mowed in Crested wheat grass all day on C & Bea up home working this aft.

Wed July 26: A nice day with showers going around. I cultivated here all day. Walter finished barley swathing at 11 A.M. & tried wheat but ~~the~~ ^{green} not suitable so over to L. Greely & got prunes of theirs. Got it this aft but found wheat too green. Bill finished mowing at 5 P.M. Bea away to missionary meeting with Anne Wilson this aft. Ellen Yorman & Harry Decker here tonight for brief stop. Started to shower at 6 P.M. & kept showers all evening.

Thurs July 27: I finished cultivating summerfallow here this morning & did garden

at home before dinner. Bill couldn't cut or rake so worked at separator this morning while Walter worked at combine and took a run up to Reids in car to see his crops. This afternoon Bill cut steadily in barley (hailled) with mower & I raked up what had been done with swather. Walter worked at combine. Bill adjuinst here & gave me \$5.00 on my barley. A lovely evening.

Friday July 28: A fairly warm day with ~~fair~~ wind from south. I raked most of day in barley while Bill cut here with mower (\$11.80). Walter to town this morning in car. Jack Gordon brought stacker down from Holland this aft in truck but we will not start until tomorrow. Bea married baby & I down to river to get chains off load of wood still in the valley

Sat July 29: A very hot dry day with wind from south. Walter & I mowed barley all morning alternately & ran sweep for stacker. Ina drove stacker all day Bill over to Milnes this morning while Alice Gallant came from there & helped stack for the morning getting one stack up. Paul & Ina & I stacked this aft getting another small one up, while Bill raked. Bill & Walter away to town tonight. Bea & I up home tonight for a time.

Sun July 30: A cooler day bright & clear. Green married Bea & I to church tonight this morning. Rested this aft & then up home for the evening. Walter away for the evening.

Mon July 31: A very nice bright day with wind from S.E. and S. We stacked all day

getting up a stack finishing one started at
a starting another. He brought out lunch and
we worked until 7 P.M. Bill cut all day with
mowers in barley. Set up home this aft to
wash. Bill had cows all milked about 7 o'clock
done this eve. A lovely evening. Lyman was still at

home Aug 1. Cooler today but rain this
morning so didn't start laying until
after dinner. I went to town in car taking
Cecil. Bill & Walter did odd jobs Lyman
took over the aft while Bill drove

got one stack up but had to quit because
of strong wind from N.W. Lyman & I
won't mowing for rest of day while Bill
and Walter fixed up combine tractor &
separator. Walter away to town tonight

with tractor radiator. Got cooler as day
went on & a lovely cool evening.
Thur Aug 3rd I cut all day at the
barley, Walter fixing up the
combine. We finished off the
stack in the morning but
afternoon very windy.

Friday Aug 4th I cut oats all day
with the binder very light crop.
Walter up to Leecils with the
combine around 5 o'clock oh
boy and were we going on high.
Me I was mending the old
man's socks while Doreen
watched me with a critical
eye. Dandy killed flies on
himself. The chickens were
scratching. Rusty was asleep
guess that is the whole
household. Lyman mowed until
7 P.M. when he finished the barley & oats &
then started raking.

Sat Aug 5: A very warm day
Halter combined all day at Cecils getting
about 50 bushel wheat out - looks like No. 2.
Bill Adolph raked up last of oats & barley
by noon and then went up to Cecils & ran
combine with Halter while Cecil cut barley.
Bill Able on C-4 seeder finished grassing
at ~~noon~~ 3 P.M. & started on C-4 at 4:10 P.M.
getting considerable done by 9 P.M.
Bill Able on C-4 quit at 6 P.M.
I cut oats all day on C-4 & quit at 6 P.M.
and led horses up home. Boys home at 2:30 P.M.

Sun this evening. Muriel & Walter, Muriel
here after 8:30 P.M.

Sun Aug 6: A scorching hot day.
Bill & I did not go to church this morning
but let Muriel & Walter go. Jack & Florence
Pollock arrived along at 3:30 P.M. and
we all went down to the Oak Lake. No
shower occurred while we were there and
consequently had between the town & the lake.
Found only light shower here when we returned
at 8:30 P.M. Harry & Hazel Danneforth with

Mow Aug 7: A light rain all day from
N.W. I cooked to town early this A.M. in car
& home at 10:45 A.M. Took Uncle J. Smith
me and brought Mr. J. H. Kennedy home to
Clarence. Bill were weeded here this morning
until rain stopped him. Bill & Halter
chopped horses feed this aft while I came
down here & fixed windows. Halter cooked
this A.M. with Dan Lure. Bill came down
& helped me caustic salt this aft.

Tues Aug 8: too damp to cut this A.M.
so Halter and I clipped the long hedge
out of house & while Bill were weeded in
summerfall down here. Dried this aft so
I cut oats with binder while Bill scathed
on C-4 E.O.D with J.-D. tractor & Halter went

up to Ceils & fixed up tractor & combine
Bill broke swather at 6.15 P.M. so didn't
do any more tonight. Cool & partly cloudy
all day.

Fri Aug 9: A fairly nice day
but damp with dew this A.M. so we did
not get cutting until 10.15 A.M. Walter
& I up to Geo Smith's in Democrat heading
cobs (Canson Rose) & home at 9 A.M. Bill
Adolph got swather fixed up & swathed
the 8 M aft 10.30 A.M. & all aft finishing
S.E. 50 on C¹/4 at 6.45 P.M. & finished
scattering oats in C¹/4 on C¹/4 at 5.30 P.M.
& then helped fix at separator. Then
raked up windrows in W 80 etc
aft turning the hay so that it will
dry. He did a little at 1/2¹ this A.M.
Dre down tonight & will stay here a couple of days

Thurs Aug 10: Damp & cool this morning
and then started to rain at 2 P.M. Lynn came
down at 8.30 A.M. on pony & he & I made

hay while Bill ~~was~~ tried swather in small 20
acres but made no headway. Walter up to
Ceils to combine but did not start until 12.30
and got 80 bushels done before rain. We
topped off stock & left it at 3 P.M. Lynn
went home & we got bedding into stable got
around chop. Walter clipped hedges & finished
the next road. Raining steadily as we go
to bed.

Friday Aug 11: Rained all night
last night and until 10 A.M. I cleaned out
stables etc this A.M. and then went home
& cleaned up granary while Bill fixed at swather
and Walter worked at separator. This aft
Bill kept at swather while Walter & I stooked
oats on C¹/4 all afternoon. Bright tonight aft
& a lovely evening with brilliant northern
lights.

Sat Aug 12: Bright & clear all day

Halt & I stacked on C₄ (oats) all A.M. while Bill ploughed sweet Clover in S.W. 20. Muriel went to town & got repairs for swather & Bill & Walter worked at it for a time this aft & then Bill worked at it alone while Walter turned hay in barley field. I stacked oats alone this aft until 7:30 P.M. Bea & baby out to town with Muriel this aft.

Sun Aug 13: A lovely day moderately warm and wind from N.W. We all went to church - Bea, baby & I, Dorcas Wilson, Walter and Ina. Margaret Dixon sole works for Milnes. She rested this aft & then went up to Walter for a birthday supper given for Ina. Cecils all down. Mother rather weak tonight. Walter away for the evening.

Mon Aug 14: Cecil & Lyman down at 9 A.M. and we put up barley hay all

day - finishing the stack half completed before the rain and then did a very big one this afternoon. Walter continued all day at Cecils getting out 480 bush (late start) Blaine here for all night brought by Mr. & Mrs. Elliott in their car. The evening Lyman up home for all night.

Tues Aug 15: Muriel down to Brandon this morning & home for noon bringing Margaret Rose back with her to stay here for a few days. Blaine here all day. Cecil stayed at home to eat oats today. Lyman & I stacked this A.M. & Dorcas Wilson helped us this aft. Walter continued all afternoon up at Cecils but put new clutch on combine this A.M. Bill swathed in N 40 E 80 all day & got on well.

Wed Aug 16: ^{Afternoon} Cecil & ~~Lyman~~ down at 9:30 A.M. & we finished a stack and built another by noon. Then Cecil went home to

help Walter on combine. Bill left his sore eye. Ialt didn't do any combining this A.M. but got out 340 bushels this aft. Walter called in tonight and will take tractor tomorrow morning to be repaired to town. Rained fairly heavily from 8.30 P.M. to 10.30 P.M. and ground quite wet. Heavy rain in Winnipeg to-day. Bill tried scathing my wheat tonight but after 4 rounds

Weds Aug 17: Too wet to lay this morning and almost too wet this aft but got an eight load stack up. Cecil & Lyman here this A.M. but didn't stack until 1.30 P.M. I cultivated little patches & garden here this A.M. but fixed cream separator up home. Spent in town with tractor all day & home at 4 P.M. Bill was weeded in S.E. 80 all day a lovely evening and though about early. Brothers Elaine & Mary Rose with baby all up to Rubies for dinner at noon to-day.

Friday Aug 18: A warm day with wind from N.W. Set up two stacks of barley

by 5. day & large ones. Lyman & Cecil down early and home at 6 P.M. - Lyman staying for oversight. Bill Adolph wire weeded in S.E. 80 with J.C. tractor all day. A party was held down here this afternoon for Margaret Rose. Fifteen present. & as Walter has town all day working at tractor but home at 7 P.M. A cool evening.

Sat Aug 19: A bright day with fair strong N.W. wind all day. Cecil & Lyman came down at 8.30 A.M. when I had considerable barley raked & we put up two big stacks in middle of on south side of about 80 acres. Walter walked to town this A.M. & worked at tractor in storeys getting it out at 12 A.M. & arrived at Cecils with it at 2.30 A.M. ~~&~~ yesterday. Bill finished wire weeding S.E. 80 at noon & snow started at C $\frac{1}{4}$ W 35 & got about $\frac{1}{2}$ down tonight. A lovely warm evening.

Sun Aug 20: None of us to church today.
Bea baby Marg. Rose & I down to Jack Pollock's
at 11:15 A.M. Left Marg. & I home & on to Mr.
Pollocks for rest of day. A lovely warm
day & a nice peaceful time. Home at 11 P.M.
Tom Granger & wife who is working at
Harrison's up visiting at home tonight.

Mon Aug 21: Put up big stack in
S.W. corner of 80 acres (Bill Leman & I) but
had to finish it off at 2:30 P.M. because of
heavy showers. Bill went culturing
with 6 horses on C₄, I did odd jobs.
Halt got going on combine early this A.M.
& got out 160 bushels before rain stopped him.
I did odd jobs after rain while Halt clapped
ledges. A cool cloudy evening.

Tues Aug 22: Another shower this A.M.
so no combining or streaking ~~is~~ today.

I worked with wire weeder in front of house
here for a time this morning but not doing
right work so went home & helped Halt's
finish clipping hedges before going to town
in car. Bill cultivated on C₄ all day with
six horses. Halt's cross wire weeded in
S.W. 20 with J.D. tractor this aft. while I
came down here with team and harrowed
and dried in bunches for fire wood. Dull
and cloudy this A.M. but bright and
windy this aft.

Wed Aug 23: Heavy dew this morning
so did not attempt combining until after dinner
at 6:30, but only did four rounds when
just wore out on combine. Halt away to town
tonight to get new part. Bill finished culti-
vating 35 acres (W) at 11 A.M. I raked up barley
until 10:30 A.M. & then Bill & I got in load of
barley hay to try it. Halt finished S.W. 20
with tractor (J.D.) on wire weeder this A.M. and

did garden summer fellow up home. Began up
some ches aft washing. Eleanor & Mable Montgomery
visiting here this aft. Watkins man called this
aft. Bill & I stacked all afternoon and as
Walter did chores - stacked until 7 P.M. Bill
away to town at 8.30 P.M.

Thurs Aug 24: A damp dewy morning
but a bright aft & warm. Bill & I stacked all
day & finished tonight at 6.30 P.M. Walter got
going again at Cecils this A.M. & finished
there - coming here down home at 4.0 P.M. and
worked until 8.30 P.M. getting out about 85 bushels
of No. 5 wheat. A lovely evening with wind from
south. Forecast for thunder showers tomorrow.

Friday Aug 25: Heavy dew again this
morning but Cecil & Walter got going on
combine at 9 A.M. & finished 5.45 P.M. by
noon. Very heavy going. Down to C $\frac{1}{4}$ E 50

then combined steadily all afternoon and
still at it at 9 P.M. Bill & I stacked
oats with stacker south of garden & finished
at 12.45 P.M. I cleaned up around stock
& put it in loft - then hatched 6 loads
to cultivator & cultivated here rest of aft.
in 50 acres N of trees here. Bill emptied
3 loads of wheat from 20 acres & took
wagon to C $\frac{1}{4}$ and then repaired fence
in 20 acres ready to pasture cattle there.

Sat Aug 26: Cecil down early in car
and going on combine at 8.30 A.M. A small
shower at 10 A.M. which stopped them but they
got in 3 good hours this A.M. and then got in a
splendid afternoon working until 9.30 P.M. still
in E 50 on C $\frac{1}{4}$. Another load would finish it. Bill
attempted to get in hay from stack in barley
field but forks would not work well so only
got 2 loads. I cultivated in 50 acres here and
got one fallow with 6 horses.

Sun Aug 27: Doreen, Bill Adolph, Walter
Bea, baby, & I to church this A.M. Mrs.
Fuller minister. Visited this aft. and
read. A dry bright day. Walter away for
the aft & evening. Bill up to Cecils with
Polly in buggy for supper & then took
Doreen to town ready for school in the morning.

Mon. Aug 28: Another dry bright day.
Cecil & Walter at combining early this A.M.
and finished C¹/4 at 10 A.M. Finished
Regent wheat before dinner and then
broke clodder on combine and stopped
for the afternoon. Walter to town this aft
and got new part & they got going at 8:30 P.M.
and worked until 9:30 A.M. I cultivated in
50 acres here all day & got on well. Bill
helped boys with wagon boxes and got
in two loads of hay putting one up - and
slings. Mother rather low to day. Aunt Lizzie
Walter & Minnie out today.

Tues Aug 29: A fairly nice morning but
boys had to fix combine but got going at 10 A.M.
Bill helping them. I cultivated until
noon here in 50 acres when it rained heavily
and kept at it until 5 P.M. Then cleared
up and sun shone with wind from N.W.
but some water lying around. I came home
here and cleaned out calf pen. Milked
early & chores over at 9 P.M. Bea up home to
visit tonight & brought Bill & Doreen back
with her. A lovely moonlight night.

Wed Aug 30: Walter & I started on C¹/4 (oats)
all morning while Bill brought in wheat from
field (combined). I went to town this aft in
wagon & got 4 screenings. Mrs. Sargent out
and fixed combine with Walter helping. Bill
cultivated this aft. brought in rest of hay stack
and fixed hay stacker & screen. ready to go
back to Hollands. Walter down for a few
minutes tonight. A lovely night.

Thurs Aug 31: Damp & foggy this A.M.
so couldn't combine. Bill went cultivating down
here while Walter & I took rack a wagon &
tractor & separator down to see C 35 on C 4
and threshed two jugs of oat sheaves before
dinner & got 15 bushels. It rained lightly
at noon so did odd jobs until 4 P.M. when
Bill, Ida & I went down to C 4 & Cecil came
later. He threshed a hundred bush of oats
(hulled) by 7:30. I got home here by 8:15 P.M.
for supper. A very heavy rain started at
8:30 P.M. and still at it at 9 P.M.
Mother very low tonight so Ruby & Annie
staying with Mariel

Friday Sep 1: A very heavy rain last
night so ground soaking wet this A.M. and
although sun bright all day and fair evng wind
did not dry up much. A heavy dew tonight.
I stooked on C 4 (oats) and finished it.
while Walter worked at machine down there.
Bill fixed box on my birch and then

went plowing in S.W. 20. and finished it
at 3 P.M. and then harrowed it. I unloaded
oats etc aft then fixed fence in yard up
home while Ida scythed weeds around yard
and then the two of us plowed the south garden.
Cecil took Doreen Spleen to bus till Bill so
that she could go home while Maria stayed
all day with Mariel. Mariel to town in
car the aft and got Inca and Harvey Miller
from ~~out~~ ab. A lovely evening.

Sat Sep 2: A very heavy shower
at 6 A.M. and lasted for an hour but
left water everywhere and will stop thready
for a few more days. I split wood here
most of day while Bill did some up
home & Walter did odd jobs. Bill cutting
down dead trees in grove this aft. Hot
& close and cloudy this aft. Through clouds
early tonight. Sky clear as we go to bed.

Sun Sep 3: A dry day with wind from N.W. bright and sunny. Drying up fast, but still many pools around. Walter took Bill to bus this A.M. at Currie but missed it so took him to thru train at 2 P.M. Then went on to Taylors & home at 8:15 P.M. Muriel, Bea & I to church this A.M. Mrs. Simmons up home this aft. & Nora Lundy. Her funeral ~~declared by Bastien~~
today at 7 A.M.

Mon. Sep 4: A partly cloudy day with strong wind from the east. But threshed oats all day and only have 2 more hrs. to do in c. 35 acres on C.F. Seeming out very well for failed crop (about 15 per acre) Cecil, Leman, Willard Lundy, Walt & I doing the threshing. May. H. now staying with Muriel all day. Home at 7:45 P.M. tonight.

Tues Sep 5: Mother passed away quietly in her sleep at 2 o'clock this morning. He had only a few loads of oats left to thresh so Cecil came down and the three of us finished the oats at 11 A.M. and brought the machine home. The field averaged sixteen bush per acre. He unloaded grain this aft. and did odd fixing around. Undertaker up this morning at 4 A.M. and again at 4 P.M. Dry all day & and a nice evening.

Wed Sep 6: Funeral for Mother this afternoon at 2:30 P.M. No work done to-day. Cloudy and cool. Quite a large crowd at the funeral and a lovely service. All of us up home for lunch at 6 P.M. and Muriel brought Bea home at 7:30 P.M. Cloudy & cool all day and raining tonight at 7:30 P.M. but not heavily.

Thurs Sept 1: A lovely clear bright day but ground soaking wet. I drew manure all day from pile in yard. Walter did odd jobs & fixed at radiator of tractor but did not finish. Bea up home this aft to wash. Muriel came away at 3 P.M. for Verden with Ethel Kennedy, and home at 7.30 P.M. having had supper at Shafford Smiths. A lovely evening

Friday Sept 2: Dry all day to-day but a heavy dew this morning. I cultivated in front of house here in summerfallow all morning and finished the 50 acres at 12 P.M. Walter worked at tractor radiator all morning and got it fixed at 12 P.M. He both started to combine at 2 P.M. and Cecil came down (Muriel brought him in car) and worked steadily until 8.30 P.M. I drew in two loads from field & put in granary. This now to hard but all dry.

Sat Sep 3: A rather damp dewy morning but boys got combine going in 40 acres in N.E. 80 and finished it bright at 8.30 P.M. I drew in a load of wheat this morning to granary and then did odd chores until noon. After dinner I burned stubble on C $\frac{1}{4}$ getting quite a little snow home early and helped boys finishing combine field after milking & doing chores. Annie (Annie McKenow) visited here this aft with little boy. A lovely evening. Mrs. G Taylor died this aft.

Sund Sep 4: No church to day because of Mrs. Taylor's funeral so rested well. Bea and I up home for supper. Walter to farm this land to do chores. Bea & I rested read all afternoon.

Mon Sep 5: A fair bright day with wind from east & south. Walter & Cecil got away to Geo Smiths with combine at 9.30

A.M. and worked until 8.30 P.M. I helped Mel
load last load of wheat out of wagon & then
filled up truck out of granary. I then took
wagon over to Geo Smiths with team. I burned
stubble roundrocks on E 50 on C 4 all afternoon. Ben
& Muriel did milking down here. I did chores up
there & had supper there.

Tues Sep 12: Cloudy & cooler today with
wind from N.E. A light shower ~~was~~ this evening.
I burned on C 4 all day but slow going. Boys got
on very well combining at Geo Smiths but had
to quit at 6 P.M. when shower started. Partly cloudy
tonight but not raining as we got to bed.
